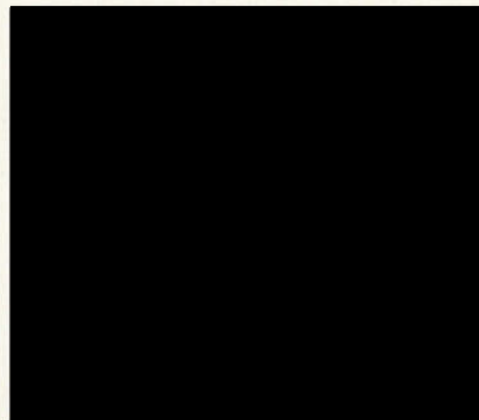

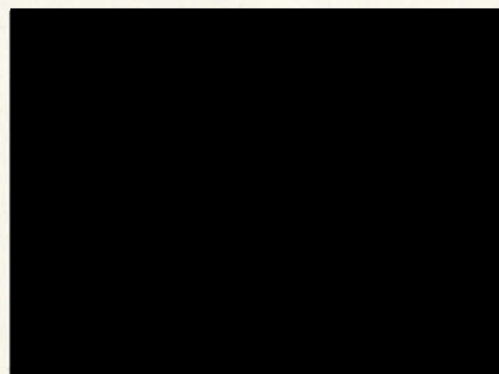

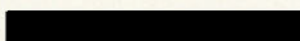

Congregational Report year ending 31st December 2024

1. Constitution and Principal Activities of the United Free Church of Scotland

The United Free Church of Scotland, with all the Churches of the Reformation, acknowledges as its Supreme Standard, the Word of God contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments.

The Church holds as its Subordinate Standards the Westminster Confession of Faith; by its Declaratory Acts it recognises liberty of judgement on points of doctrine which do not enter in to the substance of the faith; and it claims the right as duty may require to interpret, add to, modify, or change her subordinate standards, under the promised guidance of the Holy Spirit, and with a direct responsibility to her Lord.

The Church approves the emphasis of the Declaratory Acts on the love of God for all mankind, the free offer of salvation to all, the obligation of the Universal Church to make known the Gospel throughout the world, and the renunciation of coercion, persecution, and intolerance in matters of religion.

Accordingly, this Church accepts the obligation to witness to the truth of the Gospel and to serve men in the name of Christ with regard alike to their spiritual and material welfare, both at home and overseas.

2. Responsibilities of the Congregation

As a Congregation of the United Free Church of Scotland this Congregation is under jurisdiction and oversight of the superior courts of Denomination i.e. the Presbytery of the East (in which this Congregation resides) and the General Assembly of the United Free Church in all matters pertaining to fellowship and to the people in the community of which is part.

3. Responsibilities and Appointment of Office Bearers

All matters affecting the spiritual well-being and order of the Congregation is exercised by the Kirk of Session of this Congregation. The Kirk Session consists of its Minister and ruling elders/ All temporal affairs (including financial) of the Congregation are administered by the Committee of Management of this Congregation. The Property Trustees of the Congregation are the Ex Officio Bearers named on page 2 of this report.

The Minister of Congregation is appointed by the Presbytery of the East. Elders elected in accordance with the Practice and Procedure of the United Free Church of Scotland, along with members, elected by Congregation at the Annual General Meeting of the Congregation specifically called for that purpose, form the committee of Management, Office Bearers are appointed by the Court which they serve.

All offices of the Church are open to any member in full communion. Each Congregation appoints elders to the Presbytery and to be Commissioners to the General Assembly/Presbyterianism means the government of the Church by elders.

4. Activities and Achievements

Sunday worship continued faithfully in Erskine throughout the year, with some services being shared alongside other local churches either in Erskine itself or elsewhere. A small group met regularly for Bible study via Zoom on Thursday evenings.

Seasonal services were held during the major Christian festivals, notably at Easter and Christmas, again often in partnership with other congregations in Burntisland and Kinghorn.

Our Monday Association engaged with a really good mix of people from the local area, meeting either in-person or via Zoom. Regular coffee mornings also served to keep up close links with the community, as well as raising funds.

Erskine's halls were used on a weekly basis by a variety of local groups-their activities include table tennis, choir singing, dancing, Rainbows and Brownies and Lite Bite.

We have also been partners in the BEK worker project, which involves funding of a full-time post working with young people, local schools and the community often through sporting activities. This has proven to be very fruitful for our churches.

Erskine sought to contribute to good causes both local, national and beyond throughout the past year. These included Burntisland Foodbank, Bethany Christian Trust and Tearfund.

5. Financial Statements and Funds

In accordance with the Charities and Trustees investment (Scotland) Act 2005 (the 2005 Act) and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (the regulations) and being a charity with an annual gross income less than £250,000 the Financial Statements of this Congregation set out on pages 8 – 10, consists of a Statement of Congregation Funds and movements thereon during the year ending 31st December 2024 and details of the Receipts and Payments, Surplus (Deficit), and Net Movement of Funds during the year with supplementary notes thereon where appropriate.

