Trustees' Annual Report

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the Charity Trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session which meets four times a year is responsible for all matters within the church, with specific areas of work and responsibility tasked to Workgroups.

Bilston Mission Church has a local leadership team and is delegated responsibility for the work within the Bilston area.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Public worship is held at 10.30 a.m. on Sunday mornings at Loanhead and at 11.30 a.m. at Bilston Mission Church on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. The service at Loanhead is also available online.

A Junior Church for primary school aged children and a group for teenagers meet on Sunday mornings at Loanhead. A Creche is available for babies and younger children during Sunday services. Chaplaincy input is provided to Paradykes, Loanhead and Bilston Primary Schools. Youth Outreach takes place on a Friday evening at Loanhead. The church also supports local uniformed youth organisations (Boys' Brigade and Guiding) by providing accommodation and practical support both at Loanhead and Bilston.

Social events are organised throughout the year, alongside fund raising events to raise money for church work and work by charities overseas. A regular opportunity to meet for 'Tea & Chat' is held on Friday mornings in the church halls at Loanhead, with a similar event on Tuesday mornings at Bilston.

Loanhead has a Pastoral Care team which provides support for those who are ill or bereaved and a Community Outreach group is in place to enable support within the local community. Similar support is provided at Bilston.

Small groups of up to 8 people meet regularly for bible study, discussion and to explore ways to extend the work and witness of members. A Guild group, including ladies from Bilston, meets monthly at Loanhead with a varied programme of events and speakers. A MumCo Group meets on a fortnightly basis on Monday mornings and there is also a monthly evening MumCo group. An Alpha group meets on Thursday evenings in the Spring. Two church day retreats provided an opportunity for reflection, increased connection and the deepening of faith.

Support is given to work in Kenya through Project Stedfast and to work in Rwanda.

Achievements and Performances

The union between Loanhead and Bilston has allowed work and worship in both communities to continue, alongside a parish grouping with Roslin Church.

Around 85 attend worship weekly at Loanhead, with a mix of ages, including an average of 12 children and teenagers who take part in their own activities during the service. This is slightly more than the previous year. Around 8 -11 people attend services at Bilston Mission Church, which is less than the previous year. There are a further 20 to 25 views of the online service.

Assemblies and work with classes in the three primary schools – Paradykes, Loanhead and Bilston – has continued. The group for teenagers on Friday evenings has grown during 2025.

The numbers involved in regular small groups has remained stable with around 25 involved, the Guild at Loanhead has met monthly with around 12 to 15 members at each meeting. This includes ladies from Bilston as unfortunately the Bilston branch had to close due to low numbers. Uniformed youth organisations have over 100 young people involved. The morning MumCo group meets fortnightly, and in 2025 had up to 15 mums meeting each session, an increase on the previous year. The MumCo evening group has 2 – 6 mums meeting monthly.

At Loanhead, the Community Outreach Group is active in providing support to families and individuals in different ways. As part of this, in December, Christmas gifts were distributed to 40 local families. Church members helped with donations for this, with significant support from the wider community and local schools. Food and gifts were also made available to Kilbreck House. Similar support was given to families and individuals at Bilston.

The Pastoral Care group at Loanhead continues to support housebound and elderly and ensures that the church provides flowers at times of bereavement – as well as family celebrations. A number of afternoon tea events were organized and in 2025 this included 'in the home' afternoon teas for those unable to attend events due to age or disability. A larger Christmas event was held for those over 70, with pupils from Paradykes School providing the entertainment. At Bilston, flowers are distributed weekly.

For Remembrance a garden was created in the church grounds at Loanhead to allow people to place poppy crosses. This was well supported and appreciated by the community.

The links to support the work of local churches, groups and families in Rwanda continue.

Financial Review

The principal source of income for the general work is weekly offerings and standing orders paid directly to the bank by members along with donations. Income from these sources saw a 11% increase compared to 2024. This can be attributed to a rise in giving following a Stewardship Campaign launched at the end of 2024. Income from fundraising for general purposes was £5,074. Income from hall rent, other receipts and bequests totalling £13,172 saw an increase over 2024 due to a rise in hall lets to outside agencies in 2025.

Expenditure in 2025 was lower than 2024, when there was a substantial roof bill. Heating and lighting were high in 2024 due to late billing relating to 2023.

The surplus for the year in the General Fund was £14,191. Increases in giving and hall lets income, along with more stable heating and lighting costs, were the main contributors.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of four to six months' expenditure excluding designated funds. At the end of the year the church held unrestricted cash funds of £75,661 (2024: £59,512) This represents ten months of expenditure.

£55,174 of this is held for Loanhead (2023: £40,977) which is eight months of expenditure for Loanhead based on 2025 expenditure.

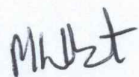
£20,487 is held for Bilston Mission Church (2024: £18,535) which is twenty-six months of expenditure for Bilston based on 2025 expenditure.

