REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES **for the year ended 31 DECEMBER 2025**

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Grangemouth Community Care was established to support the elderly of our town by providing specialised transport two days a week to allow them to attend a lunch club, therefore, helping to improve their socialisation and wellbeing, and reducing any potential loneliness.

Every Tuesday and Thursday, we endeavour to provide a bit of fun and enrichment while the elderly are in our care. This is done by interacting with them and being aware of what they have been doing and showing a caring interest. Also, we celebrate special events such as Christmas and Easter as well as marking more modest celebrations such as birthdays and Valentine's Day. We have also restarted our regular bingo sessions which are very popular and the men play dominoes, although enjoy the bingo.

We have had visits this year from our local Member of Parliament, Age Scotland and the local council and we continue to highlight many of the scams that have been circulating etc.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

We have arranged with Dial A Journey to pick up all our elderly. This has proved to be significantly more costly than we would have liked but we have been fortunate in receiving grants from both our local CVS team and the National Lottery.

This has meant that we can continue to take the elderly to local shows where we provide help and support in the theatre as well as the buses. We offered transport to four shows this year, one more than last year, which were well attended. We have managed to secure funding for the theatre tickets so these are free to all who attend.

The place holding the lunch club closes for two weeks in the summer. This year we managed to provide an outing covering one of the days we would normally take our elderly for lunch. We went on a bus run to Aberfoyle and had an afternoon tea in the Scottish Woollen Centre. This was very much enjoyed by the 40 people who attended.

We continue to work very closely with another local charity, Grangemouth Old People's Welfare (GOPW) who run the Talbot House facility and have been building on our relationship with them so we do not duplicate efforts and also to share training options that would be useful for both sets of volunteers.

We continue to share information with our team of volunteers via email and our Whatsapp group

At Christmas GOPW organise an exceptional Christmas lunch where a full Christmas dinner is provided and Santa pays a visit with gifts for all. Through the generosity of Age UK and Asda this event was free of charge.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Our biggest outlay is what the buses are going to cost each year. We have been successful so far in receiving enough funding to cover these each year and a little further into this coming financial year. We do a little fundraising on our own behalf e.g. coffee mornings and raffles. From this we can stay in the black by between £5,000 and £10,000. This allows us to continue our service whilst waiting on any large funding applications being processed.

Any funding for transport purposes is restricted in terms of their use and is documented separately in the accounts.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

We are a very small charity who work very closely with our elderly and their families. We hold an Annual General Meeting each year when our activities over the previous financial year are spoken about and a balance sheet present. We do not restrict our AGM to members of the charity, and in June 2025 we had members of our local community council and councillors in attendance.

We like to ask our clients and their families for feedback and try to act on everything that is passed on to us.

Unfortunately given the age of our elderly, we had suffered a significant number of losses over the year. This may have been because they have moved into care homes or even passed away. It does affect everyone in our charity's community and we do our best to support one another. The bereaved families have been very generous to the charity which has helped us greatly in being able to provide the little extras for our elderly.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is governed by a documented and approved constitution which is reviewed regularly and constitutes a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are all office bearers. They have all been volunteers with the charity who have been formally recruited (application, interview, references taken up, etc) and become members of the Protecting Vulnerable Groups Scheme. They are appointed at each Annual General Meeting in accordance with the constitution. Their appointment is fully documented in the charity's minutes.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The presentational and functional currency of the financial statements is Pounds Sterling (£).

Going concern

After reviewing the charity's forecasts and projections, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The charity therefore continues to adopt the going concern basis in preparing its financial statements.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charitable company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of the Charity's accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to estimates are recognised prospectively.

There are no significant judgements or estimates used in the preparation of these accounts.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donations

Donations are recognised on receipt. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until those conditions are fully met.

Grants

Grants are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. Grants are deferred if terms or conditions must be met before the charity has entitlement to the resources.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

We have arranged with Dial A Journey to pick up all our elderly. This has proved to be significantly more costly than we would have liked but we have been fortunate in receiving grants from both our local CVS team and the National Lottery.

This has meant that we can continue to take the elderly to local shows where we provide help and support in the theatre as well as the buses. We offered transport to four shows this year, one more than last year, which were well attended. Unfortunately, we have not managed to secure funding for the theatre tickets themselves but our elderly are prepared to pay for their own tickets.

The place holding the lunch club closes for two weeks in the summer. This year we managed to provide an outing covering one of the days we would normally take our elderly for lunch. We went on a bus run along each side of the Forth and had an afternoon tea in a local hotel. This was very much enjoyed by the 42 people who attended. This was paid for from our own fundraising efforts. We are now being asked when are we doing this again and we have even had suggestions of where to go.

We continue to work very closely with another local charity, Grangemouth Old People's Welfare (GOPW) who run the Talbot House facility and have been building on our relationship with them so we do not duplicate efforts and also to share training options that would be useful for both sets of volunteers.

We continue to share information with our team of volunteers via email and our whatsapp group

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Our biggest outlay is what the buses are going to cost each year. We have been successful so far in receiving enough funding to cover these each year and a little further into this coming financial year. We do a little fundraising on our own behalf e.g. coffee mornings and raffles. From this we can stay in the black by between £5,000 and £10,000. This allows us to continue our service whilst waiting on any large funding applications being processed.

Any funding for transport purposes is restricted in terms of their use and is documented separately in the accounts.

We are a very small charity who work very closely with our elderly and their families. We hold an Annual General Meeting each year when our activities over the previous financial year are spoken about and a balance sheet present. We do not restrict our AGM to members of the charity, and in June 2024 we had members of our local community council and councillors in attendance.

We like to ask our clients and their families for feedback and try to act on everything that is passed on to us.

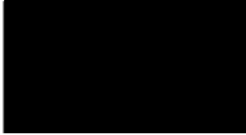

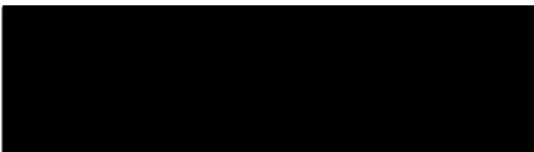

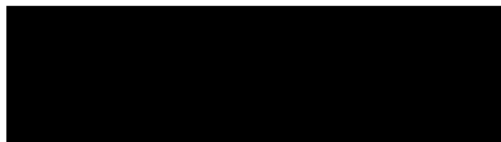

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The presentational and functional currency of the financial statements is Pounds Sterling (£).

Going concern

After reviewing the charity's forecasts and projections, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. The charity therefore continues to adopt the going concern basis in preparing its financial statements.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charitable company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of the Charity's accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to estimates are recognised prospectively.

There are no significant judgements or estimates used in the preparation of these accounts.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donations

Donations are recognised on receipt. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until those conditions are fully met.

Grants

Grants are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. Grants are deferred if terms or conditions must be met before the charity has entitlement to the resources.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.
