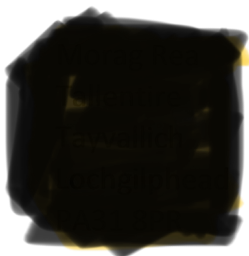

## **2025 Chair's Report to the Trustees of Moving on - Mid Argyll SC041901**

### **Overview**

2025 was a year of two halves for Moving On - Mid Argyll as we prepared to open the new Food Share Hub in partnership with MAYDS and Snowdrop Argyll. The cost-of-living crisis deepened and with it, demand for our help increased dramatically. For the first half of the year, we continued to provide food parcels and starter packs via our partner agencies from our premises at An Cala in Lochgilphead, whilst battling roof leaks, winter storms, damp and mould to make the new Hub fit for purpose. We finally opened in June and since opening, demand for food parcels has quadrupled, confirming our belief that a considerable unmet need existed under the previous system.

### **Opening the Food Share Hub**

Once the Hub building was dry and free from mould, and had been painted inside and out, with paint kindly donated by Jewsons and tools from Travis Perkins. Argyll Homes for All installed kitchen storage units, some donated by Howdens of Campbeltown. Then the Co-Op installed the shelving and Balfour Beatty cleared and painted the area next to the Hub so a shed to house starter pack items could be installed on a base provided by DA MacDonald. The Community Shop gave us some furniture, Fyne Homes provided cups and kettles and Lidl in Oban donated shopping baskets. We even had some pots and plants from Harbro to add some summer colour! We were now ready to stock the Hub and here again, we had the most generous support from Balfour Beatty and Hendrix Genetics. The final job before opening was to install the splendid Food Share Hub signs and donor board designed and donated by Midton Acrylics.

On June 17th, we opened the Food Share Hub to the public, with a well-publicised open day to which everyone in Mid Argyll was invited. The Hub is now open three times a week, on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday under the supervision of our Hub Co-ordinator, Keith Evans, supported by two volunteers. Anyone struggling with food poverty or wishing to donate surplus food is welcome to visit. As well as providing food and a warm welcome, we also point people in the direction of other organisations that might be useful, such as CAB and ALI Energy, who both also hold regular 'surgeries' at the Hub.

Shortly after opening, on July 2nd, we were honoured to welcome the Princess Royal to the Food Share Hub and on August 6th, the Hub was officially opened by Jane Macleod, the Lord Lieutenant of Argyll and Bute. All funders, local dignitaries and church leaders were invited, along with our partners and local retailers. We enjoyed tea and cake and entertainment from the Forget-me-not Choir and a great afternoon was had by all.

## **Supporters and Volunteers**

We would not have been able to open the Hub without the tremendous support we have had, both from the local businesses mentioned above and from our funders. Our thanks go to Nadara A'Chruach, the National Lottery, Argyll and Bute Council, Argyll TSI, ACHA, the Co-Op Local Causes fund and Lochgilphead Community Council for their support. We are also extremely grateful to the members of the public who donate via the boxes in the Co-Op, Tayvallich Stores and local churches, and through financial donations.

Tesco and the Co-Op support us with surplus food via their FareShare and Caboodle schemes, which not only provides the Hub with much needed food, but also helps to reduce food waste.

Of course, we would not be able to run the Hub without our dedicated Coordinator and our wonderful volunteers. We currently have 20 volunteers on our books, and we owe a huge debt of gratitude to each and every one of them. We were delighted when one of our long serving volunteers, Dee Carrick, was presented with the Lifetime Achievement Award at the Argyll TSI Volunteer of the Year Awards ceremony in June. Very well deserved!

## **Publicity**

Opening hours for the Food Share Hub are publicised via our Facebook page and with posters around the area. We are most grateful to the Argyllshire Advertiser who are always willing to find space in the paper to draw attention to our events and appeals, such as our Christmas appeal, of which more below. We also had stalls at the MACPool Swimathon and at Ardrishaig Gala day, all helping to ensure as many people as possible know about the Hub.

## **Christmas Appeal**

We launched our 2025 '12 Days of Christmas' appeal in November with a stall at the Co-Op and as in 2024, the folk of Mid Argyll did not disappoint with their amazing generosity. Well over 150 bags were filled with food, toiletries and Christmas treats and the Community Shop once again did sterling work distributing empty bags and collecting full ones. Ardfern Stores, the Argyll Pharmacy, BeeSweet, the Green Cup and Marmalade Deli all hosted special Christmas collection boxes and we are most grateful to them for their support. The Salty Dog repeated the 'Pay one Forward' campaign for preprepared Christmas lunches which were pronounced 'delicious' by the recipients.

The distribution process was different this year. As well as providing made up Christmas parcels for distribution via our partner agencies, we opened the Hub and the MAYDS hall to our regular Hub clients so they could visit and choose their own selection of Christmas treats and gifts. Our Coordinator and many of our volunteers, assisted by a team from the Scouts, worked incredibly hard to sort out the huge amount of donations, including what could have been a world record pile of mince pies! A special thank you to Lochgilphead Golf Club who produced a super selection of festive sweets and to Jack Evans who worked tirelessly to keep everyone supplied with delicious hot chocolate.

