Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Perth Congregational Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2025 which are set out on pages 1 to 5.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities

Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the 2006 Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Accounts Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity, Perth Congregational Church, is an independent church affiliated to the Congregational Federation. It is governed by its Constitutional Document.

Type of Governing Document

The Constitutional Document is reviewed every five years, and will be reviewed in 2025. The management of the church is by Board of Management, a group of thirteen members. An Annual General meeting, normally held in November or December, both informs members and allows them

to participate in the decision making of the church. There is also a Half Yearly meeting to update members which is held in the Spring.

Trustees Recruitment and Appointment

Trustees are recruited from the Board of Management through nominations. This appointment is approved at the Annual General Meeting.

Additional Guidance

To ensure the safety of the members a yearly church risk assessment is carried out. The Church has a Safeguarding Officer and a policy which has been adopted by members of the church and a Safeguarding team is in place. The policy was updated and approved by the Board of Management.

Objective and Achievements

The Objective of the charity, Perth Congregational Church, is to provide Christian Fellowship and worship. To achieve these objectives the church holds weekly services which meet the spiritual needs of the members.

Statement of the charities policy on reserves

The main income is raised through offerings, donations and rent from the manse. There are both restricted and unrestrictive funds as per the annual accounts of 2025.

Achievements and performance

Our church service held on Sundays is enhanced by those who join the service by telephone link, we can have up to ten members sharing the service in a two-way link. It is wonderful to speak to these members who cannot attend church for whatever reason.

Pastoral visits are made by our minister Rev Dr Gordon Campbell and greatly appreciated by all. There are several activities held within the church. These include refreshments following the church service on a Sunday at the end of each month. This is when there is an opportunity to enjoy meeting others and chat. Monthly coffee mornings take place on the last Saturday morning of each month and numbers are variable. These are open to the public, and we enjoy meeting friends from other churches. A Bible Study Group meets approximately monthly. The two digital screens in the church allow Hymns, photographs, illustrations and information to be shown to the congregation. The President of the Congregational Federation conducted a Sunday morning service October 2024 which was enjoyed by the members. "Lunch Bunch" a group who joined together for a sandwich lunch have decided that they should no longer meet. Instead it is planned that outings, such as visiting the Black Watch Museum and Café take place. Transport will be provided for those with transport difficulties. There is an opportunity to join together for lunch after some of the Sunday services. We have been delighted that the Polish Scout Group were happy to provide some lunches as part of their fundraising efforts. At present there are few young children in the church. We are planning to continue the links with young through the Y.M.C.A. although due to few numbers they are not currently meeting in our church premises. Perth Congregational Church is actively involved with Perth Action of Churches Together and have three representatives. We support Christian Aid, and have representation on their committee. At Christmas (2024) the church was involved with the annual Blythwood Care Shoebox Appeal. The church supports this charity every year. This appeal supplies gifts to needy children, young people and adults in Eastern Europe. Shoeboxes with toys, stationary small clothes and toiletries are filled and donations of money are also made to help with travel costs. Our Harvest Thanksgiving service allows members to decorate the church with flowers, fruit and vegetables to celebrate the harvest. This produce is then donated to the charities Cath's Kitchen which provides food for those in need and to Perth Food Bank. Perth Congregational Church forms part of the Scottish Congregational Fellowship which links churches in Angus,

Aberdeen, Dumfries and Galloway and Dundee. The church continues with its support for Esk Congregational church, which started in Glen Clova, and has met in different places in Angus, but which has not met in person since the Covid-19 lockdown. Esk Church continues to meet monthly by telephone. Perth Congregational Church hall is again being used on a Monday, Tuesday and Friday by a group of Polish Scouts, girl Scouts and Cubs. These are well attended and enjoyed. We have the two Session Clerks, Margaret Doig and Louise Haines who share this important role. We are extremely fortunate to have three talented organists and we are so thankful to have such skilled organists in our congregation. We have a superb organ and it is wonderful to hear it being played during our service. We also have a visiting organist who assists when needed. Several concerts have been held in the church by a group of musicians called Camarata. They have kindly supported our organ fund. This group no longer use our premises for their practise as the group increased in number. One concert included a visiting harpist who was supported by choristers from St Ninian's Cathedral. We continue to raise money for our organ fund as our organ is a very good organ which requires maintenance.

Other information. The church has a General Protection Data policy and an appointed officer to ensure the church complies with the policy. The church's Safe Guarding policy has been developed. This has been approved by the Board of Management. The Trustees declare that they have approved the above Trustees Report for 2025.

