## Trustees' Report

### for the year ended 31 December 2024

The trustees are pleased to present their annual report and the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) effective from 1 January 2019.

### **Objectives and Activities**

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

To achieve this the church :

- (a) provides for the ordinances of religion to be practised and observed in the parish area
- (b) provides for the baptism and nurture of young people in faith that they might take their place in society as responsible moral people,
- (c) provides support for families who are experiencing ill health or bereavement, conducts funeral services for the dead in the parish area,
- (d) provides a place for young people to belong to organisations like the Scouts or Brownies,
- (e) provides a place for outside bodies to contribute to their community (e.g. Govan Salvation Army who hold a number of concerts to provide help for the people of Govan),
- (f) supports many charities through fundraising efforts (Christian Aid; Preshal Trust, Govan; the Lodging House Mission and Glasgow City Mission ) working with people with enormous social problems; Starter Packs, Govan; Mary's Meals and many more charities working with the disadvantaged and marginalised in our society,
- (g) provides the use of our buildings for the benefit of many cultural groups providing a venue for the Glasgow Chamber Orchestra, Glasgow Orchestral Society and others.

### **Public Benefit**

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

The aims are to provide for the ordinances and Sacraments of the Church to be available within the territorial bounds of our parish allowing people to deal with the major events in their lives such as the birth of a child, a marriage or a death.

#### Achievements and Performance

As a church community we continue to draw young people from elsewhere into our kirk as they seek marriage. The fellowship we provide allows them, after marriage, to continue their association with us without necessarily committing themselves to full membership.

#### Overview

There were four meetings of the Kirk Session and a Stated Annual Meeting of the Congregation held during 2024. An Elders Conference organised by the Membership Care & Development and Discipleship Committee was held in November. The conference aim was to identify ways in which elders' connection with church members could be improved. ██████████ remained as Session Clerk until 24th May when ██████████ took over. There are 35 serving elders. The committee structure developed during 2023 remains in place with the various committees reporting to the Kirk Session.

██████████ continued as minister, however illness during the summer prevented him from performing his usual duties. ██████████ minister of Ibrox Parish Church, our cluster church, conducted some services and assisted with pastoral care where possible. We were also fortunate to have help and advice from the ██████████ who was appointed Interim Moderator for July and August. ██████████ was able to return to limited duties in September and thereafter, when his health improved, he was fully back in post and able to resume a mid-week service in addition to Sunday worship.

██████████ continued as Church Officer during 2024 however she notified us that she would be leaving on 31st December. Interviews for a replacement took place during December and a suitable candidate, Rory Spencer, was employed to start work on 1st January 2025.

We continue to work with Ibrox Parish Church and regularly have joint services. We have a steering group working towards a union in line with the Presbytery Plan

The funding for a Church and Community Outreach Worker was withdrawn from us during the year. This meant that we had to lose ██████████ in June 2024. Her valuable work continues with volunteers now taking over the organisation of Messy Church and Sunday School. ██████████ and the ██████████ ██████████ liaise with Mossspark Primary School. Messy Church continues to be held at Mossspark Bowling Club with Muddy Church held in local parks in the summer when the Bowling Club premises are not available. Attendance varies but the sessions allow for valuable fellowship and connection with Mossspark families. ██████████ was also involved through Faith in the Community with an ecumenical project to welcome Asylum Seekers housed in the GoUrban Hotel. The response to this initiative was poor but it is hoped that this will improve as time goes on. A volunteer will be needed to continue ██████████ involvement. The Parent and Toddler group led by ██████████ has been suspended until there are more volunteers.

██████████ continues as Organist and Director of Music. His musicianship and development of the choir greatly enhances worship. In addition to Sunday worship ██████████ organises special music for Easter and Christmas and is responsible for a very well received ecumenical Carols by Candlelight service.

The Roll as of 31st December 2024 stood at 276. During the year 8 members were added by restoration or resolution of the Kirk Session. There were 6 deaths and 4 members removed by certificate of transference, 3 baptisms, 1 blessing and 6 funerals. The average number of worshipers was around 150.

#### ***Church Life***

We recognise that good communication and fellowship are very important to the life of the church.

Our efforts to achieve good communication include a regularly updated website, two WhatsApp Groups, a Facebook presence and a quarterly newsletter. Online worship continues to be available to those unable to attend church with around 150 subscribers to the live stream and an average of around 75 views.

