Type of governing document

The White Feather is governed by its constitution which established the objects and powers of the charity.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

A person will not be eligible for election or appointment to the Board unless they are a member of the White Feather.

A person will not be eligible for election or appointment to the Board if they are:

- Disqualified from being a charity trustee under the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005; or
- An employee of the White Feather.

At each Annual General Meeting, the members may elect any member to be a charity trustee.

The Board may at any time appoint any member to be a charity trustee. At each Annual general Meeting, all of the charity trustees must retire from office but may then be re-elected.

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The White Feather was established for the purposes of the saving of lives, the advancement of health and the relief of those in need by reason of age, ill health, disability and other disadvantage. It aims to assist people in Scotland by providing supplies and equipment to support and care for all in need.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Since the charity was founded we have been successful in making people and businesses aware of what we are trying to achieve, by directly and immediately helping the people who need aid the most, as opposed to donating money to be included in a main charity 'pot' which will eventually be diluted before trickling down to help the people.

We ensure everyone knows that whatever money we raise is utilised to purchase items to assist the charity or cause of our choosing. We select suitable causes and ask the charities to advise why they should receive our help and then the committee meet and discuss which cause to support. We then ascertain what items are required and then we source the cost of said items and then set out to fundraise to enable purchase.

White Feather CA is transparent at all times and therefore our supporters always know what causes we are funding for.

Since October 2023 we have raised sufficient monies to purchase crucial items for the undemoted well deserving cause:

Revive MS Support - Donated £6,000.00

This payment was made to [REDACTED] the CEO of the **Revive MS Support** in order that they could purchase a communications system. There are many sufferers who are unable to leave their home, let alone travel to Glasgow and Revive wish to reach out and offer their services to all those affected in Scotland. This will be possible by having in place a communications social network whereby group meetings via Teams/Zoom can be arranged, one to one counselling, exercise classes and social events such as quiz nights etc. We are delighted to have fulfilled our pledge, and a communication system has been purchased.


