Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) adopted on 9th October 2007

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session which meets six times a year is responsible for spiritual and temporal affairs within the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish in Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Service are held in our Church every Sunday at 10.15am. During the year there are opportunities to have united services held alternatively in Lochmaben or Lockerbie.

Additional services are held at Easter and Christmas. There is a Guild and a Fundraising Group.

Achievements and Performance

Sunday Morning Worship is attended by approximately 50 people at Dryfesdale Church with more attending special events. There is an active guild with 29 members. We are greatly indebted to the Fundraising Group for the extra income they raise through various events throughout the year.

Financial Review

The main source of income is by direct giving. Members support the Church in various ways including freewill offering envelopes and standing orders with the balance coming from the open plate, church boxes and donations. Members are actively encouraged to sign Gift Aid forms.

General, unrestricted undesignated income for the year was £76,029 and general, unrestricted undesignated expenditure was £96,900. Legacies received in the year totalled £12,000.

Unrestricted, undesignated general funds increased to £792,551 from £777,786 as at 31st December 2024.

Unrestricted, designated funds (Guild) totalled £1,676 at the year end.

Restricted fund balance was £2,807 as at 31st December 2025 which represented the amount remaining from a legacy received which was to be used for maintenance, repair and/or restoration of Hutton & Corrie Church.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserve funds to cover major fabric repairs, other exceptional expenditure and future shortfalls.

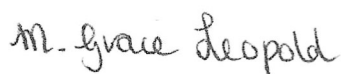

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently in the current and preceding year in dealing with items which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

The charity has adopted the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (issued February 2005)

Basis of Preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost convention, modified to reflect the inclusion of investments at market value and in accordance with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006, the Regulations anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (2005).

Funds

Funds are classified as either restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income there from is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

Incoming Resources

All donations and gifts are included within incoming resources under either unrestricted or restricted funds according to the terms under which the donation is made and when the amount can be quantified with reasonable certainty. Donations and gifts in kind are brought into the accounts at their market value to the charity.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as the liability is incurred.

Investments

During the financial year an investment was made of £350,000 which was worth £356,361 at the end of the financial year.

Taxation

Lockerbie Dryfesdale, Hutton, Corrie & Applegarth Church of Scotland is recognised as a charity for the purposes of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its charitable activities. The charity is not registered for VAT and resources expended therefore include irrecoverable input VAT.

Trustee Remuneration and Related Party Transactions

During the year Rev. Dr Frances Henderson received reimbursement of telephone expenses of £325.46, reimbursement of travel costs of £237.15 and had council tax of £3,586 paid in respect of Dryfesdale Manse.

During the year one member of the Kirk Session/Trustees received reimbursement of expenses incurred totalling £168.43.

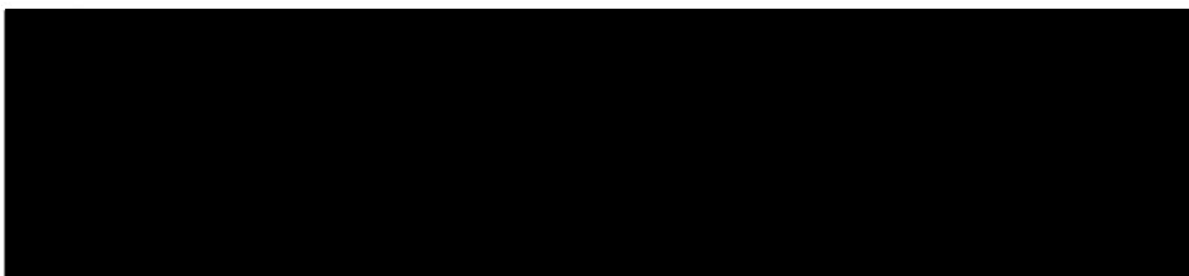

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) adopted on 9th October 2007.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session which meets six times a year is responsible for the spiritual and temporal affairs within the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in policy. It exists to glorify God and work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Services are held in Dryfesdale Church (Hall) every Sunday at 10.15am. On the 5th Sunday of the month there will be a united Service held alternatively in Lochmaben Church or Lockerbie Dryfesdale, Hutton, Corrie and Applegarth Church. Additional services are held at Easter and Christmas. There is a Guild and a Fundraising Group.

Achievements and Performance

Sunday morning worship is attended by approximately 50 people in Dryfesdale Church with more attending special events. There is an active guild with 29 members. We are greatly indebted to the Fundraising Group for the extra income they raise through various events throughout the year.

Financial Review

The main source of income is by direct giving. Members support the Church in various ways including freewill offering envelopes and standing orders with the main balance coming from the open plate, church boxes and donations. Members are actively encouraged to sign Gift Aid forms.

General unrestricted undesignated income for the year was £68,987 (includes a £12,000 claim from the Church of Scotland fabric fund for repairs required to the Manse) and general, unrestricted undesignated expenditure was £62,956. There were no legacies in the year.

Unrestricted, undesignated general funds rose from £448,676 to £459,959 as at 31st December 2024. However, this does not include the current value of the investments which was £320,725 as at 31st December 2024 (value of initial investment was £350,000).

Unrestricted designated funds (Guild) totalled £1,285 at the year end.

Restricted funds balance was £2,807 as at 31st December 2024 which represented the amount remaining from a legacy received which was to be used for maintenance, repair and / or restoration of Hutton & Corrie Church.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserve funds to cover major fabric repairs, other exceptional expenditure and future shortfalls.

Details of Consolidated Fabric funds held by the general trustees are detailed in Appendix 1.

Unrestricted reserves as at 31st December 2024 were as follows: General Fund £459,959 Designated Guild Fund £1,285. Designated Friendship Fund £ 0 and designated Sunday School Fund £0

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable and appreciation of the transactions of the church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request., must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investments (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and / or detection of fraud and other irregularities.
