Congregational Report Year to 31st December 2025

1. Constitution and Principal Activities of the United Free Church of Scotland

The United Free Church of Scotland, with all the Churches of the Reformation, acknowledges as its Supreme Standard, the Word of God contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.

The Church holds as its Subordinate Standard the Westminster Confession of Faith: by its Declaratory Acts, it recognises liberty of judgement on points of doctrine which do not enter into the substance of the faith: and it claims the right as duty may require, to interpret, add to, modify, or change her subordinate standards, under the promised guidance of the Holy Spirit and with a direct responsibility to her Lord.

The Church approves the emphasises of the Declaratory Acts on the love of God for all mankind, the free offer of salvation to all, the obligation of the Universal Church to make known the Gospel throughout the world, and the renunciation of coercion, persecution and intolerance in matters of religion.

Accordingly, this church accepts the obligation to witness to the truth of the Gospel and to serve men in the name of Christ with regard alike to their spiritual and material welfare, both at home and overseas.

2. Responsibilities of the congregation

As a Congregation of the United Free Church of Scotland this Congregation is under the jurisdiction and oversight of the superior courts of the Denomination i.e., the Presbytery of the East (in which this Congregation resides) and the General Assembly of the United Free Church in all matters pertaining to its spiritual and temporal (including financial) affairs. It seeks to exercise these obligations within its fellowship and to the people in the community of which it is part.

3. Responsibilities and Appointment of Office Bearers

All matters affecting the spiritual well-being and order of the Congregation is by exercises by the Kirk Session of this Congregation. The Kirk Session consists of its Pastor/Interim Moderator and ruling elders. All temporal affairs (including financial) of the Congregation are administered by the Congregational Board/Deacons Court/Committee of Management of this Congregation. The property Trustees of the Congregation are the Ex Officio Office Bearers named on page 2 of this Report.

The Pastor/Interim Moderator of this Congregation is appointed by the Presbytery of the East. Elders, elected in accordance with the Practice and Procedure of the United Free Church of Scotland, along with members, elected by the Congregation at the Annual General Meeting or at a meeting of the Congregation specifically called for that purpose, from the Congregational Board/Deacons Court/Committee of Management Office Bearers are appointed by the Courts which they serve.

All offices of the Church are open to any member in full communion. Each Congregation appoints elders to the Presbytery and to be Commissioners to the General Assembly. "Presbyterianism" means the government of the Church by elders.

4. Activities and Achievements

We confirm the ongoing provision of services of worship, prayer meetings and bible study. Also, on Sundays we hold Sunday School, in the morning. The Women's Association holds meetings in the church hall, and an open door throughout the year we hold coffee days throughout the year also the pastor visits the sick and elderly. We also do monthly service at Burngrange Care Home. Although, Covid-19 had a grip on church attendant, we were some of the lucky ones. We thank God for his mercies in Jesus Christ Name - Amen.

5. Financial Statements and funds

In accordance with the Charities and trustee investment (Scotland) Act 2005 The 2005 Act and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) regulations 2006 ('the Regulation) and being a charity with an annual gross income less than £100,000, the financial Statements of the Congregation set on pages 7 to 9 consist of a statement of Congregational Funds and movement thereon during the Year ending 31st December 2025 and details of the Receipts and Payments, (Deficit), and Net Movement on funds during the year with supplementary notes there where appropriate.

Brief summary of financial position for the year together with medium of any significant/extraordinary items and any significant outstanding income/expenditure which might impact upon the yearend financial position as shown by the Statement of Congregation Funds.

The Ordinary Receipts and Payments for the regular Congregational activities are shown in the General Fund and in the year amounted to £34,817.87 and £33,443.76 respectively and give a surplus (Deficits) of £1,374.11, there are Extraordinary and Other Receipts. There were repairs costs of £8,775.50. Unit Trust Fund stands at £124,680.04 with a loss of -£16,520.38 from previous year.

6. Accounting Policies

The main sources of income are the voluntary offerings, donations and other giving of members, adherents, and related organisations, and interest or dividends on Congregation Funds.

The Receipts and Payments of Congregation Funds are recorded and reported on a cash received and cash paid (as invoices/accounts are received) basis respectively. If in the event that a commitment is made after the date of the statement of Balances which will materially Reflect will materially Reflect on the amount of any fund(s) this will be reported in the accompanying Notes to these statements.

