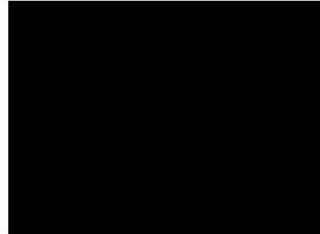

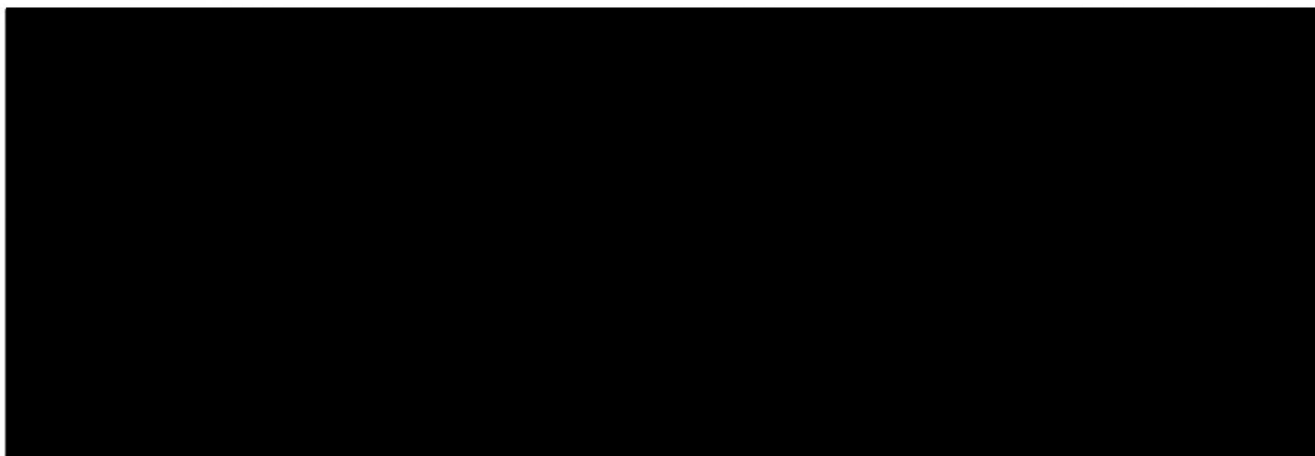

Trustees' Annual Report

Year Ended 31 December 2024

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Church is administered in accordance with the terms of the Unitary Constitution.

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

Members of the Kirk Session and the Congregational Board are the charity trustees. The Kirk session are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. The minister, who is a member of the Kirk Session, is elected by the congregation and inducted by Presbytery. The Congregational Board is appointed from within the congregation and members of the congregation are invited to nominate individuals who are believed to have the skills and commitment to contribute to the management of the affairs of the Church. Board members are then appointed at the Annual Stated Meeting and serve for a period of three years after which they must seek re-election.

Organisational Structure

The Congregational Board is chaired by the minister and have eight scheduled meetings per calendar year. Certain responsibilities are delegated to the Finance Committee and the Property Committee as appropriate. The Kirk Session also hold eight meetings per year and is responsible for spiritual affairs within the Church.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry.

It co-operates with other Churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. A weekly service is held on a Sunday at 10am and is open to all members of the public. Sunday Club on a Sunday is children dependent however the Sunday Club leaders are currently helping on a Rota basis with the One Way Club on a Tuesday. Whilst there is no regular Sunday Club all young members of the church actively participate in services throughout the year.

We have various children's groups meeting on a weekly basis during school term; One Way is for children aged Primary 4-7 and meet on a Tuesday with 16 kids attend on average. Due to falling numbers the Boy's Brigade finished in May and did not restart after the summer. Girls Brigade meet on a Monday and currently there average 8 Explorers and 4 Juniors. Mums & Tots meet on a Thursday morning for pre-school children with average 10 per week.

A dance class started on a Thursday evening. The ladies group also restarted this year with monthly themed meetings on a Friday Night. There is a Prayer Meeting weekly in the church and we also have a Pastoral Care Group who visit members of the congregation who cannot make it to church on a Sunday.

Achievements and Performance

The Congregation Membership is 109 at end of December 2024.

Sunday morning services are held 52 weeks of the year.

In 2024 the average attendance was 30/40 members each week.

The One Way is run by a volunteers from the church on a Tuesday night for P4-7. Currently there is 24 names on the register with an average of 16 attending each week.

The minister engages with the local Primary School at special services/assemblies.

We have a Girls Brigade which has 12 Explorers and 5 Juniors on the register.

The Boy's Brigade did not resume after the summer due to decline in numbers.

All our youth groups are open to all children within the village.

The finance committee continue to come up with ideas to increase weekly offerings. We encourage all members to sign up for FWO & Gift Aid. The congregation always respond well to financial appeals.

The minister also intimates regularly for extra volunteers to help with the various activities within the church.

Financial Review

The principle source of income is from weekly offerings. This is collected via Open Plate, FWO envelopes and Online Donations. Overall we saw a drop of £1,800 compared to 2023:

Open Plate £1500 (2023), £1165 (2024) - Decrease £335
FWO Envelopes £24730 (2023), £22915 (2024) - Decrease £1815
Online Donations £6230 (2023), £6580 (2024) Increase £350
Totals = £32,460 (2023), £30,660 (2024) - Decrease £1800

A retiral of £160 was raised for Poppy Scotland

There was an increase in Donations to Fabric Fund which is made up of a monthly retiral; £574 (2023), £761 (2024) - Increase £187

Fabric spending this year increased from £1029 (2023) to £2098 (2024)

The main expenses included a Boiler Repair for the Church and ongoing boiler maintenance for the Church Hall.

There is £0.00 cost for Pulpit Supply due to the Worship Team leading services in the minister's absence.

Reserves Policy

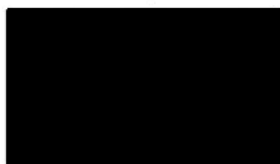
It is the Trustees policy to hold reserves of approximately three months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held restricted cash funds for :

Fabric (£0.00) and Organ/Keyboard Fund (£475). There is also £354 remaining from the Coronation Celebrations.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The members of the Kirk Session/Congregational Board must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Church during the financial year. The members of the Kirk Session/Congregational Board are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Church at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and the Regulations Anent Congregational Finance approved by the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2007. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

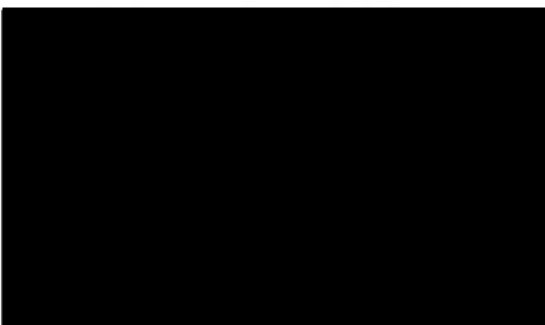
Basis of independent examiner's statement

9. Ministry & Mission Contribution

By the 31st December 2024 the Church paid contributions of £2100 of the £30,523.

10. Minister's Stipend

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all minister's stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Minister's stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £31,642 and the maximum stipend (in the 5th and subsequent years of service) - £38,884.