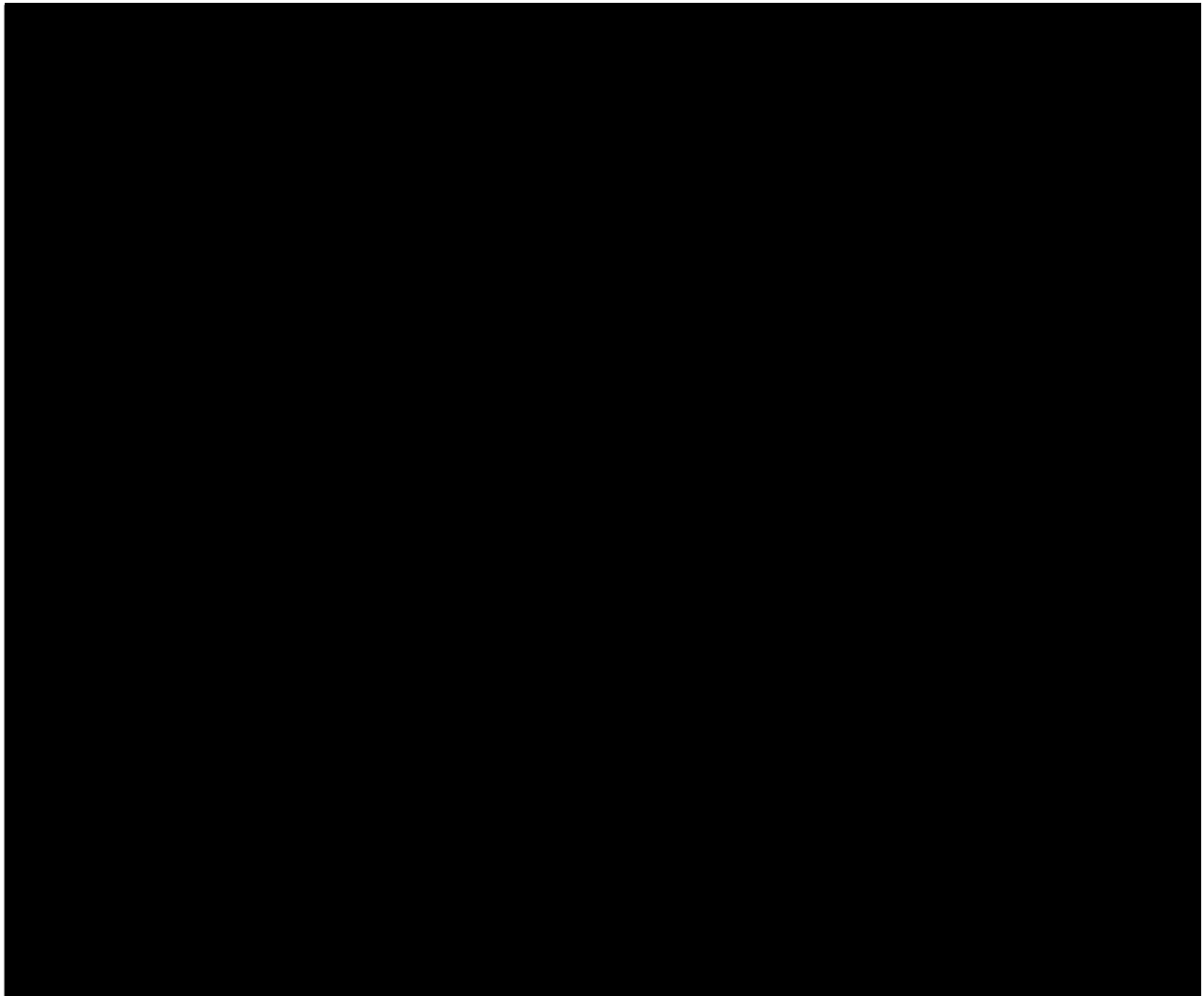

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity, Perth Congregational Church, is an independent church affiliated to the Congregational Federation. It is governed by its Constitutional document.

Type of Governing Document

The Constitutional Document is reviewed every five years, and will be reviewed in 2024

The management of the church is by Board of Management, a group of thirteen members. An Annual General meeting, normally held in November or December, both informs members and allows them to participate in the decision making of the church. There is also a half yearly meeting to update members which is held in the spring.

Trustees Recruitment and Appointment.

Trustees are recruited from the Board of Management through nominations.

