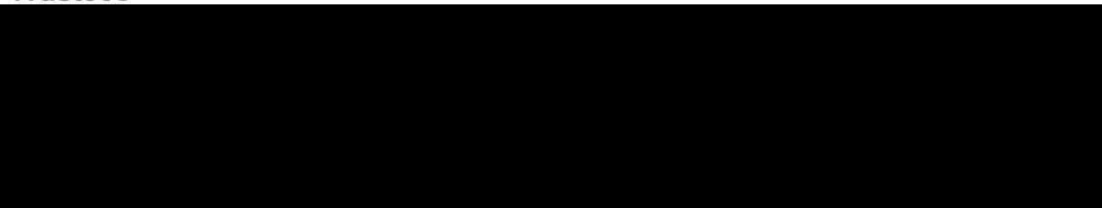
The Group's name is the 31st Pentland (Juniper Green) Scout Group and it may be contacted at 45 Lanark Road West, Currie, EH14 5JX

Activities and Achievements

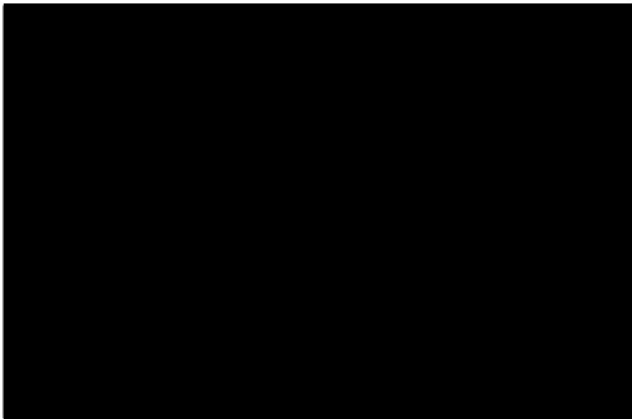
The Group continues to grow in number and currently has two Squirrel Dreys, two Beaver Colonies, two Cub Packs and two Scout Troops.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the 31st Pentland (Juniper Green) Scout Group

I report on the financial statements of the 31st Pentland (Juniper Green) Scout Group ('the Group') for the year ended 31st March, 2025 which are set out on the following pages.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The Group's Trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ('the Act') and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations ('the Regulations'). 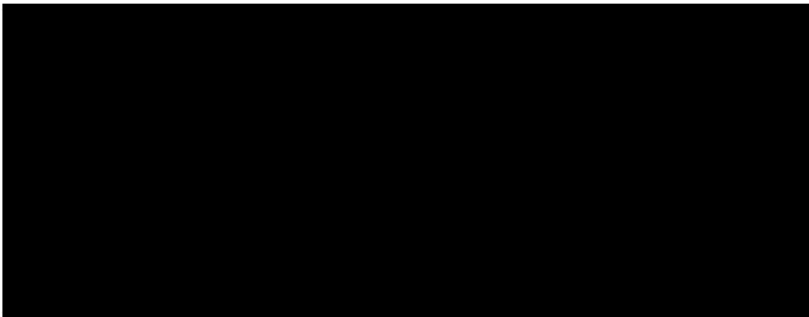
Basis of Independent Examiner's Statement