Fellowship is greatly enhanced by the outstanding work of members of the Social Committee and the Coffee Team who provide tea and coffee after worship every week, the Easter Breakfast and the Christmas Lunch. They also contribute to special events such as the Church Ceilidh, the Plant Sale, the Advent Fayre and the Mince Pies & Mulled Wine social gathering after Carols by Candlelight.

The Women's Group meets monthly from September to June. This is well supported with a varied programme. A Coffee Morning in February raised well over £1,000 for the Hospice in 2024. There is an annual dinner in June which is enjoyed by ladies from the church and the local area. The Guild meets weekly from September to June in the Harvest Church in Mosspark. The meetings follow the standard Church of Scotland programme which includes a hymn and a prayer in addition to a speaker or entertainment.

Badminton continues on Monday evenings with church and non-church players participating.

The AM Chorus, a Community Choir led by [REDACTED] is very popular with over 30 members from the church and the local area. They enjoy weekly sessions of joyful singing followed by coffee and fellowship and are happy to augment the church choir at Christmas and Easter worship.

Fellowship is front and centre of Soup and Chat, a monthly gathering of up to about 25 people enjoying delicious soup and lively company.

The Yarn Stormers are a group of ladies who undertake various knitting challenges creating interesting displays and knitted decorations for sale at the Advent Fayre.

All these groups offer a tremendous opportunity for outreach and fellowship and are to be commended.

#### ***Finance and Property***

The Fundraising Committee have developed several new initiatives designed to raise money for the church. These include a suggestion that members add a codicil to their wills leaving money to the church. A letter to this effect has been sent out to members. Other new fundraising projects which have been implemented include the Advent Fayre in November, sale of Church Christmas cards and Advent Calendars and a joint Ceilidh with the Scouts. These initiatives and the annual Plant Sale have successfully raised money for the church.

The Property Committee, in addition to regular maintenance work on the church and manse, oversaw the installation an Accessible Toilet in the halls. The work was completed over the summer on budget and on time and enhances facilities in the hall.

Demand for Hall and Sanctuary bookings remain high with many orchestras, groups and local people using our facilities. This is a good source of income.

Local charities supported by the church include the Lodging House Mission, Glasgow City Mission, Preshal Trust and Christian Aid.

#### **Financial Review**

Total income for the year was £219,572 (PY - £218,703). This included £9,946 which was generated as specific fund raising in relation to the development of an accessible toilet situated within the church halls.

Expenditure in the year amounted to £222,105 (PY - £221,795). This included an increase of £6,155 in fabric repairs and maintenance (which included the expenditure on the accessible toilet project of £16,768) and an increase in staff costs of £3,774 due to having a full complement of staff in the year. Offsetting these increases was a welcome reduction in energy costs down £11,607 to £19,334.

The net out-turn, before any gains on investments, was a small deficit of £2,533 (PY – deficit £3,092). During the year, the congregation sold some of its investments (at a small gain on the opening valuation of £582 (PY – gain £705) to generate cash for general use purposes. The remaining investment holdings increased in value by £25,191 with the overall out-turn being an increase in funds for the year of £23,240 (PY - £18,003).

#### **Investment Policy and Performance**

The congregation holds short term investments, mainly in Church of Scotland Growth units with the aim of preserving and growing this capital over the medium-term and to generate income annually. The total direct investment at cost in Church of Scotland units at 31 December 2024 amounts to £220,118 (PY - £227,884) and at a valuation of £292,223 (PY - £276,453).

#### **Risk Management**

All major risks have been reviewed and systems or procedures have been established to manage those risks. The major financial risk to which the charity is exposed as identified by the trustees is a general or sudden lowering of donated income caused by the loss of older members.

The congregation receives significant donations from a number of members along with the associated gift aid commitments which go a long way to cover the annual expenditure. The Trustees consider the loss of such income to be a material risk and have introduced a medium-term reserves policy for building up funds of a further six to twelve months' expenditure in excess of the reserves required for normal annual expenditure as part of its medium to long-term strategic plan. The Trustees are also developing a longer-term strategy to generate and build reserves.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The Trustees are aware of their obligation to plan the charity's expenditure and manage its reserves in order to maintain the long-term financial viability of the Church.

The Church has free reserves, (that is those funds not tied up in property and restricted funds) of £333,009 at 31 December 2023 (PY- £299,072). It is the Trustees' primary policy to hold unrestricted free reserves of between nine and twelve months' normal annual expenditure to allow for any sudden unexpected decline in income. The current reserves exceed the principal primary reserves policy for the reasons set out above under "Risk Management".

