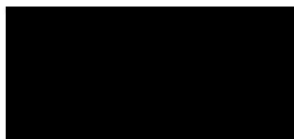

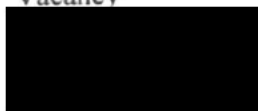

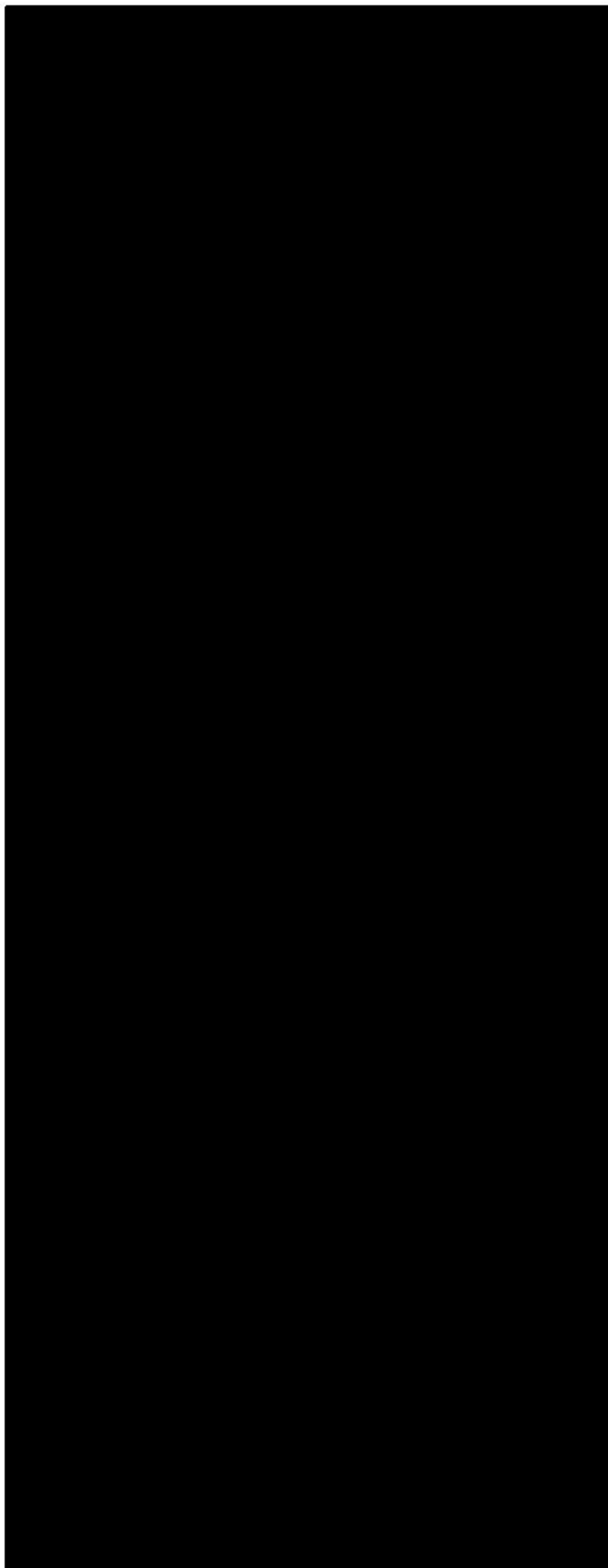

Structure, Governance and Management
Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Model Deed of Constitution.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills.

The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. The Congregational Board is appointed from within the congregation and members of the congregation are invited to nominate individuals who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management affairs of the Church, to become members of the Board. Board Members are then appointed at the Stated Annual Meeting and serve for a period of three years after which they must seek re-election at the next Stated Annual Meeting.

Organisational Structure

The Congregational Board is chaired by the minister and normally meets six to eight times a year. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee, and the Property Committee as appropriate. The Kirk Session which normally meets seven times a year is responsible for the spiritual affairs within the church. The congregation is kept updated through the quarterly Church Magazine which is delivered to all the households in the congregation and includes a Finance Report.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in policy. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Public Worship is normally held in Gairloch every Sunday at 10:30am, and on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month at Badeaul at 10.30am. and at Aultbea at 5pm.

