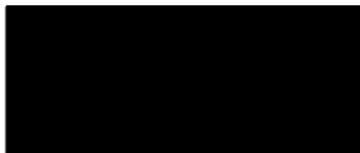

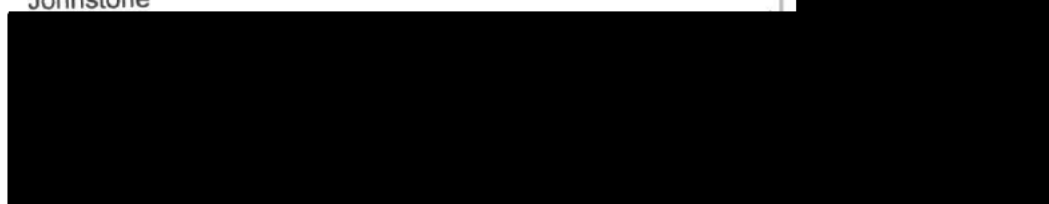

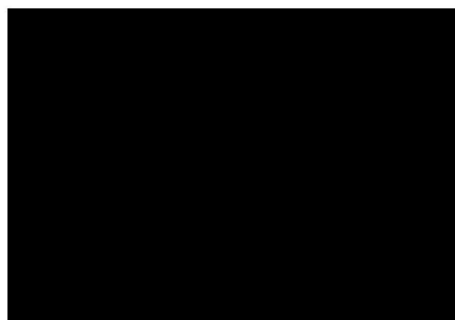

The source of income for the Charity is the sale of goods from the Thrift Shop. The Thrift Shop receives donations of clothing and goods from the general public which are sold to provide the financial means to support the charity giving. The shop is staffed entirely by unpaid volunteers. The income raised in the the Thrift Shop provides for local charitable appeals from the community of Beith and on occasion, appeals from national charities.

As the Charity operates on the basis of disbursement of funds received there is no specific policy in place.

Achievements and Performance

The purpose of the Thrift Shop remains the same as in previous years. The shop has recovered from the closure due to coronavirus period with sales remaining realistic and acceptable levels. The charity would like to formally recognise and applaud the contribution of the volunteers who run the shop with whom it would not be possible to continue.




