One of only two storytelling organisations in Scotland, we are a centre for contemporary storytelling and a European leader in applied storytelling. Based in Glasgow we deliver a range of projects, training and events which aim to: • Increase access to storytelling and creative opportunities for communities • Provide platforms for people to share their voices • Develop and promote the art of contemporary oral storytelling across Scotland and beyond We achieve this through the delivery of: • A placebased programme in our local community • Collaborations with organisations across Glasgow and beyond, including schools • Supporting the development of storytellers and performance, including a biennial festival
