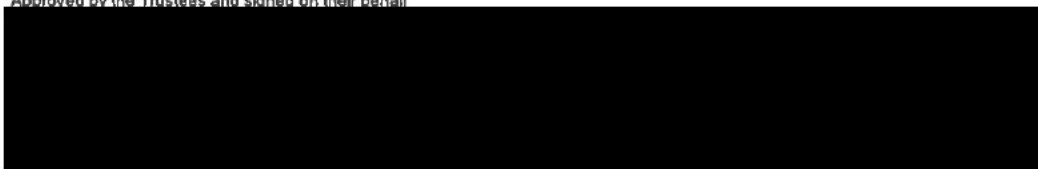


### Other optional information

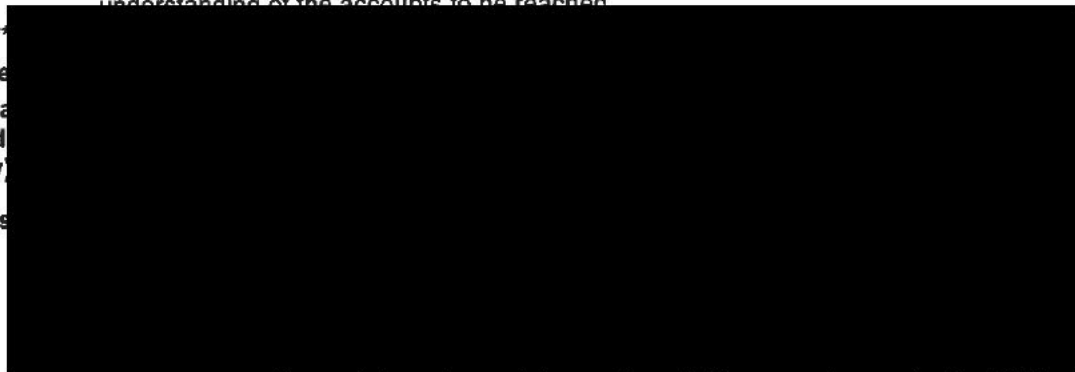
