Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC016043 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

As per the Presbytery Mission Plan, a full-time Associate Minister's post was advertised and filled with the successful applicant commencing January 2026.

The trustees present their report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is chaired by the minister and meets 8 times in a year. The Kirk Session is responsible for all affairs, spiritual and temporal, of the church, however certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond.

The main service of worship is held each Sunday, at 11 am, in Torry. Regular services are also held, on Sundays at 10.00 am, in Kincorth Community Centre. These services are led by Elders. A regular mid-week service is also held in Deeview Court Neurological Care Home in Kincorth. These services are led by the Minister and volunteers.

Achievements and Performance

The following groups and organisations meet and enjoy fellowship within the church community - Parents and Toddlers - Monday morning, Bowlers - Tuesday afternoon, The Guild - every 2nd Tuesday evening, Bible Study - Thursday on line, Mens Group - every 2nd Thursday afternoon, Music and Drama group - Friday evening and Sunday afternoon, Monthly Coffee Mornings - last Saturday of the month, weekly Zoom Prayer Meeting - Wednesday, weekly Zoom Bible Study - Thursday mornings, Friendship cafe - second Monday monthly.

A number of activities which previously took place in South St Nicholas Church, now meet in Kincorth Community Centre. There is no convenient public transport link between Kincorth and Torry, so alternative accommodation had to be found to allow these thriving groups to continue. The groups include Boys' Brigade, Girls' Brigade, Rainbows and a Craft Group. These groups come under the auspices of Aberdeen South Church.

In addition, the Church Hall is occasionally used for local school activities and the local school Assemblies and end of term services are held in the Church. The Church also makes its facilities available to outside organisations both as an outreach and to provide funding for its ongoing work.

Financial Review

The principal source of income in the General Fund comes from the weekly offerings specified in three categories:

- 1 Free Will Offering – Gift Aided
- 2 Free Will Offering
- 3 Open plate

Most members give their offering through the weekly envelopes, with some giving by standing order and a few prefer to give through the Open Plate.

The major sources of income mentioned above raised £72,345 for the year to 31 December 2025 (2024 £54,412). Other income including legacies, receipts from general trustees, fundraising events and rental of church premises brought in £60,722 for the year to to 31 December 2025 (2024 £152,734). The weekly Sunday offerings are insufficient to cover expenses.

Receipts and Payments showed a deficit of £34,909 for the year to 31 December 2025 (2024 surplus £146,526).

Reserves Policy

The charity trustees have considered the reserves required and have taken into account their current and future liabilities. It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately 3 months expenditure including designated funds. At 31 December 2025 the Church held unrestricted funds of £103,479 of which £81,855 had been designated for fabric fund. The remaining balance of £21,625 represents about 3 months' normal expenditure which is satisfactory.

The church also held £8,663 of restricted funds.

Risk Management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those relating to finances.

With an ageing congregation both nationally and locally within the Church of Scotland, the ability to continue to raise to the overall work of the national Church is important. In line with the guidance from the Church of Scotland, the

Trustees' Responsibilities in Relation to the Financial Statements

The charity trustees are responsible for preparing a trustees' annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in Scotland requires the charity trustees to prepare financial statements for each year which show a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources, of the charity for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the method and principles in the applicable Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operational existence.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.


Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

5 Minister's Stipend

Ministers are entitled to a stipend to release them to discharge the duties of their calling to Parish Ministry. The stipend rate is set annually by the Assembly Trustees on the recommendation of the Faith Action Programme, with the National Stipend Scale being published annually in the Report of the Faith Action Programme to the General Assembly.

The National Stipend Scale is a five-point scale. Parish Ministers move up one point on the scale after each of the first five years of their ministry and then remain on point 5 of the scale.

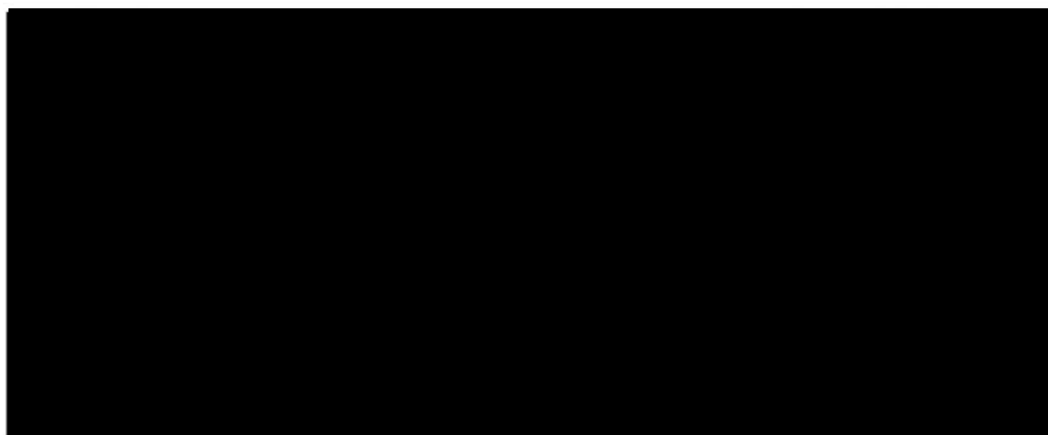

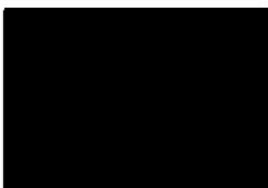

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC016043 and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The charity was formed following the union of Torry St Fitticks Parish Church and South St Nicholas Kincorth Church.