We asked our clients and partners for feedback on the new approach in January, and the verdict was unanimously positive, so watch this space for next year's appeal.

**Trustees**

Marian Pallister stepped down from the Board at the end of the year, and we would like to thank her for her contribution to the work of Moving On Mid Argyll over the years. Marian was instrumental in forging our links with the Poverty Alliance and her work in that area will be particularly missed. The other Trustees have indicated their willingness to continue to serve for the coming year and we thank them for their hard work on behalf of Moving on - Mid Argyll.

## Banking and Insurance Arrangements

Moving on - Mid Argyll has a Charity Current Account, a 30 day and an instant savings account with Virgin Money.

## Charitable Status

Moving on - Mid Argyll is a charity registered with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator. Moving on - Mid Argyll was established by a partnership of Mid Argyll Churches for the Prevention or Relief of Poverty and for the Relief of Those in Need by Reason of Age, Ill Health, Disability, Financial Hardship or Other Disadvantage. It was first registered on 17 November, 2010. Reg No. SC041901

## Income and Expenditure 2025

A receipts and Payments Report is appended to this paper. This indicates, amongst other things, an unrestricted income of £15,333, a 15% decrease on 2024, and an unrestricted expenditure of £2,325, an 80% reduction on last year. Electricity costs of approximately £600 have not been charged by the electricity supplier due to ongoing issues with their metering.

We also received £13,285 in restricted grants. Taking into consideration the residue of restricted grants from last year, there was restricted spending of £19,910 in 2025, leaving £5,950 for purchase of stock and £1,285 for storage accommodation in 2026.

## Resilience

Our closing balance of £34,832 represents 16 months operating cost at 2025 levels but given increased costs of employment, fuel and food combined with the likely increase in demand driven by continued pressure on living costs, it is imperative that we source new grant funding by mid year and continue to grow our financial supporter base to ensure sustainability of the Hub for the future.

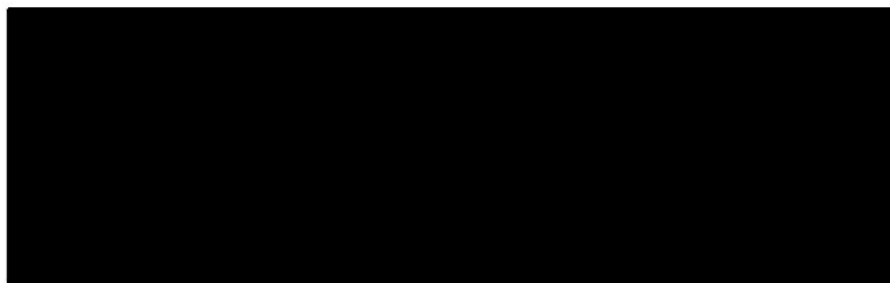

MO-MA has a Charity Current Account (with one debit card) with Virgin Money. All other transactions are executed on the mobile banking app. A 30 day savings account was opened this year, also with Virgin Money, in order to best use the grants received.

### **Income and Expenditure 2024**

A receipts and Payments Report is appended to this paper. This indicates, amongst other things, an unrestricted income of £18,006.79 a 50% increase on last year, and an unrestricted expenditure of £12,686.12, a 30% decrease on last year.

We also received £27,100 in restricted grants, of which we have spent £11,698.87. We registered for gift aid and were able to claim £878 from HMRC.

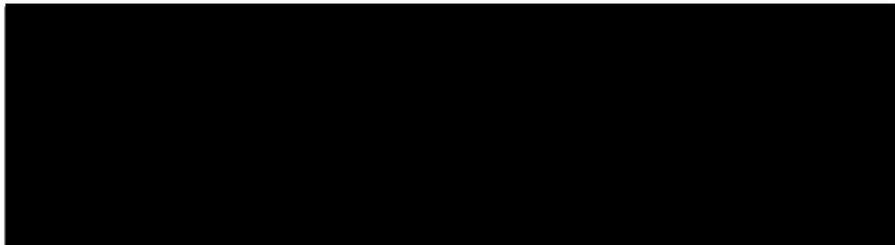
### **Report on the year's activities**

2024 has seen a continuation of the economic downturn which has affected the poorest in society. There has been a greater need for food parcels than ever before.

We have supplied 295 food parcels during the year and 90 Christmas parcels.

The need for starter packs for new tenants has remained steady with 28 packs being gifted over the year.

This year we received a grant from A Chruach wind farm for a one year pilot of a foodshare hub, working in conjunction with Mid Argyll Youth Development Service and the Snowdrop Centre. The building is being refurbished and a part time co-ordinator has been employed.



