Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session and Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The Congregational Board is appointed from within the congregation and members of the congregation are invited to nominate individuals who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management affairs of the church.

The minister is elected by the congregation and inducted by the Presbytery and is a member of the Kirk Session and Congregational Board.

Board members are then appointed at the Annual Stated Meeting and serve for a period of three years after which they must seek re-election at the Stated Annual Meeting.

Organisational Structure

The Congregational Board is chaired by the minister, who is elected by the Congregation and inducted by the Presbytery, and meets around six times in a year.

The Kirk Session, which meets four times a year, is responsible for the spiritual affairs of the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish in Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

The church halls are also made available for local and national elections, a missionary society annual meetings and other approved activities.

Year Ended 31 December 2024

Achievements and Performance

The congregation has 43 members, most of whom are aged and retired. Very few members are in full time employment. However, we have around 17 adherents who regularly attend forenoon and evening services. Despite the small numbers and the limited means of many members the costs of ministry, fabric and congregational dues were met during the year but a deficit resulted. There is also a high level of donations forwarded to external charities and other causes.

Financial Review

The deficit for the year was £1,264 This resulted from both a drop in income and increases in expenditure. The only substantial, exceptional, item of expenditure was an architect's fee of £1,530, being drawings for the projected disabled toilet.

The only item of investment income received was from the Nisbet Trust. All fund details are shown on pages 8 and 11 of the accounts.

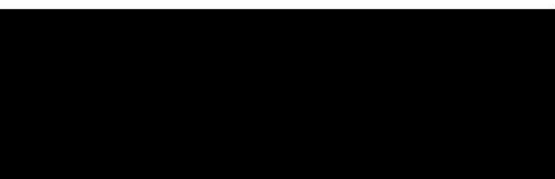
The Kirk Session and Congregational Board remain committed to maintaining the fabric of the church sanctuary.

The congregation's reserves represent around twelve months of turnover and are held to cover cash flow during the year.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

Members of the Kirk Session and Congregational Board must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail in order to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. These members are also responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This is done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2016. They are also responsible for the safeguarding of the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

**Report of the Independent Examiner to the Trustees of Trinity Possil and Henry Drummond
Church, Glasgow**

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024 which are set out in pages 6 to 11.

Respective Responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The Charity trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under Section 44 (1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiner's statement

In the course of my examination no matter has come to my attention:

1. which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the requirements:
 - to keep accounting records in accordance with Section 44 (1) (a) of the 2005 Act and Regulation 4 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations and

Purpose of Restricted Funds

Major Repair and Renewals Fund.

This fund was set up to meet major repair and renovation costs.

Music and Audiovisual Fund

This fund was set up to provide for the purchase and repair of musical and audio equipment and associated expenses.

New Manse Fund

This fund was set up to provide for the purchase of a new manse.

Youth Fund

This fund has been set up for the purpose of providing children and and young people's Christian education and associated activities.

Mission Fund

This fund is used for Christian outreach and educational activities.

War Memorial Fund

This fund was set up to maintain the church war memorial.

Minister's Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the cost of all minister's stipends and employee's national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale , which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £31,642 and the maximum stipend in 5th and subsequent years of service was £38,884.
