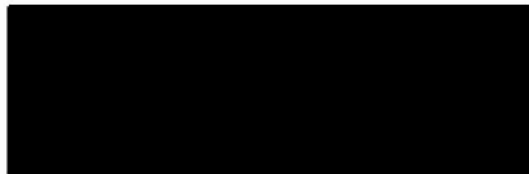

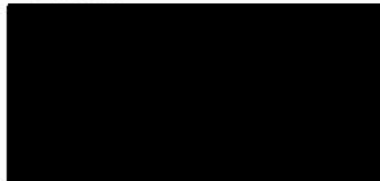

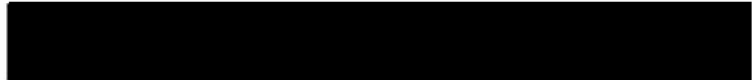

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form)

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session, which meets six times a year, is responsible for spiritual affairs within the church, It also has responsibility for financial and property matters.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in policy. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Kirkmahoe Parish Church normally has a service in the main church in the village of Kirkton every Sunday

Card communions take place on the first Sunday of May and November;

The minister also gives a communion in the home of those who are housebound.

There is no longer a Sunday School.

Achievements and Performance:

The church now relies on volunteers when there is an event to raise much needed funds.

It must be noted with gratitude that members of the congregation have been very generous in their support of the work of the Church allowing us to cover most of the expenditure required to sustain the fabric and community of Kirkmahoe Parish Church. Our Locum Minister has been faithful in keeping contact with the members of the congregation as have the elders.

Weekly services are held and the life of the church community is quietly supportive of members.

The minister and elders have encouraged participation in the service with a team of people who read scripture and lead prayers of intercession. [REDACTED] usually leads the services when the minister is on holiday.

Trustees' Annual Report (continued)

Reserves Policy

At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash of £27,475.31 of which £18,569.51 has been designated: for the Fabric Funds, £16,005.00; for the Project a/c, £1,908.47; Organ fund £656.04. The remaining balance is £8,905.80.

Reserves are healthy due to the continued rental income from the Manse.

The Church also holds £54.00 of restricted funds which have been provided for the purposes specified.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities:

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Financial Review:

The principal source of income comes from weekly offerings and particularly from Gift Aid donations, but this has fallen due to the decline in the number of donors.

As Kirkmahoe is a small rural charge, cash flow and the ability to keep the church financially viable are always matters of concern, as are the ever increasing Insurance bills. Members are therefore encouraged to review their giving to the church wherever possible.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Kirkmahoe Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2024, which are set out on Pages 7 to 12

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("The Regulations")

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

At the conclusion of my examination, no matter has come to my attention:

 - * to keep accounting records in accordance with Section 44(1) (a) of the 2005 Act and Regulation 4 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations, and

2. To which, in my opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

Purpose of Restricted Funds

Trust Fund The purpose of this fund has not been fully ascertained by the Trustees and mainly at this time is used for an income from dividends.
