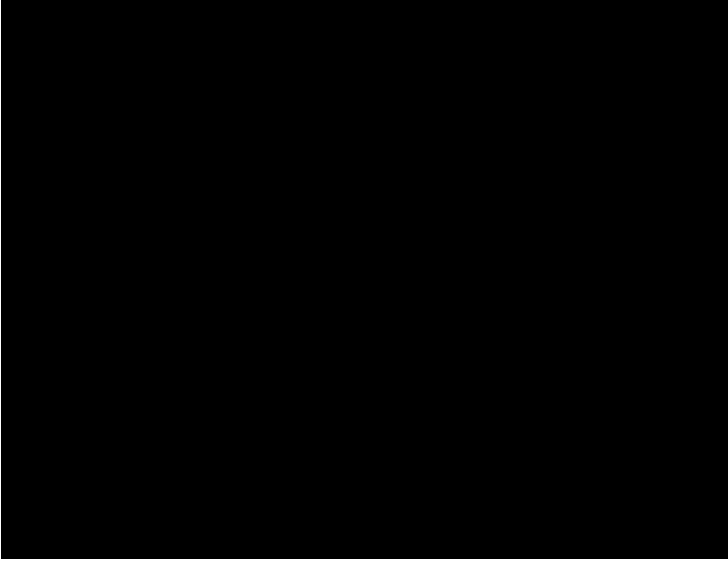

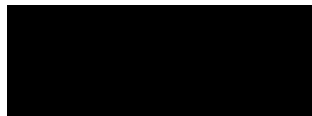

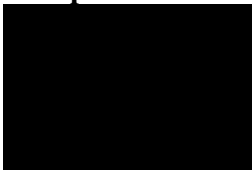

Trustees' Annual Report, Year ended 31 December 2024

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form).

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session are the charity trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts, skills and commitment to contribute to the management of the affairs of the church. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery.

Organisational Structure

The Kirk Session is chaired by the minister and meets two or more times in a year receiving an up to date financial report on each occasion. The Kirk Session is also responsible for spiritual affairs within the church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. The congregation of West Cowal meets together for various activities including, services of worship, bible study, social events and community activities.

Achievements and Performance

This is the second year of the new congregation of West Cowal, which was created from a Union of the three former congregations of Kilfinan, Kilmodan & Colintrave, and Kyles. A new congregational number was created and the charity number of the former Kilmodan and Colintrave Church was retained. The main achievements were the integration of the mission, finances and buildings into the new congregation.

Financial Review

The principal sources of income are from congregational offerings. The ordinary offerings were maintained despite the move to the new congregation. Investment income reflected the volatility in the markets during the year. The minister's travelling expenses are met by the Augusta Lamont Bequest.

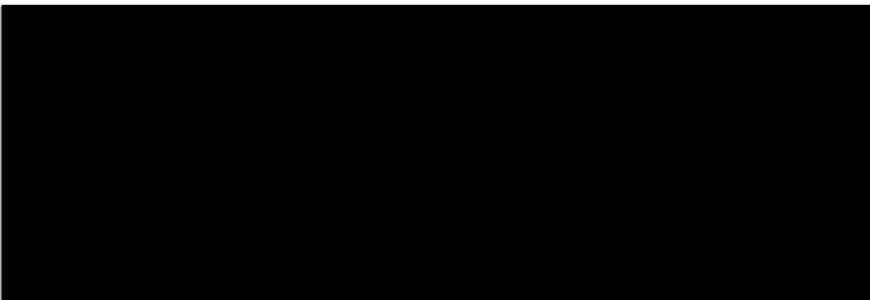
Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately two months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held cash funds of £46,773 of which £10,000 is being held for special initiatives. The remaining balance represents about 6 months ordinary expenditure.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities, Year ended 31 December 2024

The members of the Kirk Session must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Basis of Independent Examiners Statement

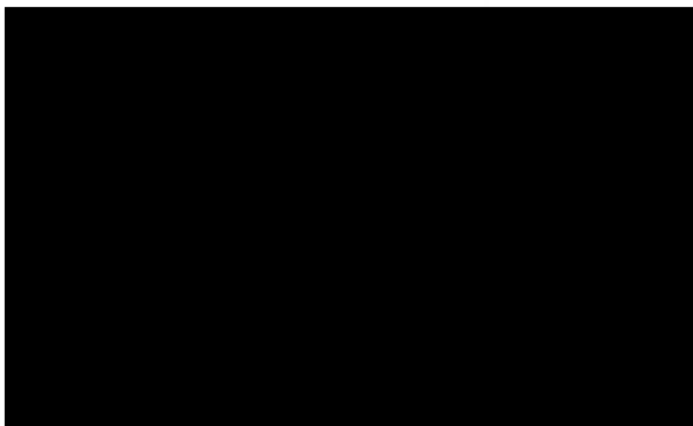

Independent Examiners Statement

In the course of my examination of the statement of the accounts for the year ended 31st December 2024 no matter came to my attention and to the best of my knowledge and ability the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006.

During the year the Trustees do not appear to have used reserves to pay for ordinary expenditure.

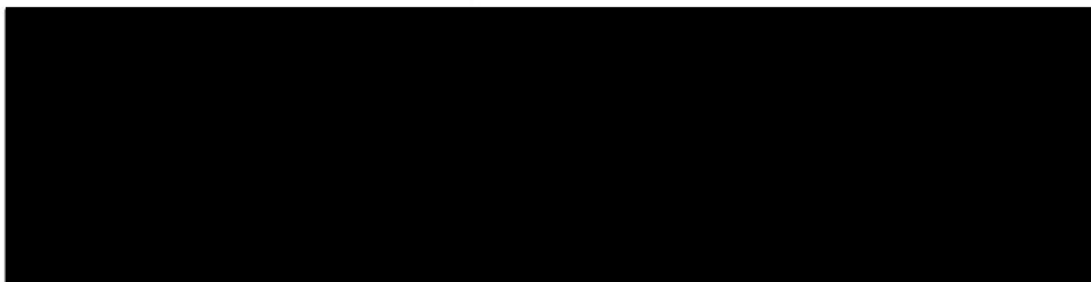
