Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document Club Constitution

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees are appointed through a vote from Club Members (as set out in the constitution) at the annual AGM, or by EGM. They are generally existing members of the club from the local community however where required, the club uses local volunteering groups to recruit trustees to ensure all positions are filled with suitable individuals.

Objectives and activities

- a) To promote community participation in healthy recreation by providing facilities for playing football at all ages within the community ("facilities meaning land, buildings, equipment and organising football activities); and
- b) To support, develop, improve and promote football for members of the club;

- d) To ensure all income is applied solely to these objectives

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

The main purpose of the organisation since its outset in 2003 has been the provision of Football activities for the local community. This started with the establishment of one team at one age group but quickly expanded to include multiple teams and age groups from Minikickers (aged 4yrs) through to an over 35's adult team in Boys Football and teams through to an adult Women's team in Girls Football. The activities include delivery of fun fitness and development training aligned to the Scottish Football Association for the development of individuals in sport.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Bayside FC had another successful year in 2024 and continued to grow a strong membership base. Below is a summary of some of the highlights and achievements from throughout the year:

- Continued to operate as an SFA Quality Mark Platinum club, the highest level of accreditation. This acknowledges the high standards across the club, testament to its volunteers and members. Some of the criteria include coach qualifications, club planning and community support.
- Hosted Bayside's annual golf day, bringing together members and guests from across the club whilst raising money for good causes in the local community.
- Installed new signage at Pitreavie base to welcome visitors to the club.
- Installed new secure storage units to further improve access to high quality kit across the club.
- Continued partnerships with local business who provided sponsorship supporting the club members with high quality kit.
- Several teams attended and hosted football festivals throughout the year.
- The 2015 and 2017 boys team completed local 'MacTuff' challenges, raising funds and a great team bonding event.
- Partnered with our external coaching provider to offer summer camp to team members during the summer and October school holidays.
- Continued to operate a popular 'mini-kickers' section, getting kids involved from as young as 4, offering great facilities and qualified coaches at an affordable rate.
- Continued partnership with Pitreavie Sports centre and Fife Soccer Sevens to offer consistent football to members in a safe and well-equipped environment.
- Saw several players who have developed their skills at the club progress and sign with local professional teams.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The charity is vigilant to ensure that sufficient unrestricted funds are held to support the day to day running costs. There are no staff employed nor land/buildings owned therefore there are no long term financial obligations for which significant reserves need to be held. Player subscriptions are reviewed with the committee regularly to ensure that the club has sufficient income to cover outgoings and a sufficient buffer level of funds is held in case of any unexpected expenditure. There are also some additional general funds in reserves to fund future projects.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Bayside Football Club (SC041746)

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 12 2024.
