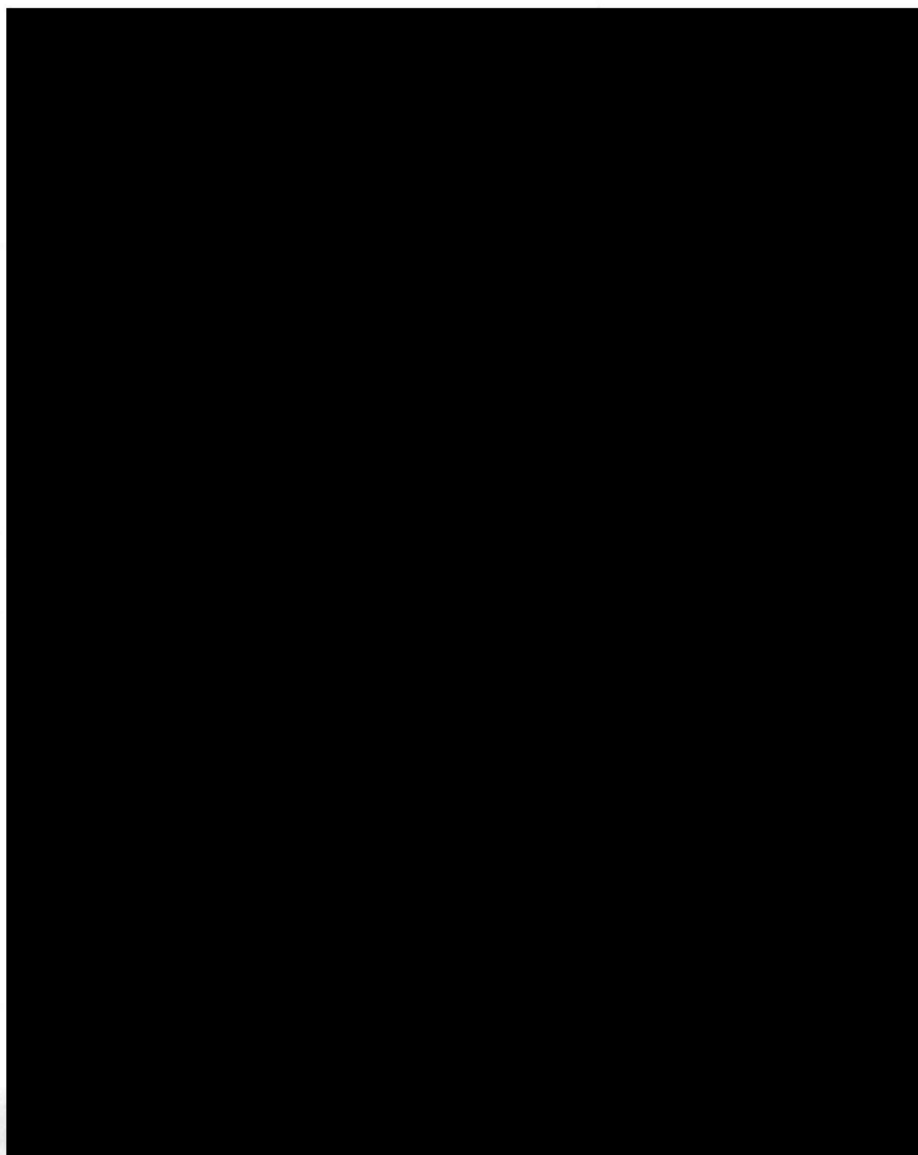

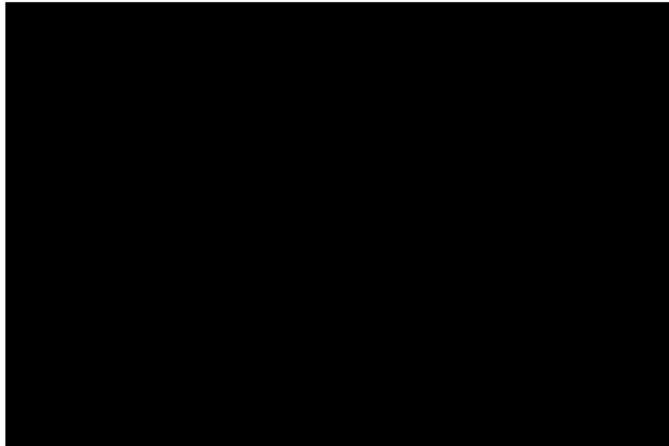

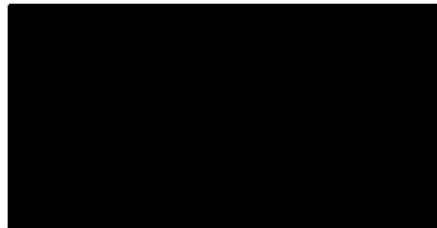

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT - YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Unitary Constitution.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the Trustees of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. An Interim Moderator is a minister appointed by Presbytery to oversee the Kirk Session and congregation during a vacancy.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session met 12 times last year, is responsible for financial and spiritual affairs within the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in policy. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As the national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Services of worship are held every Sunday morning and include the Sacrament of Holy Communion at morning and evening worship on the first Sunday of every month. There is a Bible Class on Sunday Morning also . There is an informal Midweek Reflection service on Thursday mornings. The Sunday School, called The Sonhouse, meets during worship times and is for children between the ages of 3 and 11 years there are 18 children attending also there is a bible class of 4 which meets during worship for 12 -15 year olds also Youth Fellowship of 8

16 – 20 years old. There is a crèche for children up to the age of 3 years. The church has a Guild which meet weekly during the session, There is also a Girls Brigade Company with 17 young girls. The Kirk Session actively encourages the use of the church premises as a community facility. This Year there was, community cafe and Alzheimers Scotland Recycled Teenagers Crochet Club Breast feeding group as well as a number of Alcoholics Anonymous and Al-Anon groups Gamblers Anonymous and Citizens Advice.

