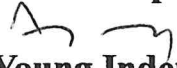

We also get a few birthday parties and for the past two years we have had an art exhibition. We are also lucky for the NHS to come to our small village to do jobs, which with an aging population this helps them. Letting out the rooms is our main purposes.

Unfortunately, Hannah had to give up being the Muirkirk Community Association Secretary, and we thank her for her time and effort and we welcomed Sylvia as the stand in until the next AGM.

All is quiet until October when we have to start getting ready for the Christmas madness. We have to sort the Village Christmas Lights and arrange for them to be put up by, unfortunately, the same village volunteers, every year, of which some are in there 70s. They need to be sorted and ready for the switch on. We had a Christmas Craft Fair in 2023, for our very talented local crafters, which went down quite well, enough for them to want us to do it again this year.
