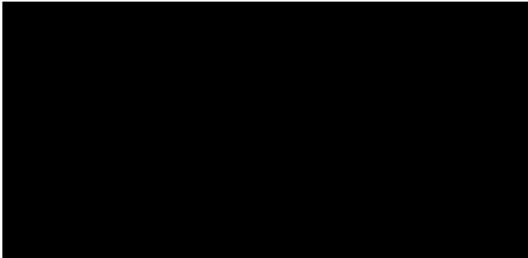
### **Independent examiner's statement**

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the day-to-day running of the Unit.

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes. During the year, the Unit received 1 donation and 1 Grant to be used for specific purposes, firstly a donation of £1,500 from the Navy League which was to be used to purchase windsurfing equipment, the Unit purchased this after the year end, secondly a grant of £2,500 from the Ulysess Trust was to be used towards a trip for the cadets.