## **Chair's Report to the Trustees of Moving on - Mid Argyll SC041901**

### **Overview**

2024 was a year when the cost-of-living crisis made life extremely difficult for many people and the demand for support from Moving On Mid Argyll was greater than ever. We continued to work with our partners to provide food parcels and starter packs from our premises at An Cala in Lochgilphead, while preparing the ground for a new Mid Argyll Food Share Hub. We are immensely grateful to everyone who donated food during the year, through collection boxes in the Co=Op, local churches, Tayvallich and Ardfern Stores. Thanks to your generosity, our expenditure on food above that donated has been well within budget.

### **The New Hub**

Much of 2024 has been taken up with work to set up the Food Share Hub in partnership with Mid Argyll Youth Development Services (MAYDS) and the Snowdrop Centre. All three organisations currently provide emergency food in one way or another and it was agreed that working together would be both more efficient and effective in reaching more people in need. We were successful in securing core funding from the Nadara A'Chruach wind farm which enabled us to set up a one-year pilot in premises provided rent free by MAYDS. Funding has also been provided from Argyll and Bute Council, the Argyll Health and Wellbeing Network, Argyll Community Housing Association (ACHA), Arnold Clark and Hendrix Genetics and we are most grateful to all of them for their support. Local traders such as the Co-Op, Jewson's and Travis Perkins have also provided invaluable donations in kind.

The Nadara A'Chruach funding also allowed us to recruit a part time co-ordinator who started work in August and through the recruitment process we found a new volunteer who has since become a much-valued member of the MOMA team.

Renovation of the building was carried out at cost price by MacLeods, who also donated the window and door. The job proved more difficult than predicted and was a frustrating experience with many delays caused by a leaking roof. This was finally fixed in December, and we could start the process of drying out the building in preparation for internal decoration and fitting out. The Environmental Health team at A&BC was most helpful in providing guidance to ensure compliance to the required standards.

### **Christmas Appeal**

The success of our 2023 '12 Days of Christmas' appeal encouraged us to repeat it in 2024 and it was even more successful, helped by a publicity campaign supported by the Argyllshire Advertiser. The generous folk of Mid Argyll filled over 150 bags and thanks are due to the Community Shop who gathered them in for us. Specific collection points in Ardfern Stores, the Argyll Pharmacy, Bee Sweet and Marmalade Deli were also well supported and two of the local schools held fundraising events. The Salty Dog café produced vouchers for a preprepared Christmas Lunch which could be bought and donated, and these were included in appropriate parcels. As a result, we could provide very generous gift parcels to 90 households which we hoped helped to make their Christmas a little better. Our volunteers worked hard, ably assisted by a team of S6 students from the High School to prepare these parcels and distribute them to the appropriate agencies. Huge thanks are due to everyone who was involved in a tremendous community effort.

### **Poverty Alliance**

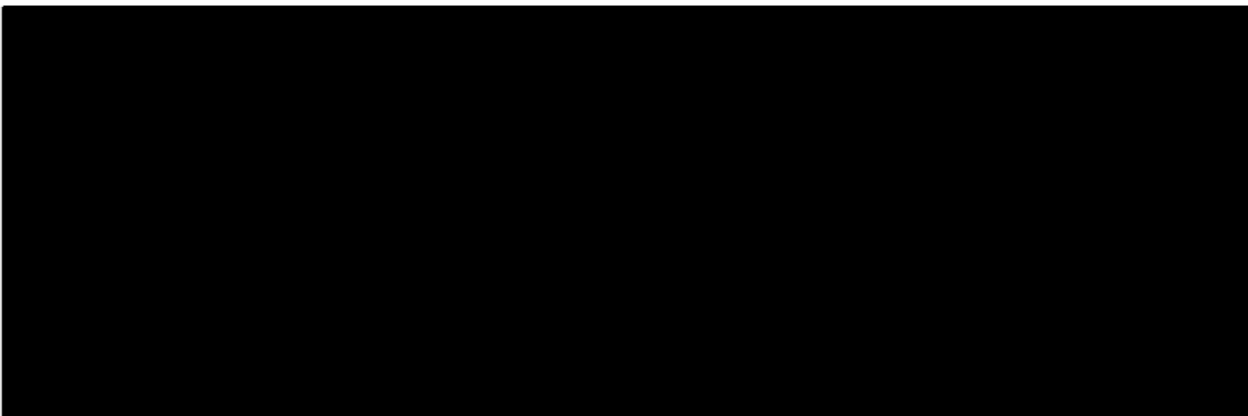
Marian Pallister has continued to liaise with Poverty Alliance, and it has been agreed that once the new premises are opened and volunteers are able to identify difficulties, representatives from different areas of PA will be on hand to support. This applies particularly to mental health. Encountering those experiencing mental ill health may need specific approaches and access to helpful information to refer those people on. Some volunteers may also find that their own mental health is affected by face-to-face encounters with those in crisis.

### **Trustees**

[REDACTED] stepped down as Chair of the Trustees at the last AGM in October but remains on the Board and very active as Moving On Mid Argyll's representative on the Poverty Alliance. [REDACTED] took over as Chair.
