The trustees present their report with the financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2026.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is unincorporated and is governed by constitution, policies and publication.

TRUSTEE RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT

Trustees are appointed or reappointed on an annual basis. New trustees tend to be recruited through word of mouth amongst people with common interests, eg parents and friends etc.

CHARITABLE OBJECTIVES OF THE TRUST

The charitable objective of the trust is to promote and encourage a practical interest in aviation and the Royal Air Force amongst young people. The charity provides training which will be useful in both the Services and civilian life by encouraging the spirit of adventure, developing qualities of leadership and good citizenship.

SUMMARY OF MAIN ACTIVITIES IN RELATION TO THESE OBJECTIVES

The focus of the charity's activities are flying, gliding, training and education, adventure training, sports, leadership and community involvement.

SUMMARY OF MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE CHARITY DURING THE FINANCIAL PERIOD

The charity operates a rolling education programme and examination system for youths aged 12 to 20 on progressional avionic studies including Advanced Radio and Radar, Airmanship, History of Air Training Corps and Royal Air Force, Basic Navigation, Principles of Flight, Propulsion and Satellite Communications. Providing support on their learning syllabus on these subjects with extracurricular activities such as aircraft modelling and flight simulation.

The charity has provided training in life skills for over 30 youths in air experience flying, communication skills, drill and discipline, gliding, leadership courses, St John's Ambulance First Aid qualifications, health and safety training and uniform preparation.

The charity has attended adventure training courses, annual UK and international camps, fundraised for service charities, been involved in assisting at community events (gala days), completed the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, learned downhill skiing and participated in sports (athletics, cross country, football, netball, swimming) locally and nationally.

RESERVES POLICY

The charity holds a reserve fund as agreed by the Committee. These funds are held in order to meet the charity's commitments. The funds held by the charity are unrestricted.
