CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Another year in the life of Choices Aberdeen has passed and we are grateful and thankful for all the work that has been carried out by staff and volunteers. The Pregnancy Crisis work has continued to be operated online and by telephone. However, we have seen a reduction in the number of appointments and to address this we have decided to refocus on the Pregnancy Crisis service and we plan to recruit a new counsellor who will be able to provide face-to-face appointments.

We remain an independent Pregnancy Crisis Centre and focus on the Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire area. Returning to a more traditional model for clients to be able to make an appointment to see a counsellor we believe is the best way to serve a wider number of clients.

We are indebted to our funders for their support and encouragement, including support from charitable organisations, trust funds, Churches and individuals: this can be financial support but also includes advice and accounting support. We appreciate the help we receive very much. The financial situation for many charities remains challenging and this year we lost a major source of funding that mainly financed the Relationship Education classes in schools. Unfortunately, we have taken the difficult decision to cut this service for the time being. We recognize that there has never been a greater need for this type of service and we believe that the workshops we have offered throughout this year have had a very positive impact on the young people who attended our sessions. We also acknowledge that the mental health of young people is under a lot of pressure and we are very sad that we will not be able to continue the service we have been able to offer for the past 10 to 12 years.

We are thankful to our staff for their hard work to maintain services in these challenging times. Our Centre manager continued to work with us during this year but due to the funding loss we have had to look at ways to reduce our spending. Our Centre Manager decided that she would like to move into a more secure employment situation and has left her post. We are currently recruiting to replace her although at a reduced number of hours as we are not continuing to recruit or train Youth Development workers. We have continued to liaise with other charities to see how we can provide the best services we can.

We want to thank the Directors for their knowledge and enthusiasm to keep the service going forward, to maintain the high standard of the work and to think of ways that we can use technology to reach out to more people. However, we also feel that face to face relationships remain the best way for us to work with clients and while we plan to continue to offer appointments by telephone, we hope that the new counsellor will mainly be taking appointments in person. We recognize that we have a much-slimmed down service now but we believe that the positive changes we are making will help the service to go from strength to strength. Being able to offer appointments within 72 hours with no waiting list remains our priority and we hope to build the service up to once again to include suitable workshops and drop-in sessions when more funding becomes available.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Nature of Governing Document

Choices Aberdeen Limited is a company limited by guarantee (company number SC307363) and a registered Scottish charity (charity number: SC037472) was established in 2007. The charitable company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

Organisational Structure

A board of directors of up to six members. A Centre Manager is appointed by the directors to manage the day to day operations of the charity. The board is also actively recruiting additional members.

Recruitment and Appointment of Directors

The powers for appointment and removal of directors are set out in the company's Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The directors who served during the year are as noted on page 1.

Centre Manager Report

Choices Aberdeen is a Scottish Registered Charity committed to supporting individuals experiencing pregnancy-related challenges and promoting healthy relationships within the community. Founded nearly two decades ago, the organisation provides professional, compassionate, and confidential services, offering people of all ages a safe space to explore their feelings and options without judgement or pressure.
Therapeutic Listening Service

Choices Aberdeen offers a Therapeutic Listening Service for individuals facing unplanned pregnancies or coping with pregnancy loss. Clients are welcomed into a confidential and supportive environment where they can openly process their emotions and explore the choices available to them. Our trained counsellors provide empathetic, non-directive support tailored to each person's unique situation.

Relationship Revolution: Youth Initiative

Our youth outreach is delivered through the Relationship Revolution programme, which brings educational workshops into schools to promote positive and healthy relationship choices among young people. Rooted in a Christian ethos, Choices Aberdeen is inspired to serve the most vulnerable in the city while ensuring that all individuals—regardless of race, religion, gender, or sexual orientation—are welcomed, respected, and supported.

Our Mission and Services

Choices Aberdeen exists to promote healthy relationships and empower individuals to make informed choices that strengthen their physical, mental, emotional, and relational wellbeing. Originally founded as a pregnancy crisis and grief counselling service, we remain committed to non-directive, person-centred support for those experiencing unplanned pregnancies or pregnancy loss.

DIRECTORS' REPORT

Therapeutic Listening & Counselling Service

This service continues to be central to our work. To meet rising demand, we have expanded accessibility through in-person sessions, phone support, online video meetings, email counselling, and our website chat line.

In 2024-2025, we:

Delivered appointments for pregnancy crisis, bereavement and post-abortion to 41 clients (range= 1-8 appointments).

- Maintained a 48-hour response time from first contact to appointment scheduling.
- Responded to enquiries about our services through the Chat-line Tawk-to.
- Continued to offer all services free of charge.

Clients and counsellors alike report the benefits of remote support, especially the comfort and convenience it offers to those processing difficult situations. In the future we plan to reintroduce face-to-face appointments to reach a wider number of clients.