The Trustees also have a Consolidated Fabric Fund reserve held by the Church of Scotland General Trustees of £248,388 an increase of £20,000 over the previous year (PY- £228,388). This reserve is not included in the Balance sheet. The increase is after drawing out the income generated in the year from the fund of £5,611 (PY - £5,032). The Trustees are planning for the medium-term use of the Consolidated Fabric Fund in maintaining and enhancing the fabric of the church.

The Trustees consider the current level of free reserves adequate considering the annual, normal recurring expenditure levels of around £222,000 along with the balance of reserves required to manage the medium-term risks. They consider the level of reserves held by the General Trustees should be adequate to cover any non-recurring expenditure of a capital nature to maintain the church and manse fabric.

#### **Structure, Governance and Management**

The congregation is a registered charity number SC015155 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

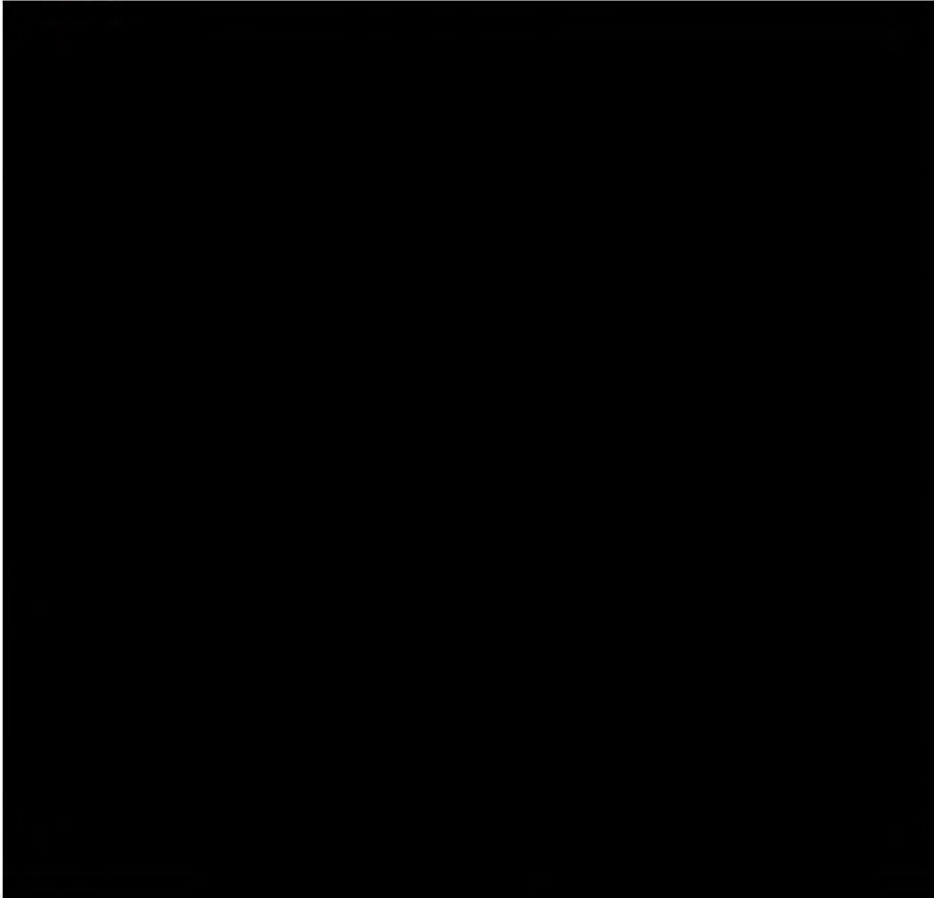

### Trustees' Responsibilities in Relation to the Financial Statements

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Although the income of the Trust is below £250,000, the Trustees have decided to prepare financial statements on a fully accrued basis as they consider this best represents the financial position of the charity.

The law applicable to charities in Scotland requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which show a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, of the charity for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the method and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operational existence.

