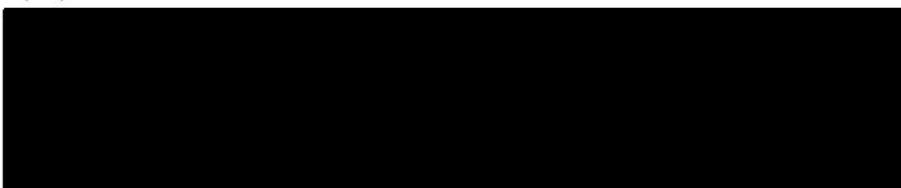

Some of the activities during the course of the year were: parties, bingo, dances, quizzes, singing, exercises, day trips, dining out on special occasions, refreshments and special events at Easter, Halloween and Christmas. There was also a trip to Nethy Bridge during the year which was a great success and enjoyed by a number of members.

We continue, through these activities, to support our members' physical and mental well-being, help to decrease isolation, and fund raise for other charities. Members are able to make new friends through the club.

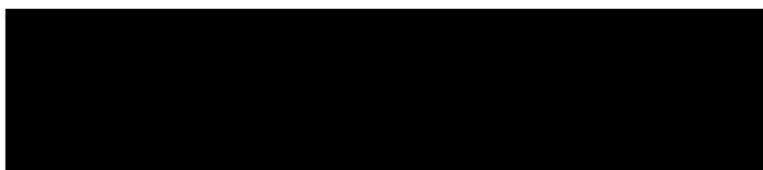
Trustee Remuneration and Expenses

**Independent examiner's report to the Trustees of the Dunoon Senior
Citizen's Club SC020257**

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.
