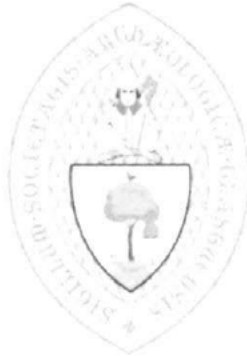

Reports from Council Members

President, [REDACTED]

My unwavering thanks goes to all our council members who have contributed to the running of GAS over the last year. They have guided me through my first year as President with patience and solid advice. Can I take this opportunity also to welcome new members to the council, [REDACTED] who has taken over as Membership Secretary and [REDACTED], who will be an ordinary member. Past presidents hold a vast reservoir of knowledge on GAS, its history and how it functions. I attended my first President's lunch in December 2024 and was greatly touched by the support and advice they were willing to impart. It was with great sadness then, that soon after, we learned of the passing of past President, [REDACTED] in January of this year. It will be my pleasure, as current President, to ensure his contribution and achievements within GAS are remembered.

I am delighted to see that membership has grown this year. This is thanks to our new system of online purchasing of membership on our website, set up by our last President, [REDACTED]. During the last year I have received and dealt with submissions for the Journal and sent these to EUP in the required format. Proof reading and corrections then followed resulting in the publication of SAJ47. Jim Mearns advice, assistance and guidance were invaluable and [REDACTED] role as Assistant Editor has also been of huge benefit and I greatly appreciated the help of both in getting SAJ47 published.

Excursion Convenor, Moira Gemmell

We ran one excursion within the city in 2024. In May we visited the site of the 1988 Glasgow Garden Festival where investigative work is ongoing into what has survived to form a legacy.

In June we made a self drive trip to Low Parks Museum Hamilton and were given a tour of the Mausoleum.

Our coach excursion was to the newly refurbished Perth Museum, where amongst other exhibits, we viewed the Stone of Destiny in its new and permanent home. We also visited the historical Kirk of St John .

At the beginning of 2025 we ran two excursions within the city. In February we walked the historical route from George Square to Glasgow Cathedral. In March we had a guided tour of the Burrell Collection in Pollok Park.

Publicity Convenor, Anthony Lewis

The good news is publicity about GAS is stronger and better thank to GAS Council members Allan Gifford, Orla Craig and Lauren Welsh. We are now able to review what we do better and have people with skills to use new social media platforms. The new GAS website will also be able to carry communications and publicity better too.

In retrospect, the figures for 2025 indicate the same pattern as reported in 2024. This is to say that the more activities that are recorded with images and texts and put up on social media the more attention we get. The Facebook page again indicates that most of our 3,600 followers are over 35 years old and based in the UK and USA and the gender balance is even (49% male and 51% female).

Over the past 90 days (since 15th March 2025) the Facebook page received 9,198 views so possibly an annual viewing could touch 30,000? As ever, converting viewers into members is our concern.

The X/Twitter account is locked to us and will ultimately perish. New platforms to take on will be found and ideally the council members can use them to promote activities, events and announcements.

NOTES to Treasurers Report 2024

In the RECEIPTS section the DONATIONS total is considerably greater than the previous years. This is due to the very generous Bequest left to the Society by the late, long served GAS Member, [REDACTED]

As to this sections item titled, GIFT AID. There was again no submission this year to HMRC re donations by Gift Aid.. This was due to difficulties with the closure of the Societies Deposit Account, which made it difficult to identify those who continued to support the Gift Aid scheme.

In the PUBLICATIONS section of the PAYMENTS column, the Society maintains a quantity of Publications and there was no demand for further purchases this year,

Also in PAYMENTS, the DONATION of £38158.95 was transferred to the Societies Skipton account. In MISCELLANEOUS, the sum of £19829.95 reflects the final closure of the Deposit account by the Virgin Bank and the funds transfer to the Societies Current account.

Finally, in the STATEMENT OF BALANCES, the DEPOSIT account is shown to be closed. There was no reason given by the bank for this closure, other than this type of account was considered to be obsolete . It is worth pointing out that this account contained almost all our Members Standing Orders.

Independent Examiners Report

We report on the accounts of Glasgow Archaeological Society for the year ended 31st December, 2024
