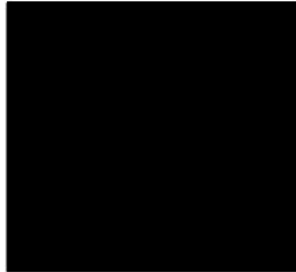

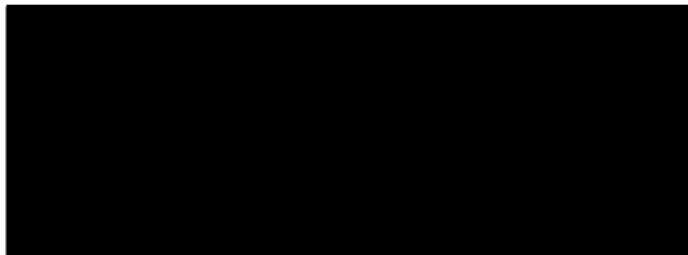

**Structure, Governance and Management**

**Governing Document**

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

**Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees**

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

**Organisational Structure**

The Kirk Session which meets nine times per year is responsible for both spiritual affairs within the church and the financial management of its affairs. Certain other responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Group and the Property group as appropriate.

**Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring ordinances of religion to the people in every parish in Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

**Achievements and Performance**

Presbytery Planning and the future of the congregation dominated our work through the year resulting in our published place in the Presbytery Plan as being the dissolution of the church and parish at the end of the present ministry.

This radically changed the outlook of the congregation and much has had to be refocused on what is a "good ending" rather than a revitalisation of our mission and ministry in the community.

The continued frustration of not being able to complete the works to allow the sale of Church House only adds to our financial constraints and thus we were not able to pay in full the new "Giving to Grow" in 2023. However the continued support of the congregation for one another, particularly at a time when office bearers had a great deal of personal health and family matters to address, demonstrates its life and vitality.

**Financial Review 2023/ Budget 2024**

On going issues with the format of presentation of accounts for 2022 meant a delay in presenting the accounts until 2025.

The budget for 2024 set by the Finance Committee acknowledges the continued challenges in meeting both outstanding Ministry and Mission costs and rising energy costs. Funds will be drawn down from reserves to address these matters and advice is being sought on further ways to increase revenue.

Once again we have applied for variance to how Giving to Grow is paid, but expect to do that in full, utilising reserves.

The rise in inflation generally means we need to ask the congregation to be more generous when they are facing financial challenges in their everyday lives and the reality is that even the most committed small membership cannot sustain the required level of giving even after the sale of assets addresses current issues.


**Reserves Policy**

At the year end, the church held total funds of £21,975 of which is unrestricted funds of £1,813, restricted funds of £17,995 and endowment funds of £2,167. Unrestricted general funds of £1,813 which is needed for unforeseen repairs to the church buildings. We regard this amount as insufficient and unsatisfactory in view of the enormous costs which could be incurred. The remaining unrestricted funds of £106 have been designated for the social committee fund.



**Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities**

The Trustees must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2016. **Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Pollokshields Church Of Scotland, Glasgow**  
I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2023 which are set out on pages 6 to 11.

**Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

**Basis of independent examiners statement.**

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

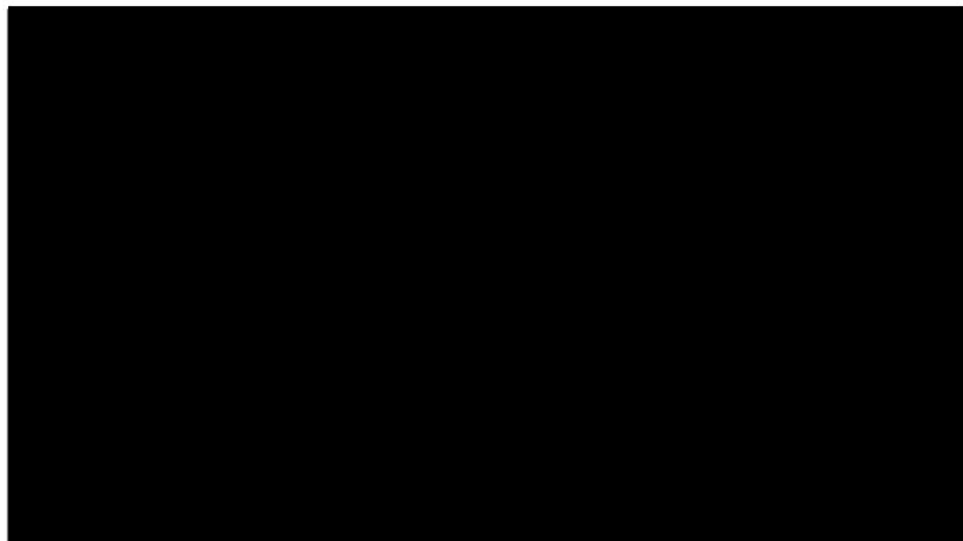



#### 6 Minister's Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review, the minimum stipend was £30,135 and the maximum stipend (in the fifth and subsequent years) was £37,032.
