What the charity does: The walled garden was purchased from The Forestry Land Scotland A sensory reflective garden ,the gardens are run and maintained by community volunteers. We have held two very successful events this year Easter and Harvest fairs. Community payback and H.E.L.P have supported the garden with a regular band of volunteers who help keep the garden in good order. We are continuing to work with a regular band neurodivergent volunteers . Through grants and donations we have now 32 raised beds 25 of which are managed by local folk 7 we use to grow vegetables and fruit which enables us to have good sales of jam and vegetables grown in the garden

subject to appropriate safeguards to ensure that the public benefit so arising clearly outweighs any private benefit thereby conferred on private landowners) to carry out works of reclamation, remediation, restoration, and other operations to facilitate the use for those purposes of land whose use has been prevented or restricted because of previous use. c) To promote for public benefit the preservation (whether wholly or in part) of buildings and other structures of historic and/or architectural significance located within the Operating Area. d) to provide or assist in the provision of housing for people in necessitous circumstances within the Operating Area. e) to advance education and to promote training programmes and opportunities for the benefit of the residents of the Operating Area particularly among young people and the unemployed. f) to relieve poverty among the residents of the Operating Area. g) to promote, establish and operate other schemes of a charitable nature for the benefit of the community within the Operating Area.