This appointment is approved at the Annual General Meeting

Additional Guidance

To ensure the safety of the members a yearly church Risk assessment is carried out.

The Church has a Safeguarding Officer and a policy which has been adopted by members of the church and a Safeguarding team is in place. The policy was updated and approved by the Board of Management.

Objective and Achievements

The Objective of the charity, Perth Congregational Church, is to provide Christian Fellowship and worship.

To achieve these objectives the church holds weekly services which meet the spiritual needs of the members.

Statement of the charities policy on reserves.

The main income is raised through offerings, donation and rent from the manse. There are both restricted and unrestrictive funds as per the annual accounts of 2024.

Achievements and performance.

Our church service held on Sundays is enhanced by those who join the service by telephone link, we can have up to ten members sharing the service in a two- way link. It is great to speak to these members who cannot get to church for whatever reason.

Pastoral visits are made by our minister [REDACTED] and greatly appreciated by all. There are several activities held in the church. These include tea, coffee and biscuits following the church service each month. This is where there is an opportunity to enjoy meeting others and chat.

Monthly coffee mornings take place on a Saturday morning and numbers are variable. These are open to the public, and we enjoy meeting friends from other churches.

A Bible Study Group meets approximately monthly.

The two digital screens in the church allow hymns, photographs, illustrations and information to be shown to the congregation.

We Celebrated 125 Years since the building of Perth Congregational Church with several events. A special service at which we invited many of our elderly and homebound members, as well as visitors from other churches.

A visit is planned by the President of the Congregational Federation in October 2024.

A celebratory lunch is being planned for later in the year in the Royal George Hotel.

“Lunch Bunch” a group who joined together for a sandwich lunch have decided that they should no longer meet. Instead it is planned that outings, such as visiting the Black Watch Museum and café take place. Transport will be provided for those with transport difficulties.

There is an opportunity to join together for lunch after some of the Sunday services. We have been delighted that the Polish Scout Group were happy to provide some lunches as part of their fundraising efforts.

At present there are few young children in the church. We are planning to continue these links with young through the Y.M.C.A. A group of schoolchildren meet in our hall on Monday afternoons. “Legendary Youth” a name they gave themselves. They are supervised by a Y.M.C.A. youth worker who takes care of these enthusiastic young people. This youth worker is jointly funded by the Perth Y.M.C.A. and our church.

Perth Congregational Church is actively involved with Perth Action of Churches Together and have four representatives. We support Christian Aid, and have representation on their committee.

At Christmas (2023) the church was involved with Blythwood Care Shoebox Appeal. This supplies gifts to needy children, young people and adults in Eastern Europe. Shoeboxes with toys, stationary small clothes and toiletries are filled and donations of money are also made to help with travel costs.

Our Harvest Thanksgiving service allows members to decorate the church with flowers, fruit and vegetables to celebrate the harvest. This produce is then donated to the charities –Cath’s Kitchen which provides food for those in need and to Perth Food Bank.

Perth Congregational Church forms part of the Scottish Congregational Fellowship which links churches in Angus Aberdeen, Dumfries and Galloway and Dundee.

The church continues with its support for Esk Congregational church, which started in Glen Clova, and has met in different places in Angus, but which has not met in person since the Covid-19 lockdown. Esk Church continues to meet monthly by telephone.

With our friends in the Scottish Congregational Fellowship we offer fortnightly prayers for those in Ukraine, Russia and all countries which are suffering as a result of conflict. All can join these prayers as this is through a telephone link

Perth Congregational Church hall is again being used on a Monday, Tuesday and Friday by a group of Polish scouts, girl scouts and cubs. These are well attended and enjoyed.

We are delighted to announce the appointment of two new Session Clerks, with [REDACTED] taking over from [REDACTED] who retired last Year. They will share this role.

We are extremely fortunate to have three talented organists. We are so thankful to have such skilled organists in our congregation. We have a superb organ and is it wonderful to hear it being played during our service. We also have a visiting organist who assists when needed.

Several concerts have been held in the church by a group of musicians called Camarata. They have kindly supported our organ fund. This group no longer use our premises for their practise as the group increased in number. One concert included a visiting harpist who was supported by choristers from St Ninian's Cathedral. We continue to raise money for our organ fund as our organ is a very good organ which requires maintenance.

Other information.

The church has a General Protection Data policy and an appointed officer to ensure the church complies with the policy.

The churches Safe Guarding policy has been developed. This has been approved by the Board of Management.