Pregnancy Crisis Support

We provide a confidential and emotionally safe space for those facing unexpected pregnancies. Most individuals require only a single session, but additional appointments are available when needed. Our counsellors take a person-centred approach rooted in empathy, respect, and non-judgement.

Pregnancy Loss Programme

Choices Aberdeen offers a sensitive and flexible grief support programme for individuals who have experienced miscarriage, neonatal loss, or termination. The programme typically runs over six one-to-one sessions, scheduled weekly or at a pace that suits the client. Each programme is tailored to the individual and delivered by trained staff including our Therapeutic Listening Supervisor, Online Counsellor, and volunteers.

Therapeutic Tools

Our team uses a range of creative and reflective tools to support clients, including:

Art journals
Head/heart diagrams
Questionnaires

Stones for symbolic reflection
Letter writing
Role-play activities

These tools help clients process emotions and gain clarity at their own pace.

Information Resources & Public Awareness

Choices Aberdeen produces a range of leaflets and resources to provide clear information about our services. These cover topics such as:

- Online counselling
- Miscarriage support
- Post-abortion counselling (for both women and men)

These materials are available on our website and distributed throughout the community.

A key distinction of our service is our commitment to no waiting lists for anyone facing a crisis pregnancy. We offer dedicated support for pregnancy loss—including loss following termination—to both women and men.

Relationship Revolution Project

The Relationship Revolution programme supports young people to build safe, healthy relationships and navigate modern challenges including:

- Sexual health
- Pornography
- Peer pressure
- Exploitation
- Online risks
- Reducing Vulnerability to Exploitation

The programme places a strong emphasis on addressing Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE), especially among young people who may be more vulnerable due to deprivation or Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs).

We equip young people to:

- Recognise signs of grooming
- Understand coercion and consent
- Build resilience and self-worth
- Seek help from appropriate adults or agencies
- Healthy Relationship Foundations

Through classroom workshops, pupils learn:

Impact of the Service

Feedback consistently shows that young people gain a clearer understanding of risk, respect, resilience, and healthy behavior, supporting happier and safer relationships.

We delivered 25 workshops to around 400 young people (S1 – S3) from start of Term time in September 2024 to February 2025. Sadly, due to lack of funding, we will not be able to deliver workshops in the next academic year.

The net outgoing resources for the year, amounting to £13,722 have been dealt with as shown in the Statement of Financial Activities.

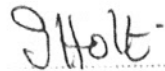

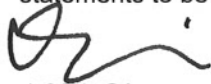
Independent examiner's statement

NOTES ON THE ACCOUNTS – 31 AUGUST 2025

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 *Basis of preparation of financial statements*

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) – (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Choices Aberdeen Limited meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised as historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

1.2 *Going concern*

The Directors, having made due and careful enquiry, are of the opinion that the company has adequate working capital to execute its operations over the next 12 months. In the prior year a major funder decided to stop funding the company to enable them to fund other charities in the local area. The directors are aware of the situation and the Board recognises the impact this will have on the financial position. As a result of the withdrawal of funding the directors have met to actively review the work of the company with the aim of protecting the financial sustainability of the work. The directors will meet regularly to discuss the financial situation and the direction of the company to try to minimise disruption to services, but recognise that there may be a need to withdraw from some of the projects. In the meantime the directors will continue to pursue other funding options to maximise the company's potential and continue to help vulnerable clients both current and future. The Directors, therefore, have made an informed judgement, at the time of approving the financial statements that there is a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. As a result, the directors have continued to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

1.3 *Reconciliation with previous Generally Accepted Accounting Practice*

In preparing these accounts, the Directors have considered whether in applying the accounting policies required FRS 102 and the Charities SORP FRS 102 the restatement of comparative items was required.

1.4 *Company status*

The company is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Directors named on page 1. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the company.

1.5 *Incoming resources*

i) Donations and legacies

Donations are included in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Government grants are credited to the Statement of Financial Activities as the related expenditure is incurred.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.6 *Resources expended*

Liabilities are recognised when the charity has an obligation to make a payment to a third party.

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of any irrecoverable VAT.

Expenditure is directly attributed to the relevant category in the Statement of Financial Activities where practical.

Costs of generating funds comprise those costs incurred in undertaking activities which generate voluntary income.

Governance costs comprise of the running costs of the charity itself as an organisation.

1.7 *Taxation*

The company is recognised by the HM Revenue & Customs as a charity and therefore the charity is not liable to taxation.

1.8 *Tangible fixed asset and depreciation*

Individual fixed assets costing more than £350 are capitalised at cost.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost evenly over its expected useful life as follows:

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1.9 *Funds*

Unrestricted funds include incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds. These funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the directors.

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor.

1.10 *Cash at Bank and in hand*

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

1.11 *Financial instruments*

The company only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

1.12 *Critical accounting estimates and areas of judgement*

The preparation of financial statements, requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported for assets and liabilities as at the balance sheet date and the amounts reported during the year for income and expenditure. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates. Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.