The former South St Nicholas church building closed on 21st July 2024, and the former Torry St Fitticks church building became the main centre of worship for Aberdeen South Church. The Minister of the former South St Nicholas church retired on 15th August 2024 and the Minister of the former Torry St Fitticks Church is the Minister for the new United charge. As per the Presbytery Mission Plan, a full-time MDS (Ministries Development Staff) Parish Assistant's post is currently being advertised, and a part-time MDS Youth and Family Worker has been appointed (to commence 1st February 2025).

The trustees present their report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024. On 1 September 2024 the charity was formed out of a merger between Torry St Fitticks Parish Church and South St Nicholas Kincorth Church to form Aberdeen South Church of Scotland. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Other income including legacies, receipts from general trustees, fundraising events and rental of church premises brought in £152,734 for the year to to 31 December 2024 (2023 £9,859). The weekly Sunday offerings are insufficient to cover expenses.

As a consequence of the union of Torry St Fitticks Parish Church and South St Nicholas Kincorth Church on 31 August 2024, on 1 September 2024 Torry St Fitticks Church donated its cash balances (£24,049) and investments (£18,215) to the new combined Aberdeen South Church of Scotland. These amounts are shown as income in the Receipts and Payments Account.

Receipts and Payments showed a surplus of £146,526 for the year to 31 December 2024 (2023 surplus £10,260).

Reserves Policy

The charity trustees have considered the reserves required and have taken into account their current and future liabilities. It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately 3 months expenditure including designated funds. At 31 December 2024 the Church held unrestricted funds of £141,483 of which £83,093 had been designated for fabric fund. The remaining balance of £58,390 represents about 9 months' expenditure which is highly satisfactory.

The church also held £8,832 of restricted funds.

Risk Management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those relating to finances.

With an ageing congregation both nationally and locally within the Church of Scotland, the ability to continue to raise to the overall work of the national Church is important. In line with the guidance from the Church of Scotland, the

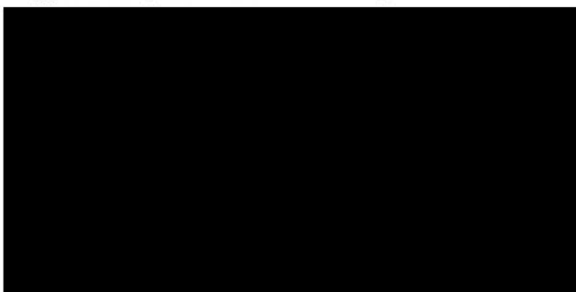

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended). They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

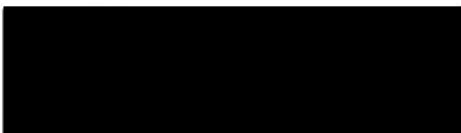
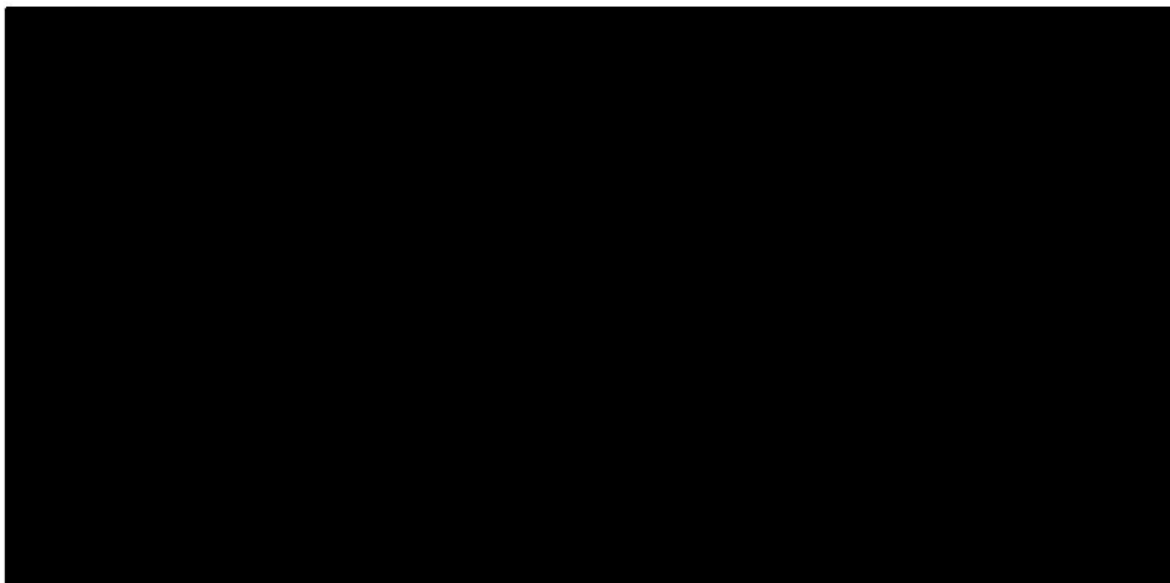

5 Minister's Stipend

Ministers are entitled to a stipend to release them to discharge the duties of their calling to Parish Ministry. The stipend rate is set annually by the Assembly Trustees on the recommendation of the Faith Action Programme, with the National Stipend Scale being published annually in the Report of the Faith Action Programme to the General Assembly.

The National Stipend Scale is a five-point scale. Parish Ministers move up one point on the scale after each of the first five years of their ministry and then remain on point 5 of the scale.
