Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the Church and are chosen from those members of the Church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. No new trustees were elected during the year. There are currently eight trustees. All Trustees have undertaken Safeguarding Training.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is chaired by the minister and meets approximately eight times in a year. Certain responsibilities are delegated to various elders: Worship & Education, Fabric & Finance, Social & Fellowship and Mission & Outreach.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

Services of Worship, Easter Experience, Harvest Experience, Occasional Primary School Assemblies, Monthly Lochbroom House Services, Warm & Cosy, Blether & Brew, Curry Night, Fabulous Fridays, Supper Club, Intergenerational Activities, Weekly Community Prayer Meetings, Christmas Tree Festival, Holiday Summer Club, Ullapool Super-kids, Ceilidh Dancing, Home and Hospital Visitations and managing the Hospital Car Scheme and volunteer drivers.

Printed: Weekly Service Sheets (including A3 version for those living with Dementia, Autism, Sight difficulties). A Quarterly Parish Newsletter is also published.

Year Ended 31 December 2025

Financial Review

Our income this year has increased slightly, in spite of the curtailment of regular fund-raising. We are, however, grateful to those members who have continued to support the Church through regular giving.

The Hospital Car Scheme is continuing well, thanks to generous donations of £1,571.65 during the year, and also the donation of time by volunteer drivers. This is a great community asset.

Other donations and income included donations from visitors to the Christmas Tree Festival, Curry Night, Tanera and the Unlimited Colour Company.

Collections for African Inland Missions (Kenya) for Sally & Joseph amounted to £1,397 during the year.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately six months' expenditure including designated funds. At the end of the year the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £26,910 of which £2,274 had been designated to the Fabric Fund. The remaining balance represents more than six months' expenditure at current levels.

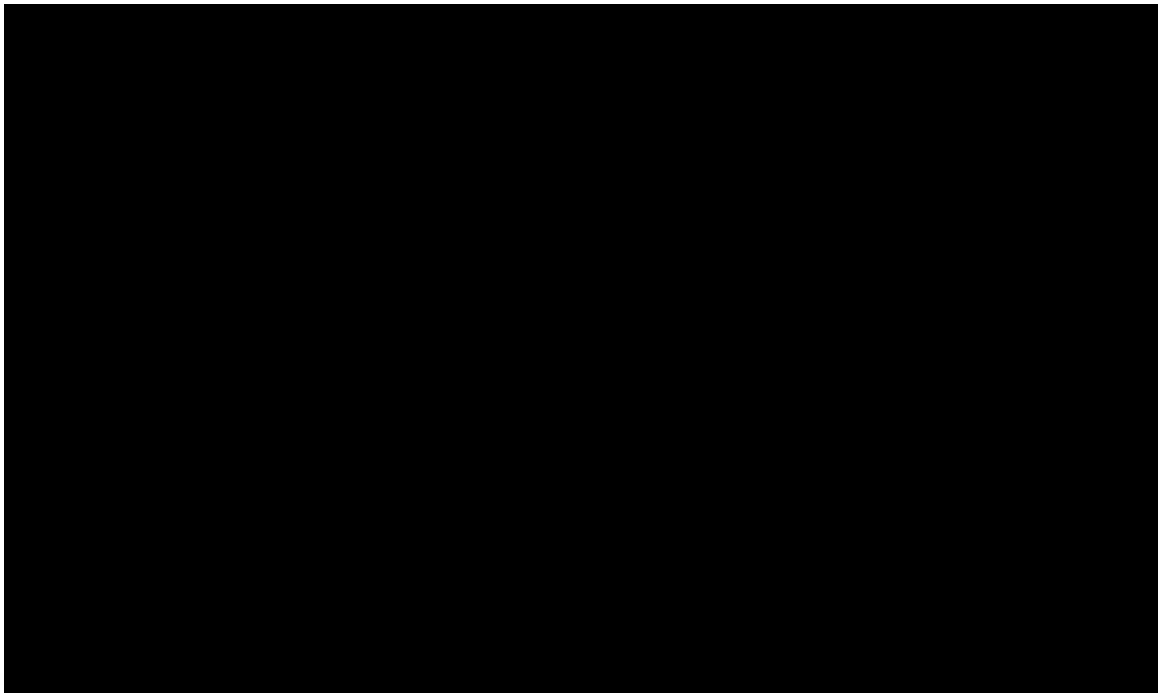
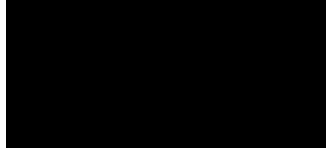

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Achievements and Performance

Like many churches, our attendance figures are still down, having lost members and adherents due to death; change of heart; moving away and getting used to the comfortable way of accessing Worship on-line at home. However, it is worthy of note that we are overjoyed to see children in Church on most Sundays, and we are still reaching up to 300+ viewers some weeks, with our service being watched across the globe! We continue to record and film our services each week when possible.

Due to new accounting procedures introduced by the Church of Scotland, we currently have 12 Members on the Communion Roll, 8 Members on the Supplementary Roll and 19 involved in the Life of the Congregation. During the year, there were two baptisms, two weddings and five funerals.

Ongoing Presbytery reorganization leaves Lochbroom & Ullapool Parish Church in a good place, as Session Members fought valiantly for the Church, letting folk know about all the vibrant activities and initiatives taking place in our Church and local community.

Following regional reorganization, as from January 1st 2024, we became part of the new enlarged and United Presbytery of the Highlands and Islands – Clèir Eilean Ì.

God is really working in this place and throughout the community. A small but faithful Prayer Group meets every Tuesday morning. The Parish HUB project and the Hospital Car Scheme, both initiated by our church, continue to help many throughout the community.

Financial Review

Our income this year has fallen slightly, but generous donations from public events have increased. We are continually grateful to those members who have continued to support the Church through regular giving.

The Hospital Car Scheme is continuing well, thanks to generous donations of £614 during the year, and also the donation of time by volunteer drivers. This is a great community asset.

Other donations and income included donations from visitors to the Christmas Tree Festival, Easter Fun Day, Thanksgiving Dinner & Curry Night, however income from Hall lettings has decreased.

Collections for African Inland Missions (Kenya) for [REDACTED] amounted to £1,251 during the year.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately six months' expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted cash funds of £26,017 of which £1,417 had been designated for the fabric fund. The remaining balance of £24,600 represents about eight months' expenditure.

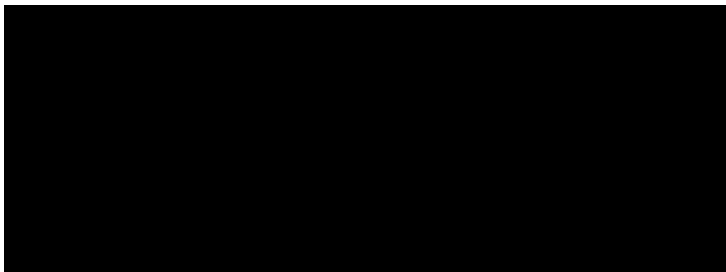