2024 resulted in a deficit of £18,841.91 compared to last years £22,553.61. Although there was a profit from Investment, if this was included the deficit would be £16,944.79. Hopefully with inflation easing, the rising in costs is slowing down, and will have an impact on the reduction of the deficit. There was a significant amount raised again by the Monday Association of £5,000, and congratulations to the members for continuing to raise this amount of money each year. We are very grateful for their donation.

Income was up this year by £6021.28.

Our Organist plays almost every Sunday and takes no fee. He is a vital member of the Congregation and we thank him for his contribution.

This years outgoings increased from £65,689.14 to £66,321.56, which is an increase of £632.42. Hopefully the expenditure will remain at a steady pace for the foreseeable future.

6. Accounting Policies

- The main sources of income are the voluntary offerings, donations and other giving of members, adherents, and related organisations, and interest or dividends on Congregation Funds.
- The Receipts and Payments of Congregation Funds are recorded and reported on a cash received and cash paid (as invoices/accounts are received) basis respectively. In the event that a commitment is made after the date on the Statement of Balances which will materially reflect on the amount of any Fund(s) this will be reported in the accompanying Notes to these Statements.
- The balances of Congregation Funds represent sums available for the ongoing work and activities of Congregation, stating whether each Fund is Unrestricted, Designated, Restricted or Endowment and, where appropriate, for what purpose and how these funds are held or invested.

7. Land and Property

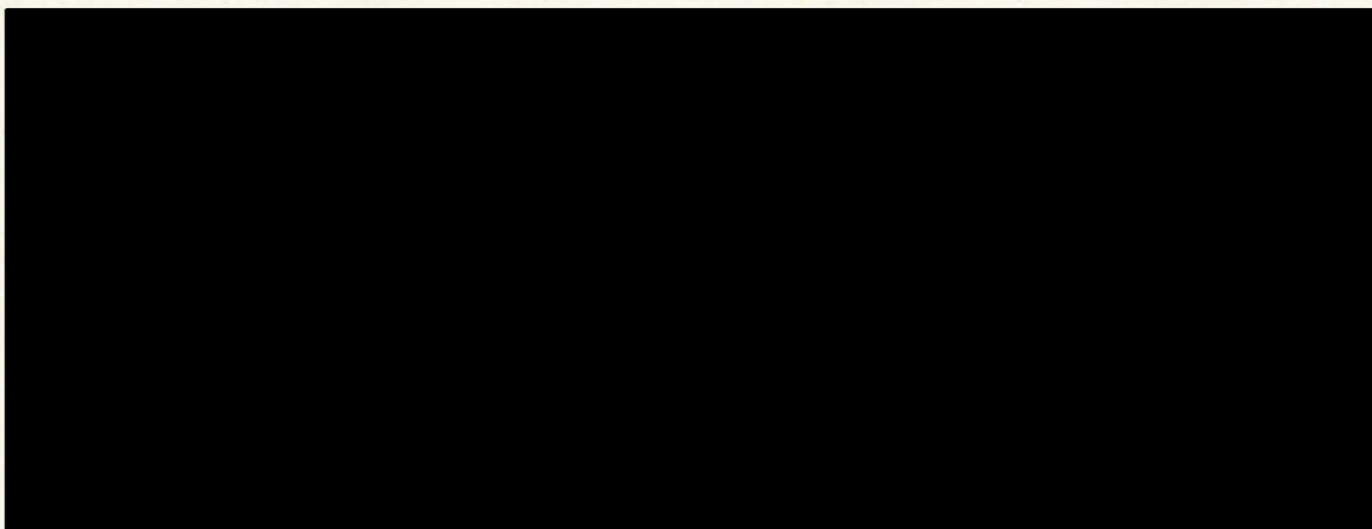
Land and Property consist of Church, Church Hall, together with fittings and furnishings (including communion, other ecclesiastical articles). The Congregation owns the Manse. These are held as functional property for the use of the Congregation in fulfilling its aims and mission and in which its activities are carried out and not investment and/or resale. No market value is placed on these Assets.

8. Independent Examiner

In accordance with the term of 'the 2005 Act', Section 44 (1), and as a Charity falling under regulation 9 of 'The Regulations' and not required to carry out an audit paragraph 9(4), an Independent Examiner has been appointed in accordance with regulation 22 of 'The Regulations' to carry out a competent examination of the Report and Financial Statements of the Congregation. The Independent Examiners Report for the year ending 31st December 2024 is on page 7.

9. Approval of Congregational Report and Financial Statements

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees and Office Bearers of Erskine United Free Church of Scotland

The Congregation's Office Bearers and Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the Report and Accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005b Act") and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("the 2006 regulations").
