During the financial year, cadets have participated in residential activities all over the country and around the globe. Members from the unit participated in the Royal International Air Tattoo, an Adventurous Training Camp to Fairbourne in Wales, Annual Camp to RAF Lossiemouth, National Air and Space Camp, and other training opportunities that broadened cadets' experiences and personal development.

The Squadron achieved notable success in competitive activities, securing second place in a drill competition and participating in swimming and athletics events. Senior cadets also benefited from a partnership with Edinburgh College, which supported the development of knowledge and skills required for Senior and Master Classification badges.

The Squadron continued to play an active role in the local community through participation in Midlothian and Loanhead Gala Day parades, as well as volunteering at larger events including the Edinburgh Marathon and the Loanhead Firework Display. Fundraising and recruitment activities included a successful Gala Day stall and a well-attended quiz night, both of which helped raise funds and increase awareness of opportunities available to young people within the organisation.

These activities have provided cadets with valuable opportunities to develop leadership, teamwork, confidence, and practical life skills, supporting their progression within the Squadron and contributing to their personal growth and development.




Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

It has been a very busy year! the Squadron has hosted 24 events for the Sector, Wing or Region, from air rifle shooting to adventurous training.

We have seen a high level of interest in activities across the spectrum of the available cadet experience including active engagement in flying, gliding, camps (such as Royal International Air Tattoo, Drill & Ceremonial Camp, Nijmegen Airbourne Marches), adventurous training, various qualifications, Duke of Edinburgh Award, and skills development. Some activity has been delivered in conjunction with other Squadrons from within the Sector.

One of our cadets was selected to be the Lord Lieutenant of Midlothian's Cadet and has represented the Squadron at remembrance Sunday alongside the Lord Lieutenant at the City Chambers.

We are sitting with 28 cadets within the squadron, new cadets have started their Cadet Basic Training Course, a 9-week firm programme including a weekend camp which gets them on the ladder to achieve badges for brassards and promotional opportunities.


