Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The past year has been a very busy one in terms of both preparing new pieces to play and supporting new causes.

We continued to support various churches and sheltered housing complexes by visiting them with both the entire band for carol concerts and small ensembles for sheltered housing complexes.

We took part in the Scottish Concert Band Festival both at local level and Nationally at the Concert Hall in Perth. The band achieved a Gold Level Award at both events.

We also played in the Arts Centre in Aberdeen where we did a fundraising concert in aid of their funds.

The Arts Centre had lost their local authority funding and needed assistance to maintain their place in the community where they provide a venue for many amateur dramatic, dance and musical groups to perform and meet.

To mark our 25th year we also commissioned a piece of music by Alan Fernie called Granite