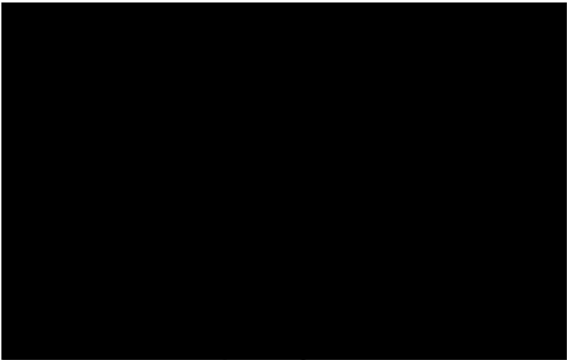
### Basis of independent examiner's statement

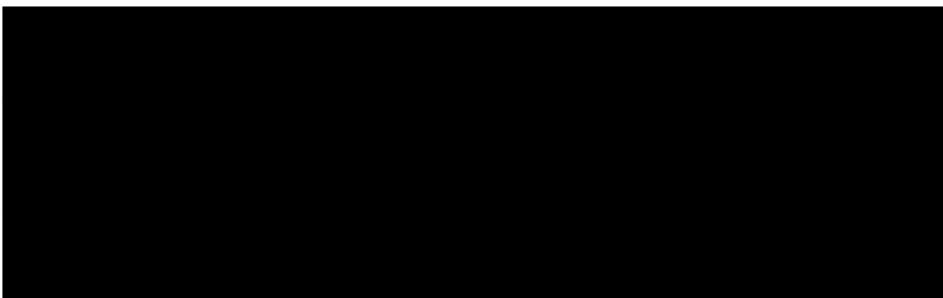

### **Accounting Policies**

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently in the current and preceding year in dealing with items which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

#### **Basis of preparation**

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to reflect the inclusion of investments and the manse at market value, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards, Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). The Charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102.

#### **Fund accounting**

Funds are classified as either restricted funds or unrestricted funds, defined as follows.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the charity.

Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income there from is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the charity's objects. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. The designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

#### **Going concern**

The Trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the ability of the charity to continue for the foreseeable future, and therefore has adopted the going concern basis in preparing these financial statements.

#### **Income recognition**

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally on notification of interest paid or payable by the bank. Dividends on investments are recognised once the dividend has been declared and notification has been received of the dividend due.

On receipt, donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income on the basis of the value of the gift to the charity which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay to obtain services or facilities of equivalent economic benefit on the open market; a corresponding amount is then recognised as expenditure in the period of receipt.

In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS102) the general volunteer time of congregation members is not recognised.

## Accounting Policies

### Expenditure recognition

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. All expenses including support costs and governance costs are allocated or apportioned to the applicable expenditure headings.

The Charity is not registered for VAT and expenditure therefore includes irrecoverable input VAT.

### Fixed Assets

The charity has the right to occupy and use for its charitable objects certain tangible fixed assets, including the Church and halls, vested in the Church of Scotland General Trustees. No consideration is payable for the use of these assets. Expenditure incurred on the repair and maintenance of these assets is charged as resources expended in the Statement of Financial Activities in the period in which the liability arises.

The manse which is vested in Local Trustees is included at market value as estimated by the Trustees.

All other fixed assets costing in excess of £1,000 having a value to the charity greater than one year, other than those acquired for specific purposes, are capitalised.

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis to write off the cost or initial value, less residual value, of tangible fixed assets over their estimated useful lives.

### Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. Unrealised gains and losses represent the difference between the market value at the beginning and end of the financial year or, if purchased in the year, the difference between cost and market value at the end of the year. Realised gains and losses represent the difference between the proceeds on disposal and the market value at the start of the year or cost if purchased in the year.

### Taxation

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review, the minimum stipend was £31,642 and the maximum stipend (in the fifth and subsequent years) was £38,884.

**8 Trustee Remuneration and Related Party Transactions**

During the year one trustee (the minister) received reimbursement of expenses incurred in respect of Council Tax, travel and other expenses totalling £8,700 (2023 - £9,152). In addition, the Minister's daughter received £16,123 (2023 - £5,454) for fulfilling the duties of Church Officer and his son received £462 (2023 - £461) for providing support for events run on the church premises.

No trustee or person related to a trustee had any personal interest in any contract or transaction entered into by the charity during the year other than those disclosed above.

During the year a total of £56,328 (2023 - £51,970) was donated to the congregation by trustees.

**9 Volunteers**

In common with all congregations of the Church of Scotland the congregation benefits from the contribution made by volunteers who give their time and talents willingly for the benefit of the Church. The areas of congregational life which rely on the contribution of volunteers are many and varied and much of the activity would be unable to continue were it not for the commitment shown.
