Governing document

Glendale Community Hall Association is an unincorporated entity, recognised as a Scottish Charity by the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR). It is governed by the terms of its amended Constitution dated 8 September 2012.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Any person who resides in the Glendale postal district can become a member of the association at the discretion of the Management Committee. At each annual general meeting (AGM), the members may elect any member to be a member of the Management Committee. The Management Committee may at any time appoint any members to be a member of the Management Committee. At each AGM, all of the members of the Management Committee shall retire from office, but shall then be eligible for re-election.

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The maximum number of the Management Committee members shall be seven. Sub-committees, consisting of at least one Management Committee member, are formed for specific purposes as and when required.

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- The advancement of education
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In pursuance of the objects above, the association primary purpose shall be:

To maintain, manage and administer the building consisting of the hall and ancillary accommodation known as Glendale Community Hall, as a community and social centre for the welfare of the residents of Glendale and District and its environs in the Island of Skye. To make such building available for educational, cultural, social and recreational activities of a community nature and as a meeting-place for the local people, without restriction or discrimination of any kind on religious, political or other grounds.

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Overview of activities

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The Glendale Community Hall Association are still being proactive in recruiting further committee members / younger committee members from the community to join the Glendale Community Hall Association Committee but at present we haven't been successful.

A year on, this still has not changed, and we have been unsuccessful in achieving our goal. People are willing to support the Glendale Community Hall Association as volunteers but don't want to commit to holding office as committee members.

Glendale Community Hall Association have delivered two major projects to reduce ongoing costs and ensure the halls infrastructure is well maintained for the future.

The total value of the two projects delivered is £20,892.66, and Glendale Community Hall Association total funding for these two projects was £1,955.66, which makes all the time, effort and frustration a worthwhile investment for Glendale Community Hall.

Glendale Community Hall Association took the decision not to apply for Highland Council funding, due to a very short Highland Council timeframe to submit projects for HC CRF funding consideration in their latest funding application. The GCHA is now focused on obtaining funding for a solar panel and battery storage option to reduce the overhead cost of the Glendale Community Hall.

Glendale Community Hall applied and received exemption from Scottish Water for the non-payments of water rates under the "Scottish Government Water and Sewage Exemption Scheme". With the Hall not being on a mains sewage system Glendale Community Hall must pay for the emptying of the halls septic tank.

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Work scopes covered are painting the exterior of the Glendale Community Hall, realignment of the foul-water drainage system, fire system maintenance, grounds maintenance and the annual service inspection of the heating system which is part of a service agreement.

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In this accounting year Glendale Community Hall didn't have any large one-off hall hire events as in the previous years.

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This event proved popular, was well attended and was complete. Refreshments were available and with entrance fees, raffle and stand hires a total of £802.14 was generated. Going forward this is going to be an annual event

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The October 2024 craft fairs were the only craft fairs where refreshments were available in this accounting year.

The craft fairs recommenced Tuesday 1st of April 2025, one craft fair had to be cancelled as a funeral was being held in Glendale Hall, income generated from hire of tables and sales from the hall table was £5,137.00. Sale of refreshments were £272.35

Total Income generated from Craft Fairs in this accounting year is £5,409.35.

From the first craft fair of 2026 the hire of a table at the Glendale Community Hall craft fair will increase by £2.00 to £14.00 per table

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Alzheimer's support group meetings, Men's "Well Being Breakfast" events, Funeral's, Special Church Events and Craft Fair Charity Tables are held at the Glendale Community Hall at zero cost.

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The Highland Council has extended Glendale Community Hall's Association exemption from paying "Non-Domestic Rates" for this financial year. This is a saving for the Glendale Community Hall Association of £9,262.80, without this exemption Glendale Community Hall couldn't continue to operate.

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On the 25th of June 2025 BT disconnected the WIFI / phone connection to the Glendale Community Hall which was an error that they admitted. The WIFI connection was only reinstated on the 10th of October and the phone line on the 25th of October. The amount of time and effort getting these services reconnected was a large drain on time. The Glendale Community Hall Association did lose revenue by not having a WIFI connection. Once the phone line had been connected BT started to discuss "Compensation". BT doesn't pay compensation to businesses (Glendale Hall is classed as a business) for loss of BT services.

An offer of one month's charges was made which we describe as an insult and reminded BT, as previously during getting the hall reconnected that we were a registered Scottish charity. BT came back with another of three months charges but there was going to be a reconnection charge of £200, which after some discussion they waived this charge when we refused their latest offer we were told their offer had now reverted back to one month's charges.

