Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees are generally recruited from parents of Cadets and the local community. They are appointed by the chairman and the Squadron Commander. The post holders are re-elected annually at the AGM.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

Our purpose is to provide civilian support to Wing in its role to deliver a range of activities across the geographical area of west Scotland on behalf of the 26 member squadrons. Est Scotland Wing is a uniformed youth organisation which coordinates and delivers a wide range of training experiences for young people with an interest in aviation, or the RAF and its history. West Scotland Wing adopts the RAF Air Cadets Aims as part of its constitution, actively seeking to develop skills and qualities in young people which will be useful in the future.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The Wing serves to build upon the experience the Cadets receive at squadron level. A wholly volunteer driven organisation, the Wing seeks to create opportunities for Staff and Cadets to come together for training and the wider range of activities offered, which represents the values and mission of the RAF Air Cadets.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

All squadrons on wing remain fully operational and delivering a wide range of cadet activities, except 1153 and 2521 who now have staff and hope to open in August new school term. 2296 are parading monthly at 49f with the aim to increase in near future.

Wing Strength – CFAV'S AND Service Instructors is 200 and Cadets 748.

Sports is starting to pick up with Swimming, Athletics, Cross Country and Football all now being attended.

Flying 661VGS continues on a squadron rotational basis. 4AEF OC retired and replacement still to be appointed. Flying continues during school holidays. Flying Scholarships resumed late summer 24.

Shooting full bore continues at wing level and a number of squadrons now have air rifle ranges on site.

Camps there was blues camps at Lossiemouth and Cranwell, National Aerospace camp, Royal International Tattoo Regional skills CAMPS AND Adventure Training at Windermere.

Several Cadets from Wing have been picked to represent the Air Cadets in an International Exchange.
