Trustees' report for the year ended 30 September 2025

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

Objectives and activities

Objectives and aims

The purpose of the charity is to benefit the local community through the advancement of education, religion, citizenship and community development, as well as the advancement of the arts, heritage, culture, science and public participation in sport.

Significant activities

The main sources of income for the charity include grants, hall lets and fundraising income. The Trustees continue to be responsible for the upkeep and maintenance, heating and lighting, cleaning, insurance of building/ contents and for public/ employer's liability and for the general running of the hall. This includes arranging lettings, taking booking fees, organising fundraising and ensuring that the hall is utilised as much as possible.

Achievements and performance

Charitable activities

The Statement of Financial Activities and the Detailed Statement of Financial Activities provide details of costs incurred and net income and expenditure.

Fundraising activities

Fundraising income for the year was £4,639 (2024 £3,448) which comprised of hall rental £1,767 (2024 £816) and income from running various events £2,872 (2024 £2,632).

Financial review

Financial position

Grants totalling £53,732 were received in the year (2024 £3,265).

This included £48,245 from Borders Community Action to pay for insulation and new windows. All monies were expended in the period apart from £4,825 which was carried forward towards the second part of the windows costs.

In addition, Muirhall Energy granted £3,500 and LAMCC granted £1987, both towards general costs.

In the prior year, a grant of £3000 was received from Foundation Scotland to pay for groundworks around the Hall, and £265 was received from LAMCC for kitchen equipment.

Financial review - continued

Reserves policy

The Trustees maintain general and designated reserves to protect against unforeseen fluctuations in income and to provide sufficient funds to preserve the building and its surroundings. General funding arises from hall rental and general grants and donations. Restricted reserves are recorded where grants and donations are received from third parties for specific purposes. The Trustees review the level of reserves regularly in accordance with the needs of the charity. More information is given in the Notes to the financial statements.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The trustees have assessed the principal risks faced by the charity and have established procedures to mitigate those risks.

Structure, governance and management

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The charity's Trustees from the local community are appointed from the local community at the Annual General Meeting. Newly appointed trustees receive appropriate induction and training.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Currie Memorial Hall Lilliesleaf

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 30 September 2025, which are set out on pages 5 to 13.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

In the course of my examination, no matter has come to my attention

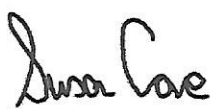

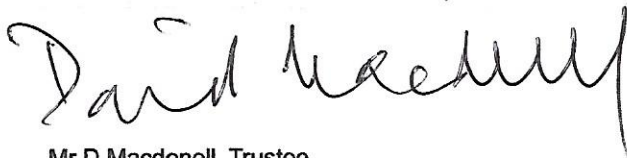

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', the Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention.

Going concern

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees have assessed whether there are any material uncertainties related to events or conditions that cast significant doubt upon the charity's ability to continue as a going concern. In making this assessment, the trustees take into account all available information about the future which is at least 12 months from the date that the financial statements are authorised for issue.

The trustees consider that the charity has adequate resources to continue in business for the foreseeable future and that it is appropriate to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of financial activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