These balances will fall significantly in the coming months due to manse refurbishment and window replacement at Bilston.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. Independent Examiner's Report

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

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Support is given to work in Rwanda and to work in Kenya through Project Stedfast.

Achievements and Performances

The union between Loanhead and Bilston has allowed work and worship in both villages to continue, alongside a parish grouping with Roslin Church.

Around 85 attend worship weekly at Loanhead, with a mix of ages, including an average of 12 children and teenagers who take part in the children's activities. This is slightly more than the previous year. Around 8 -15 people attend each week at Bilston Mission Church, which is less than the previous year. There are a further 20 to 25 views of the online service.

Assemblies and work with classes in the three primary schools – Paradykes, Loanhead and Bilston – has continued but has been very limited in 2024. The summer sports camp had over 50 children attending and the group for teenagers on Friday evenings has around 15-20 children.

The numbers involved in regular small groups has grown, with around 25 involved, the Guild at Loanhead has met monthly with around 15 members at each meeting, the Guild at Bilston meets monthly with around 10 members. Uniformed youth organisations have over 100 young people involved. The morning MUMCo group meets fortnightly, and in 2024 had up to 10 mums meeting each session, an increase on the previous year. The new MUMCo evening group has 2 – 6 mums meeting fortnightly.

At Loanhead, the Community Outreach Group is active in providing support to families and individuals in different ways. As part of this, in December, Christmas gifts were distributed to 60 local families. Church members helped with donations for this, with significant support from the wider community and local schools. Food and gifts were also made available to Kilbreck House. Similar support was given to families and individuals at Bilston.

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For Remembrance a Garden was created in the church grounds at Loanhead to allow people to place crosses. This was well supported and appreciated by the community.

The links to support the work of local churches, groups and families in Rwanda continue.

Financial Review

Direct comparisons with 2023 are difficult as the figures for that year in the accounts contain only the 4 months of income and expenditure from Bilston following the union in September 2023.

The principal source of income for the general work is weekly offerings and standing orders paid directly to the bank by members along with donations. Income from these sources remained the same as 2023. Income from fund raising for general purposes was £5,880 – an increase from 2023. Income from hall rent at £9,211 was commensurate with 2023.

Expenditure on most items increased slightly, with the exception of heating and lighting where there was a large increase. A direct comparison in the accounts isn't possible as a very late invoice of £1,500 for 2023 was paid in 2024 and the figure for 2023 only has 3 months of expenditure at Bilston. However the increase was over 35% on top of an increase in 2023.

The deficit for the year on unrestricted funds was £17,035. A major roof repair was completed at a cost of £12,800 which accounts for most of this deficit.

A Stewardship Campaign was held in November 2024, which included making members aware of the financial needs of the congregation and encouraging members to increase their giving.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of four to six months' expenditure excluding designated funds. At the year end the church held unrestricted cash funds of £59,512 (2023: £76,547) This represents six months of expenditure.

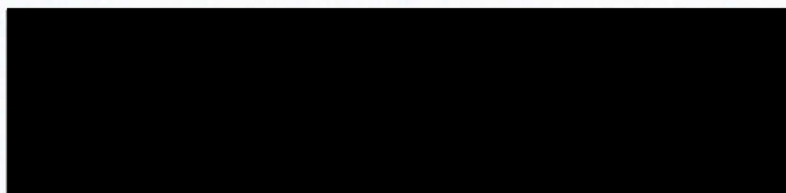
£40,977 of this is held for Loanhead (2023: £57,639) which is five months of expenditure for Loanhead based on 2024 expenditure.

£18,535 is held for Bilston Mission Church (2023: £18,909) which is fifteen months of expenditure for Bilston based on 2024 expenditure.

The Charity's Trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the Trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given in the accounts.

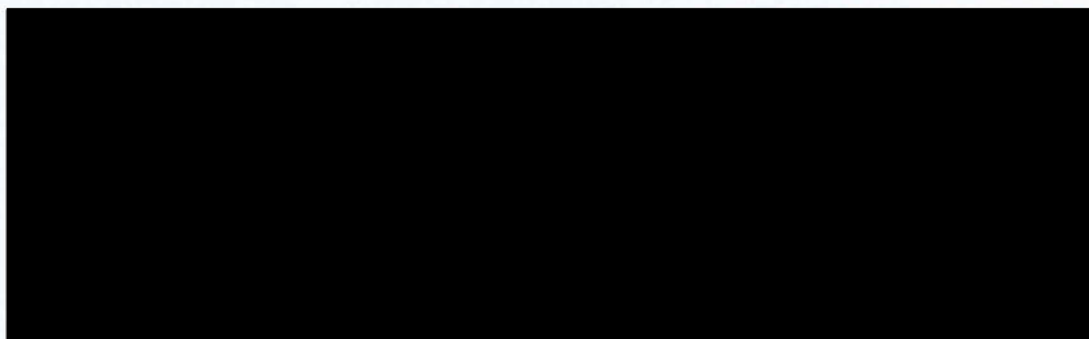
