STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The Group is an unincorporated registered Scottish Charity and is governed by the terms detailed in the constitution of The Scout Association (incorporated by Royal Charter in 1912) and as detailed in its Policy, Organisation and Rules ("POR"), as amended by its Scottish Variations.

Appointment of Trustees

Trustees are recruited, appointed and trained in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules ("POR") of the Scout Association.

Organisational Structure

58th Fife Group Scout Council is the body to which the Group Trustee Board is accountable. The Council normally meets once per year. The Group Trustee Board is responsible for the day-to-day management of the Group's affairs and normally meets four times per year. Responsibility for delivery of the Scout Programme is delegated to the Group Leader Team under the leadership of the Group Lead Volunteer.

Risk Assessments

The Health and Safety of the young people is the number one priority in Scouting. The Scout Association operates a mandatory training programme for all adults responsible for young people. All Leaders, Assistant Leaders, Trustee Board Members and any other adult helpers in the Group must be members of the Protection of Vulnerable Groups ("PVG") Scheme operated by Disclosure Scotland.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The charity's purposes are:

- the advancement of education; and
- the advancement of citizenship or community development

The aim of the Group is to promote the purpose of Scouting, which is that Scouts exists to actively engage and support young people aged 4 - 25 in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society.

We aim to offer a programme of activities that enable our young people and volunteers to have fun, make friends and learn vital skills for life such as independence, social skills, first aid, problem solving, leadership and teamwork.

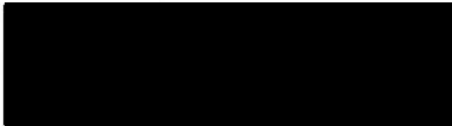

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2025

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Glenrothes & Levenmouth District Scouts

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025, which are set out on pages 8 to 10.

Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and Examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005 Act") and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("the 2006 Regulations"). The trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation (10)(1)(d) of the 2006 Regulations does not apply.

It is my responsibility to examine the accounts under section (44)(1)(c) of the 2005 Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Regulations. As examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes considerations of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

In connection with my examinations, no matter came to my attention:-

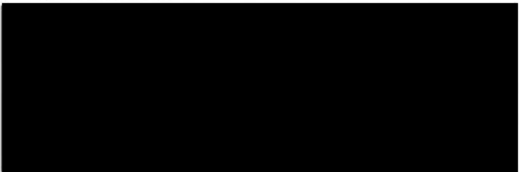
1. which gives me reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect, the requirements

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED MARCH 2025

1. Basis of Preparation

These accounts have been prepared on the receipts and payments basis in accordance with:

- (a) The Charities and Trustees Investment (Scotland) Act 2005
- (b) The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended)

There have been no changes to the basis of preparation or to the previous year's accounts.

2. Fund Accounting

(a) Unrestricted funds are those that can be expended at the discretion of the trustees in the furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

(b) Restricted funds are those that may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor, or when funds are raised for a specific purposes funds.

3. Taxation

(a) The charity is not liable to corporation tax or capital gains tax on its charitable activities.

(b) The charity is not registered for VAT, thus all costs are shown inclusive of VAT charged.

4. Transactions with trustees and related parties

(a) No remuneration was paid to trustees during the year or in the previous year.

(b) No expenses were reimbursed to the trustees during the year or in the previous year.

(c) There were no transactions with any related parties during the year or in the previous year.