The Balances of Congregation Funds represent sums available for the ongoing work and activities of the Congregation, stating whether each fund is Unrestricted, Designated, Restricted or Endowment and, where appropriate, for what purpose and how these Funds are held or invested.

7. Land and Property

Land and Property consist of Church, Church Halls, together with fittings and furnishings (including communion, and other ecclesiastical articles).

These are held as functional property for the use of the Congregation in fulfilling its aims and mission and in which its activities are carried out and not for investment or for resale. No market value has been placed on these assets.

8. Independent Examiner

In accordance with the terms of 'the 2005', Act Section 44(1)(c), and as a Charity falling under the regulation 9, of 'The Regulations', and not required to carry out an audit under Paragraph 9 (4), An Independent Examiner has been appointed in accordance with regulation 11 of 'The Regulations' to carry out a competent examination of the Report and Financial Statements of the Congregation. The Independent Examiner's Report for the year to 31st December 2025 is on page 6.

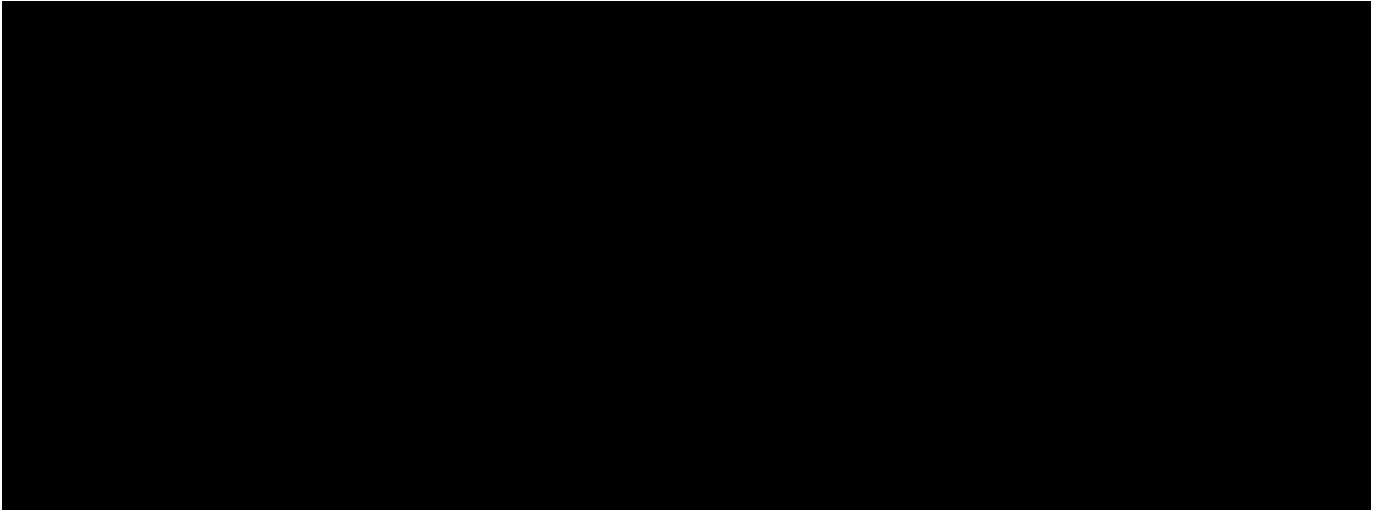

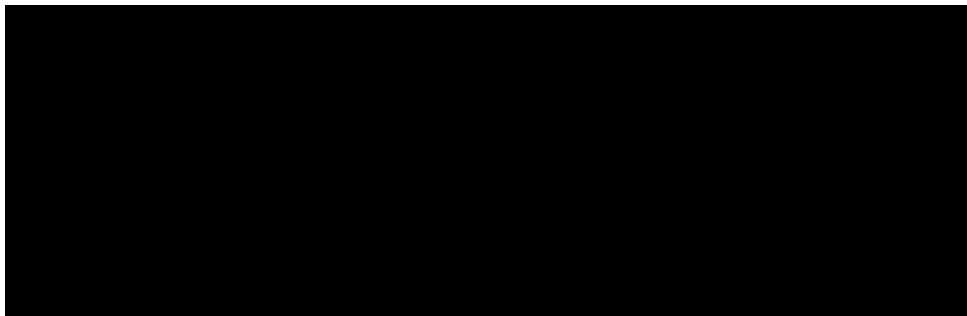
