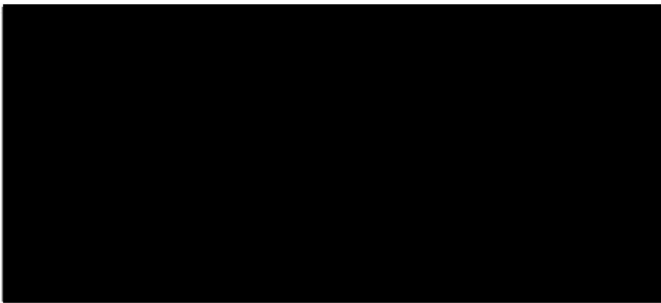

- the provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are intended.

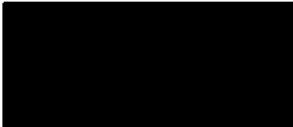

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2024

Whilst it has been slow, there has been a steady increase in the use of the Hall as more and more people are becoming aware of its existence and its attractiveness for a wide variety of activities.

Art Classes have continued to great acclaim, with waiting lists on occasions. As far as the Hall is concerned these have raised over £1200 during the year.

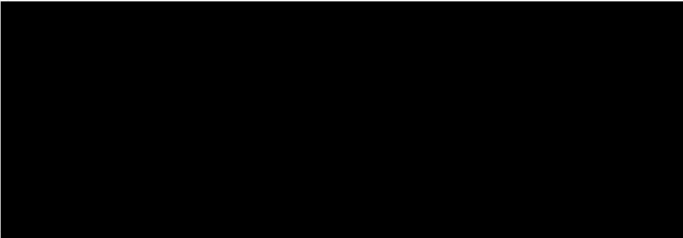
The Music Festival took place in June, preceded as usual by the Ruthven Young Musician Competition which highlighted the considerable talents of six young musicians from Angus and Perth & Kinross. The Concerts brought us another £1200.

We all enjoyed our regular collaboration with the Isla Parishes Church in December with a Carols & Canapes service, with mulled wine to help us along.

Elsewhere in our diary there was a Wedding and several Private Parties, and these bookings are becoming increasingly popular.

On the expenditure side there are the inevitably increased costs of Insurance £2500, Electricity £1400 and Maintenance £1600. We carried out some improvements to the building and installed a new hot water system in the kitchen.

We are still benefitting from the help of a friendly Charitable Trust but dependence on grants should hopefully decline in future and bookings for next year are on the up. We are looking forward to 2025 with some optimism.

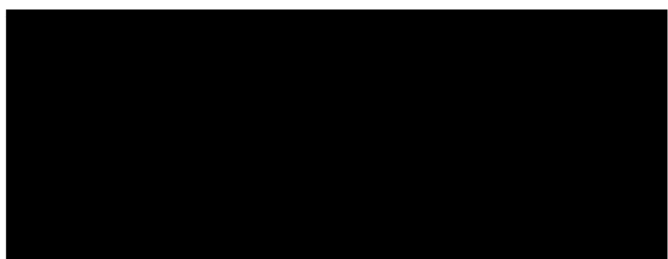

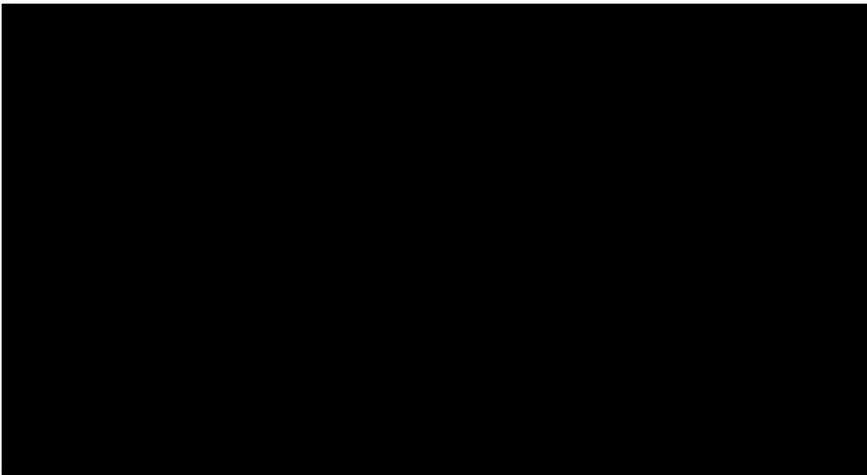
