
School of Polish Language and Culture is a Registered charity from 28 January 2010, governed by its constitution.

APPOINTMENT OF TRUSTEES

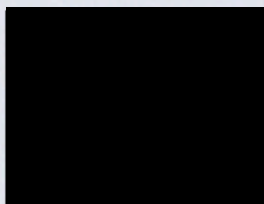

ACHIEVEMENTS YEAR ACTIVITIES

After Covid-19, our school has successfully returned to routine step by step, with one-third of our children back in attendance.

We are proud to announce that 12 of our students have achieved A and A* grades in GCSE Polish as a second language.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The school generated a surplus of £4976 this year, (last year was a deficit of £2,565). The total income for the year was £40,917, (last year £33,501) which consisted of Grant income of £5,115, of which £2,865 came from the Polish consulate which covered wages costs and helped with the self-employed Tutors Fees.

Total expenditure for the year was £35,941, (last year £36,066) Charitable activities totalled £34,807 and expenditure is detailed in note 6. Governance Costs totalled £1,134 which can be seen in detail on note 7.

FUTURE PLANS

The School's plans for the future include encouraging more children to attend the Polish School to learn the Polish language, geographic, culture and religion. We intend to organize more events to promote integration into the Scottish community and expand the promotion of Polish culture.

RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees are discussing a reserves policy to give confidence to stakeholders that the charity's finances are being managed and can also be used to provide an indicator of future funding requirements needed for investment in the association to add value for its members.
