**What the charity does:** The Leanne Fund delivers its specialist support services to individuals and families affected by Cystic Fibrosis across 12 of Scotland's 14 NHS Board areas. In collaboration with six national cystic fibrosis teams, The Leanne Fund now supports 450 individuals and their families, ensuring access to a comprehensive range of tailored services. These services are wide ranging and include providing families with financial assistance to help with costs associated with attending hospital appointments and extended stays in hospital. special treats and experiences. complimentary therapies. counselling and mindfulness services and with Hello Little One and Wellness boxes to name a few.

**Beneficiaries:** 'People with disabilities or health problems'

**Objectives:** The organisation is established for charitable purposes only, and in particular, the objects are: to advance the education and understanding of Cystic Fibrosis by awareness raising activities in the school, community, at events and through social media. and to prevent poverty and to relieve need by reason of ill health, disability, financial hardship or disadvantage for those suffering from Cystic Fibrosis and those affected by it. and to promote the provision or organisation of recreational activities with the object of improving the wellbeing and conditions of life for those with Cystic Fibrosis or those affected by it including siblings, parents or carers . and the advancement of health through facilitating activities and complementary therapies to relieve the condition and promote mental wellbeing.

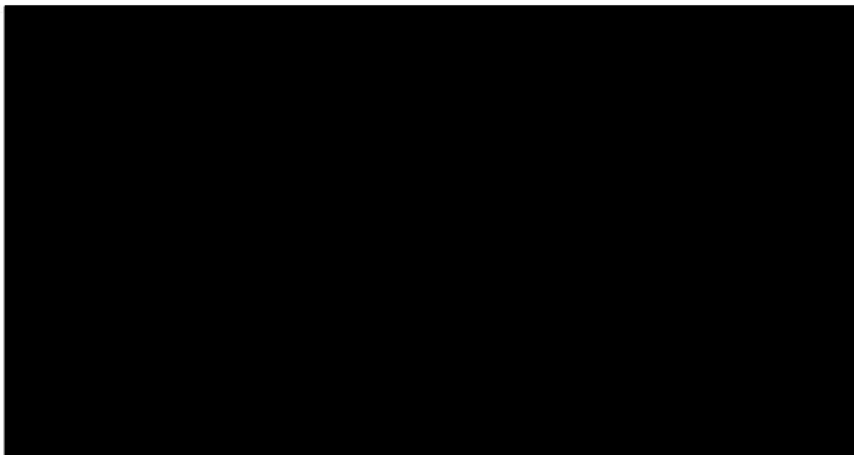

**STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

**Recruitment and appointment of trustees**

All of the group's trustees are appointed or reappointed by the members at our annual general meeting in accordance with our constitution. The Annual General Meeting is usually held in June each year.

**Governing document**

The charity was set up in 2010 as a charitable unincorporated group and the purposes and administration are set out in our constitution.

The charity became a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) on 16 May 2014.

**OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

**Charitable purposes**

The organisation is established for charitable purposes only, and in particular, the objects are:

- to advance the health of those suffering from Cystic Fibrosis; and
- to advance the understanding of Cystic Fibrosis; and
- to promote and improve the life and facilities and conditions of (the beneficiaries) those suffering from or affected by Cystic Fibrosis ; and
- to relieve those in need by reason of ill-health, disability, financial hardship or disadvantage as a consequence of Cystic Fibrosis

**Main Activities**

The Leanne Fund continued to deliver its specialist support services to individuals and families affected by Cystic Fibrosis across 12 of Scotland's 14 NHS Board areas. Ongoing funding from The National Lottery Community Fund has enabled the Fund to further strengthen its provision in Greater Glasgow & Clyde, Ayrshire & Arran, and Lanarkshire, particularly through the delivery of counselling and mindfulness services. In collaboration with six national cystic fibrosis teams, The Leanne Fund now supports 450 individuals and their families, ensuring access to a comprehensive range of tailored services.

During the year funding was received from various organisations including Point & Sandwick Trust, Scottish Children's Lottery Trust in addition to generous awards through Groundwork (Tesco Community Fund) to support our Families in Crisis service.

Significant contributions were also received from the Garfield Weston Foundation and the Hugh Fraser Foundation towards the core costs of the Cornerstone project, enabling the Fund to meet the essential operational expenses required for effective service delivery.

In addition to these grants, the Fund benefited from generous fundraising efforts and donation income throughout 2024. We are sincerely grateful for the continued support received during 2023, which has been instrumental in enabling the ongoing provision of our unique services for individuals and families affected by cystic fibrosis.

**Activities and achievements**

In 2024, a total of £23,665 was raised through fundraising activities to support the charitable objectives of The Leanne Fund. In addition, donation income amounted to £77,315. This included a significant contribution of £18,918 from the Bridge to Bridge Highland Cycle team, as well as a further generous donation of £15,000 from the family of the late Jenna McIntosh, through Jenna's Fund.

Other notable contributions included £500 from the Bank of Scotland through match funding, £2,000 from the Grampian Truck Show, and £5,996 from the Robertson family, who continue to support the Fund through monthly bingo events.

The annual 5k/10k event was once again well attended and regarded as a great success, representing just one of many dedicated efforts made in support of The Leanne Fund throughout the year.

We remain deeply grateful to all individuals, groups, and organisations who continue to support our work—whether through financial contributions, volunteer efforts, or fundraising initiatives carried out on our behalf.

**Reserves**


During the period the charity's incoming resources exceeded the outgoing resources resulting in a net incoming resources of £275 for the period (2023 – net outgoing resources of £6,490).

Closing restricted funds are £19,931 (2023 - £47,632), with closing unrestricted reserves of £201,108 (2023 - £173,133). Closing restricted funds comprise funding received for specified services, either by service type or geographical location, not yet spent.

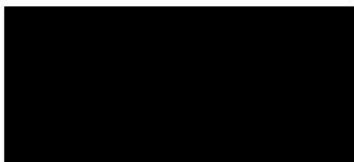

## **Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The Leanne Fund**

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024 which are set out on pages 3 to 4.

### **Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the 2005 Act") and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) ("the 2006 Regulations"). The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(d) of the 2006 Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1)(c) of the 2005 Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

### **Basis of independent examiner's statement**

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the 2006 Regulations. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters.