Each Wednesday "Community Bible Study" meetings take place, in Gairloch Hall on the first Wednesday of the month, and online on other weeks, shared with Gairloch, Kinlochewe and Torridon Free Church. "Pins n' Needles" for crafters, meet regularly midweek. Shared Sunday morning services are held on the 5th Sunday of a month, and midweek Mission Meetings are also held on an occasional basis when speakers visit. Regular Sunday services at Isle View care home are shared with other congregations.

Achievements and Performance

During 2024 Sunday services continued in the church buildings. Morning services were also broadcast on Facebook and YouTube for those unwilling or unable to join in person. A Daily Podcast following the Scripture Union Wordlive Bible readings has been shared each morning Monday to Saturday in partnership with the Free Church. Contact with Members and Adherents for Pastoral Care has been maintained through telephone calls and visits. The congregation also ran a "Healing Hurting Hearts" course, a weekly meeting of the Project Linus group, and the annual packing and distribution of the Christmas community food hampers.

During the year the Kirk Session has spent considerable time discussing the implications of the new Presbytery Plan for ministry in the area.

Financial Review

Total income increased from £68,822 to £90,705 of which £26,400 came from a share of funds passed over when the parish boundary changed. Regular donations, WFO, Gift Aid before tax recovery, and Open Plate donations remained almost the same at £48,227 compared with £48,255 for 2024.

Expenditure was down from £68,352 to £60,204 mostly accounted for by a reduction in fabric and maintenance expenditure.

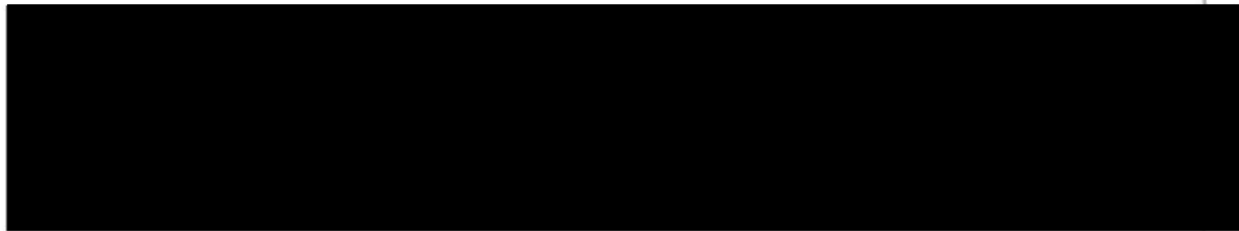
Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately 9/12 months' expenditure excluding designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £125,709 (2023 £94,897) of which £12,526 is Designated for Fabric and £503 for the Benevolent Fund. There are £3,287 of Restricted Funds in the Prayer Fellowship Fund for distribution for mission work.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session/Congregational Board must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session/Congregational Board are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Examiners' Report to the Trustees of West Ross Church of Scotland

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024 which are set out on pages 6 to 11.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiners

The charity's trustees are responsible for preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is our responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to our attention.

Basis of independent examiners' statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently we do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

Independent examiners' statement

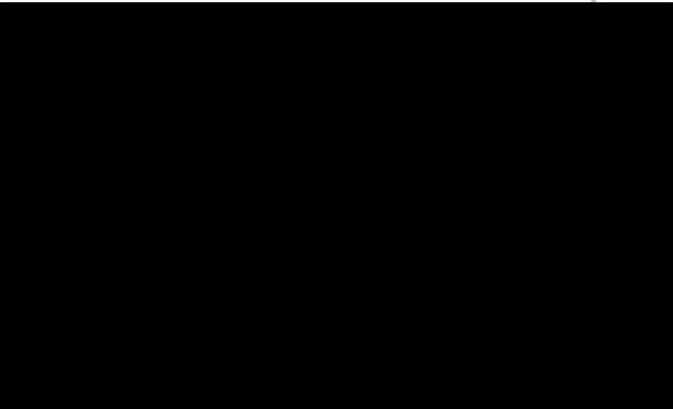

Purposes of Designated Funds

Fabric Fund: The Trustees transfer into this fund for the maintenance of the Church properties.

Benevolent Fund: Is there to meet any special needs within the parish.

Purposes of Restricted Funds

Prayer Fellowship Fund: Is used to support missionary work.

Purposes of Endowment Funds

Income from the Abercrombie Bequest: Is transferred to the General Fund for general church purposes.

2 Minister's Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £30,135 and the maximum stipend in 5th and subsequent years of service £37,032.