Numerous phone calls later we have accepted five months charges (approx. £475), and we are in the process of raising a complaint with OFFCOM. Hopefully with their help, we will get further compensation from BT. (If Glendale Community Hall wasn't classed as a business, we would have been entitled to £8 per day for having no connections approx. £800.

Ofgem RHI Payments

Total payments made by Ofgem to Glendale Community Hall Association is £192.54

Ofgem RHI make BT look incredibly proactive and supportive, there has been an issue with readings for Ofgem RHI which reduced the payments to Glendale Community Hall association. We are looking into Ofgem RHI making back payments.

Good Energy Suppliers of Electric

In April 2025, Good Energy contacted SSE to review the Hall's account banding. This was because they felt the Hall had been put in a band which covered a higher electricity usage & therefore the Hall was paying more than it should have been. Unfortunately, SSE came back to say the band (band 3) is correct for the Hall.

Reserves policy

The Association does not currently have a formal policy in relation to the retention of free reserves which are those unrestricted funds not invested in fixed assets, designated to a specific purpose or otherwise committed but actively monitors its reserves and invests surplus funds in a term deposit account.

At the balance sheet date unrestricted free reserves stood at £33,335 (2024 - £35,084). The Committee considers this level to be adequate.

Investment policy

The charity's constitution empowers the association to invest any funds which are not immediately required for charitable activities in such investments considered appropriate.

The Committee declare that they have approved the trustees' report above.

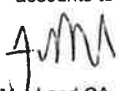

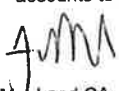

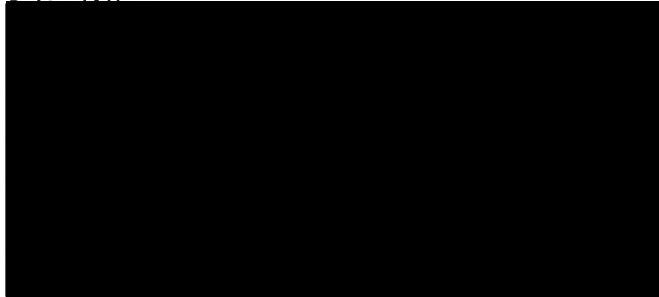

- The advancement of the arts, heritage, culture or science
- The advancement of public participation in sport
- The provision of recreational facilities

In pursuance of the objects above, the association primary purpose shall be:

To maintain, manage and administer the building consisting of the hall and ancillary accommodation known as Glendale Community Hall, as a community and social centre for the welfare of the residents of Glendale and District and its environs in the Island of Skye. To make such building available for educational, cultural, social and recreational activities of a community nature and as a meeting-place for the local people, without restriction or discrimination of any kind on religious, political or other grounds.

Overview of activities

Having a hall committee of only four members still causes difficulties, which hasn't been helped by members unavoidably being off the Island during this accounting year. A new committee member was appointed, on the negative side we lost two committee members due to other commitments in the 2023 / 2024 accounting year

The Glendale Community Hall Association are still being proactive in recruiting further committee members / younger committee members from the community to join the Glendale Community Hall Association Committee but at present we haven't been successful.

The Glendale Community Hall Association at very short notice from the Highland Council created and submitted two separate projects for funding from the Highland Councils "Community Regeneration Fund".

Project 1; Exterior Painting of the Glendale Community Hall (Highland Councils "Community Regeneration Fund" Project Reference Number is CRF-3040).

The exterior walls of the community hall have been painted with energy saving paint, which also offers superior weather protection to the fabric of the hall. The value of this project was £11,177.25, the funding breakdown of this project is £10,177.25 Highland Councils "Community Regeneration Fund", £1,000 Provided by the Glendale Community Hall Association.

Committed funding to this project by Glendale Community Hall Association in this accounting year was £2,575. The grant funding award will be reclaimed in the accounting year 2024/2025.

Formal approval of this project was only received from the Highland Council on the 6th of September 2024, due to some better weather the community hall painting was completed on the 3rd of October 2024. The project was delivered under budget and without the requirement to use the 5% contingency within the project.

A request was made to the Highland Councils "Community Regeneration Fund", to allow the Glendale Community Hall Association to use the underspend and contingency to carry out some additional exterior painting, the Highland Council agreed that their funding underspend could be used for the additional painting work scope.

Project 2; Upgrade of Glendale Community Hall Toilets & Wastewater System (Highland Councils "Community Regeneration Fund" Project Reference Number is CRF-3059).

