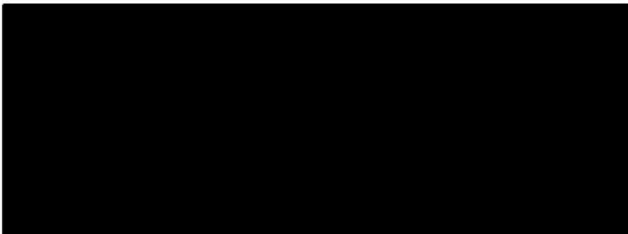
For the year ending 31st December 2024

The hall continued to increase its footfall. It was selected by Film Hub Scotland and film Forres to host two films – Eadie and Yesterday. The cost of the films was covered and any money raised went to the hall. The hall was again used to host a series of craft workshops with the Nairn Book and Art project. This year the theme being Insects.

A grant from ENCOMM was secured to help with an upgrade to the hall chairs – replacing the plastic seats with more comfortable chairs and purchasing some more tables to upgrade the unsafe wooden tables. Additionally, the hall received a donation from a local through the Crossroads Charity of £50,000 to enable the hall to start up a community café. Planning for starting up a café is ongoing.

Fundraising for the hall continued with musical evenings – Wildwood Jack, Simon Kempster and RAF Lossiemouth Wind Band.

Regular clubs and classes continued – Pilates, DanceFit, Table Tennis, Wildlife group, Knit n Natter, Book Club and Indoor Bowling in the winter.
