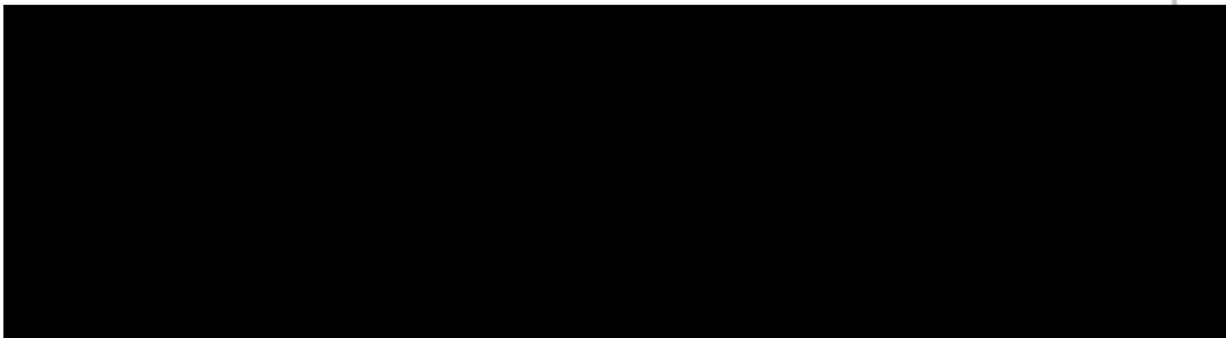
Constitution and Purpose

Trustees are recruited in accordance with the Policy, Organisation and Rules (POR) of the Scout Association.

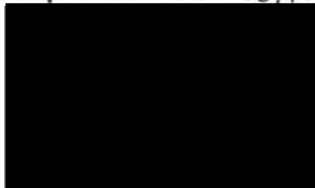


Reserves and Achievements

Basis of Independent Examiner Statement

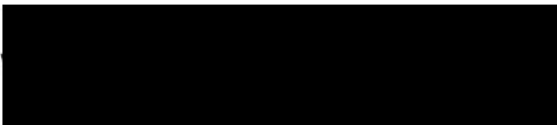

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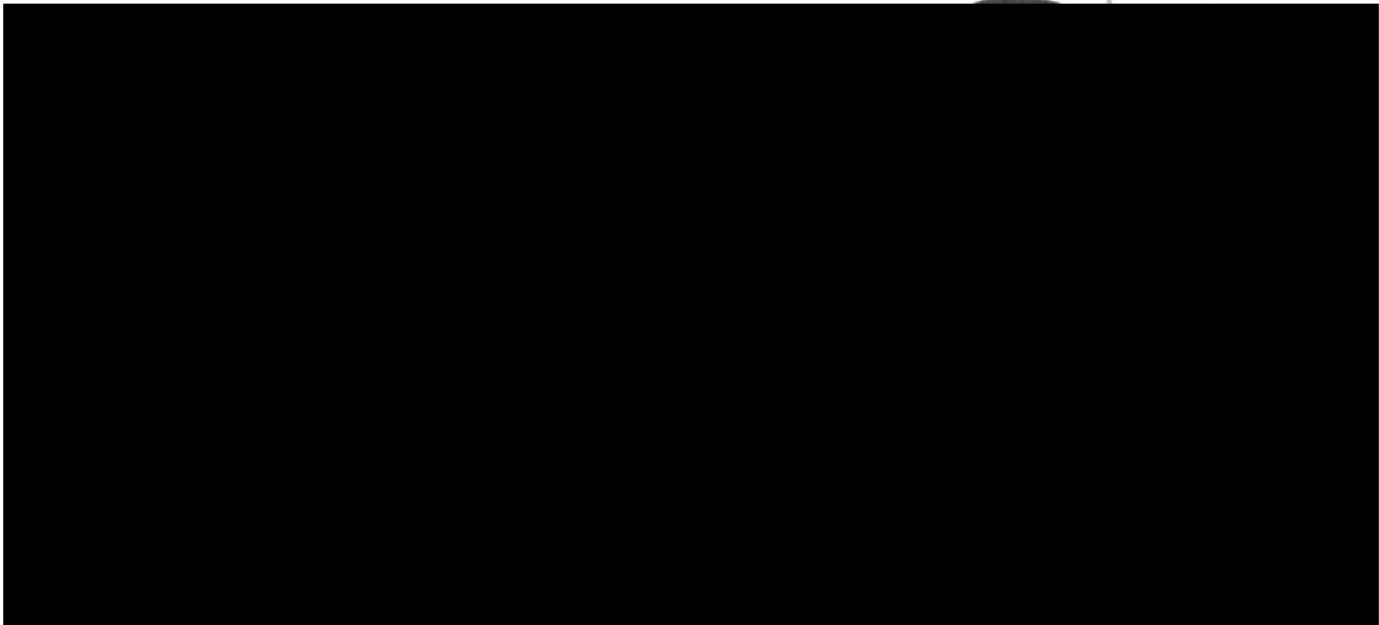
