Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The charity is governed by its constitution which was adopted on the 7th November 2005. The organisation was granted charitable status by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator on the 22nd February 1993. Trustees' elected governance is identified within the constitution, which is circulated and freely available to the members, and especially the trustees, for information and guidance in the management of Enable Falkirk & District Branch.

The charity is a member of Enable Scotland, a charity registered in Scotland (number SC278976).

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The management committee are the charity's trustees. Membership of the management committee is open to all members of the organisation. The members of the management committee, who are the trustees, are elected at the Annual General Meeting. Under the constitution, there must be a minimum of three and no more than fifteen elected trustees. The trustees may at any time appoint any member to the committee as circumstances arise, up to the maximum number of trustees.

Trustees are nominated and elected on an annual basis at the AGM, with current Committee Members and Trustees standing down at the AGM, with a view to re-election if so nominated and agreed. Continuity of on-going committee membership is encouraged and balanced with the support of new members to the committee.

The management committee may delegate any of their powers to any subcommittee consisting of two or more management committee members and such other persons (if any) as the management committee may determine; they may also delegate to the chair of the association (or the holder of any other post) such of their powers as they may consider appropriate.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

Enable Falkirk & District Branch is constituted to promote the welfare of children and adults with a learning disability within the Falkirk and District area including meeting their needs and the development of their capabilities all in furtherance of the objectives of Enable Scotland.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Enable Falkirk & District Branch continues to deliver numerous activities for the benefit of members to meet and learn in familiar, friendly and safe environment.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The 2024–2025 financial year has been another impactful period for Enable Falkirk Branch, marked by continued community engagement, facility improvements, and meaningful support for individuals with disabilities.

Social Clubs & Events

- Our Tuesday Night Club continued to welcome around 70 members each week, while the Wednesday Night Club maintained 50 regular attendees, providing vital social opportunities.
- Awakening The Nightclub remained a highlight, attracting over 100 people with disabilities each month, offering a vibrant and inclusive space for entertainment.
- Our 5th Awakening Festival built on previous success, welcoming over 750 attendees to Falkirk Stadium for a day of live music, entertainment, and community celebration.
- Our summer BBQ was once again free for all attendees, with 130 people enjoying the event, catered professionally at a cost of £800.
- We proudly subsidised pantomime tickets for members and their families, maintaining a £5 per person cost for performances at Dobbie Hall Larbert in November 2024.
- Our Christmas Sparkle Ball returned to the Leapark Hotel in Grangemouth in December 2024, with ticket costs subsidised by 50% to reduce the price to members to £15.
- As always, we celebrated major holidays throughout the year with themed evenings for Burns Night, Easter, Halloween, and St Andrew's Night—all well attended and enthusiastically enjoyed.

Financial & Operational Changes

- The hourly let price remained at £17 per hour, following the adjustment in April 2024 to ensure financial sustainability.
- The annual membership fee continued at £5 per year, supporting access to all services.

Volunteer Achievements & Recognition

- Volunteers continued to uphold high standards of care and hospitality, with ongoing training and support.
- Enable Falkirk's leadership and volunteers were recognised locally for their dedication and impact.

Donations & Community Support

We are deeply grateful for the generous contributions that have helped sustain and grow our work:

- A defibrillator was kindly donated by the Falkirk Soroptimists, enhancing safety and emergency preparedness at the Centre.
- Continued support from local individuals and organisations has helped us maintain and expand our offerings.

Maintenance Projects

Maintaining and improving Elgin Park remains a priority. This year, several key projects were completed:

- The main hall floor was refurbished by Lewis Flooring, improving safety and comfort for all users.
- The café roof was professionally repaired, ensuring a dry and welcoming space for members and guests.
- Our pool table was repaired, restoring a popular activity for social club evenings.
- Additional joinery and general maintenance tasks were carried out as needed.

Achievements and performance *Continued*

Through dedicated volunteers, strong leadership, and unwavering community support, Enable Falkirk Branch continues to grow—offering essential social experiences, a safe and inclusive environment, and lasting impact for individuals with disabilities. We look forward to another successful year ahead.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

Our main source of funding continues to be from donations and fundraising. We will continue to explore all avenues of fundraising to allow the organisation to continue to offer the range of activities that we have undertaken in the past.

The trustees' policy is to maintain reserves at around 6 to 9 months of normal running costs in order to meet commitments and to cover any unexpected expenditure.

Other optional information

The management committee continually reviews procedures, including financial controls, and is satisfied that controls and protocols put in place provide protection for the assets of the Branch with the financial position being monitored on a frequent and robust basis.
