APPENDIX 1

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

In the year under review the Rotary Club of Troon Trust Fund contributed £5310 (2024 - £7875) by way of grants and donations to a range of community groups and other charities.

The Fiddler's Concert held in Troon Concert Hall raise a total of £4023.93 of which £1600 was donated to several Charities, £423.93 was transferred to Rotary Youth Projects, £1000 to Community Grants Fund, £1000 to Foundation & £500 to International Fund.

The Christmas Raffle raised a total of £1276 which was transferred to the International Fund.

The Bridge Afternoon raised a total of £1582.00 which was transferred to the Community Grants Fund.

The Project for collecting and crushing aluminium cans raised a total of £460.07 which was transferred to the TRCS Fund.

From Foundation Fund £1000 was donated to the 'End Polio Now' campaign run by Rotary Foundation, and aimed at the worldwide eradication of polio.

The Troon Rotary Community Support Project (TRCS) which donates upto £400 every 2 months to a selected local community project. Out of existing funds the Total donated up to 30th June 2025 was £2250.

From Community Grants Fund £100 was donated

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

It is the policy of the trustees to maintain a prudent level of reserves to enable the Trust Fund to respond to urgent situations of need as they arise throughout the year.

A number of charitable donations are made to local charities and youth organisations on an annual basis whereas the proceeds from specific fund-raising events are distributed throughout the year.

Details of any deficit

Timing differences gave rise to deficits on a number of funds. In particular, the proceeds from fund-raising events held in late spring / early summer may not be finally determined until the new financial year. Likewise, some community projects are being funded out of amounts raised in a prior year




