Structure, Governance and Management							
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Governing Document							
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The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees							
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Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. The Congregational Board is appointed from within the congregation and members of the congregation are invited to nominate individuals who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management affairs of the Church, to become members of the Board. Board Members are then appointed at the Stated Annual Meeting and serve for a period of three years after which they must seek re-election at the next Stated Annual Meeting.

Organisational Structure							
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The Congregational Board is normally chaired by the minister, however there has been a vacancy at Crimond Parish Church since April 2003. The Congregational Board met five times in 2025. Certain responsibilities are delegated to a Property Convenor and to a Treasurer. The Kirk Session met five times in 2025 with an interim moderator in the Chair. The Kirk Session is responsible for spiritual affairs within the Church.

Objectives and Activities							
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The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Achievements and Performance							
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Weekly face to face worship continued to take place in 2025 with Tim Barker leading worship on Sunday mornings. The Church also extended it's reach to Crimond Nursing Home, Crimond school and Kininmonth school on a regular basis. For the children in the Parish, Messy Church sessions were held as well as a summer holiday club, which was well attended. Solid Rock commenced in 2025, a monthly gathering for pupils in S1 to S3 of the academy. The monthly pancake mornings continued in 2025 and were well attended.

Trustees' Annual Report (cont)

Year ended 31 December 2025

Financial Review

The income of the Church totalled £19,632 and expenditure totalled £16,114 which resulted in a net inflow of £3,518 for the year. One of the main reasons for this positive inflow was £26k of expenditure was covered by funds held in a rent account. 74% of the £19,632 of income came from regular donations through Gift Aid, weekly envelopes and the open plate. The income was boosted in 2025 by various fund raising events including a hamper draws at Christmas and the monthly pancake morning. 58% percent of the income was attributed to the Gift Aid scheme (both donations and the tax recovered on these donations). Repair expenditure relating to the clock, organ, the church wall and the manse roof totalled £22k. As noted above, this was all covered by funds in the rent account along with all insurance costs and electricity.

Reserves Policy

At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £57k, of which £38k has been designated for fabric expenditure.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session / Congregational Board must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session / Congregational Board are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Crimond Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025 which are set out on pages 6 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

An examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