Achievements and Performance

There are 229 members on the Congregational Roll as at 31 December 2024. Attendances at Sunday morning services are normally around 50 - 75 adults and 20 young people.

The Kirk Session has continued with its team approach and has teams of Elders and Congregational members with specific remits for Worship, Children and Young People, Pastoral Care, Mission, Outreach, Property, Prayer and Welcome.

Financial Review

The principal source of income is the weekly offering, either donated through the Weekly Freewill Offering envelopes, Standing Orders to the Bank or donations through the open plate on Sunday mornings. There was a decrease of £9,703 in offerings. Rental of premises has decrease over last year by £740 The congregation ended the year with a Deficit of receipts over payments of £857 in Congregational Fund in Building and Repair fund and was a surplus of £2,796 and an overall Surplus £1,939

Reserves

At the year end, the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £89,577 of which had been designated £284 is designated for the Sonhouse (Sunday school); £490 for the Guild; £1,279 for the Youth Fellowship ; £173 for Bible Class Pre5 £44 The remaining balance of £87,307 represents four month's expenditure.

The Church also held £7,771 of restricted funds which £3,470 have been provided for the maintenance of the church property and Food Bank £1,966 Community Cafe £2,335

Ministry & Mission

Ministry & Mission was paid by standing order over 10 monthly payments £25,375

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

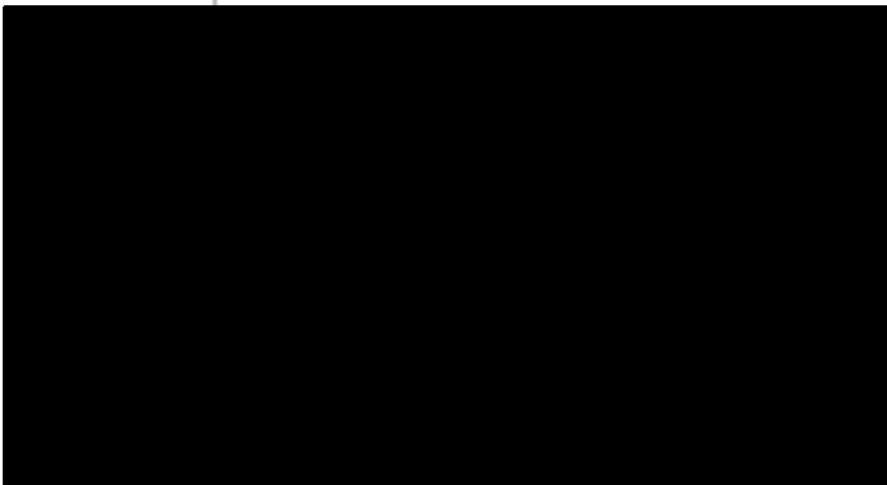

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Uddingston Burnhead Parish Church of Scotland

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024 which are set out on pages 1 to 12.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