There have been numerous issues with the Glendale Community Hall toilets / wastewater system in the accounting year 2023 / 2024, which has resulted in the closure of the hall toilets to visitors and impacted on Glendale Halls expenditure and a reduction of income generated at the craft fairs where refreshments couldn't be served.

The key points of this project are 1; The purchase of a heavy-duty high-pressure jetting pump to clear & prevent blockages, 2; A technical study to prove if the halls toilets and wastewater system are fit for purpose to deal with large increase in visitor numbers, if this technical study highlights any issues the study will be used as evidence to support future funding applications. 3. Realignment of the wastewater pipework between the hall and the septic tank

The only Glendale Community Hall Association expenditure in this accounting year was the purchase of the heavy-duty high-pressure jetting pump at a cost of £2,983.16

Overview of activities - continued

Provision of Toilets for Visitors by Glendale Community Hall Association.

There are costs for Glendale Hall providing toilet facilities for visitors, in this financial year most of these costs were still covered by a successful funding award from the Coastal Communities Fund for this accounting year. Highland Coastal Community Funded the 2021 Project.

Highland Council Coastal Communities Fund Project Reference Number HCCF206.

The Highland Council made a final payment of £10,616.08 to Glendale Community Hall Association, this payment closed the Highland Council Coastal Communities Fund Project Reference Number HCCF206. This funding stream for opening of the hall toilets has ceased.

Highland Councils "Comfort Scheme"

The £200 per month from the Highland Councils "Comfort Scheme" is still active, no funding was claimed from the Highland Councils "Comfort Scheme" in May, June August and September due to the issues with the wastewater system

Additional Costs / Loss of Income Associated Issues with the Halls Wastewater System

The large increase in visitors numbers using the hall toilet has caused major issues, resulting in the hall toilets being closed to visitors other community hall toilet have also suffered closures due to wastewater issues. Addressing the blockages in the wastewater system has resulted in additional hall expenditure of £2,911.92 and the loss of £800.00 Highland Councils "Comfort Scheme" payments. Toilet donations are vastly reduced compared to the previous year due to the toilet closures, toilet donations for this accounting year were £861.52 compared to £2,681.44 in the previous accounting year.

Glendale Community Hall applied and received exception from Scottish Water for the non-payments of water rates under the "Scottish Government Water and Sewage Exemption Scheme". With the Hall not being on a mains sewage system Glendale Community Hall must pay for the emptying of the halls septic tank. Payments of £498.80 have been made to Scottish Water.

Hall Hires in this accounting year were £3,199.25

Craft Fairs

Four craft fairs were held in October 2023, and the craft fairs recommenced Tuesday 26th March 2024. New stand holders attended the craft fairs. One craft fair had to be cancelled as a funeral was being held in Glendale Hall, eight craft fairs were held where no refreshments were served due to the issues with the wastewater system. Income generated from hire of tables was £5,449.00. Sale of refreshments were £1,435.50. Sales from the hall table were £180.00 year.

Total Income generated from Craft Fairs is £7064.50 in this accounting year.

Glendale Hall Christmas Fair was held on Saturday 18th November, which was well attended by stall holders. Visitor numbers were up on the previous year, income generated by the table hire, refreshments and raffle / tombola were £573.30.

Tabletop Sale was held on Saturday 10th of February 2024, which was well attended by stall holders and visitors. Income generated by the table hire, and refreshment was £177.55

Lunch Club

The fortnightly Monday over sixty community lunch club has continued, which the Glendale Community Hall Association supports with reduced hall hire costs.

Scottish Government Water and Sewage Exemption Scheme

Glendale Community Hall applied and received exception from Scottish Water for the non-payments of water rates under the "Scottish Government Water and Sewage Exemption Scheme". With the Hall not being on a mains sewage system Glendale Community Hall must pay for the emptying of the halls septic tank. Payments of £498.80 have been made to Scottish Water.

Highland Council Exemption from paying "Non-Domestic Rates"

The Highland Council has extended Glendale Community Hall's exemption from paying "Non-Domestic Rates" for this financial year. This is a saving for the Glendale Community Hall Association of £9,262.80

Reserves policy

The Association does not currently have a formal policy in relation to the retention of free reserves which are those unrestricted funds not invested in fixed assets, designated to a specific purpose or otherwise committed but actively monitors its reserves and invests surplus funds in a term deposit account.

At the balance sheet date unrestricted free reserves stood at £40,642 (2023 - £44,668). The Committee considers this level to be adequate.

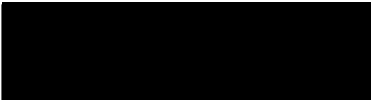
