Constitution

The charity is governed by its constitution which was adopted in 2012. The Band was granted charitable status by OSCR in July 2012.

Appointment of Trustees

The committee, which meets approximately every six weeks are the charity's trustees. Membership of the committee is also open to any interested member of the band. Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting which is normally held in June. Under the constitution, there must be a minimum of three and a maximum of 8 elected trustees.

Management

The trustees are responsible for the strategic direction and governance of the Band. Day to Day running of the band is carried out by the band manager and treasurer and other trustees and members as required.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable Purposes

The organisation's purposes are:

- To encourage and promote the involvement of musicians within the community and surrounding areas to perform in a concert band.
- To enable musicians of all ages and skill levels to come together and make music for the enjoyment of themselves and others, and to provide a welcoming and friendly atmosphere for its members.
- To strive continuously to improve each individuals understanding and performance and in turn the overall standard of the band. Ultimately striving to become a competitive band.
- To increase public awareness of the band and its value in the local community.
- To carry out the above functions without purpose of gain for the members of the organisation. Any profits or other direct or indirect benefits accruing to the organisation shall be used in promoting its objectives.

Activities

Our activities consist of weekly, two-hour band rehearsals that take place in Garnock Community Campus on Sunday afternoons. These rehearsals allow the band to prepare for a number of concerts and competitions which the band participates in during the course of the year.

Achievements and Performance

The band currently has 35 members. Over the course of the year the band took part in four community events, including a Christmas Carol Concert at Beith Parish Church and our Annual Concert at St Margaret's Church in Dalry. We also took part in 3 competitions, achieving a platinum award at the National Concert Band Festival and gold plus awards at both Scottish Concert Band Festivals.

Financial Review

Our main source of funding is the fee charged to members. Adult membership is £100 (2024 - £80), Concession is £80 (2024- £60) and school children are free.

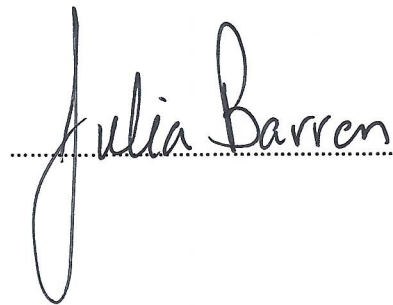
Receipts for the year were £4,215.46 (2024 - £4,493.52). Payments for the year were £4,724.48 (2024 - £9,809.35), resulting in a deficit of £509.02 (2024 - £5,315.83).

An unrestricted balance of £5,012.71 (2024 - £5,521.73) was available on the 31st July 2025.

Plans for Future Periods

The trustees intend to continue to operate the band in a similar way to previous financial years. Active efforts are being made to recruit additional members which may result in increased membership fees being received.

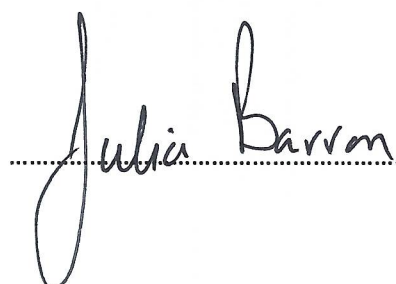

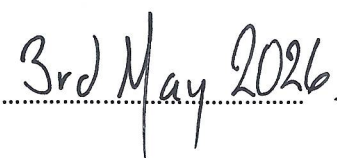

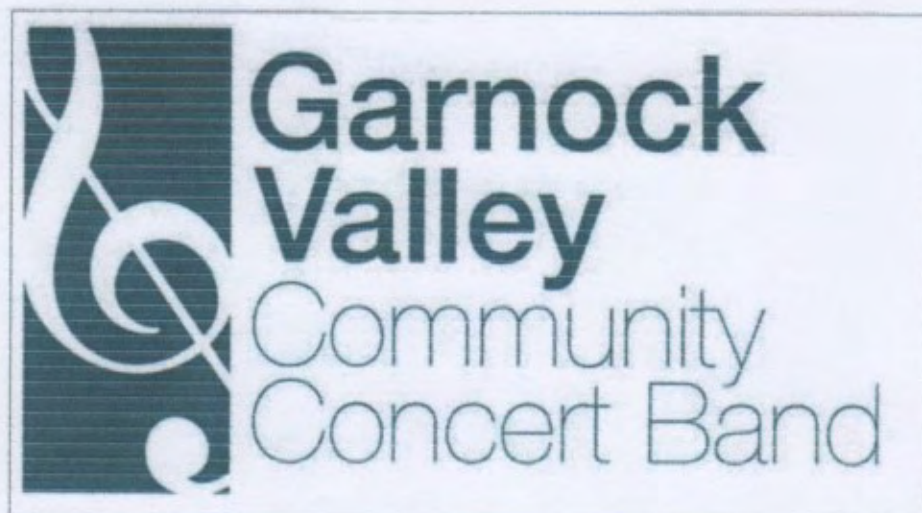
Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.

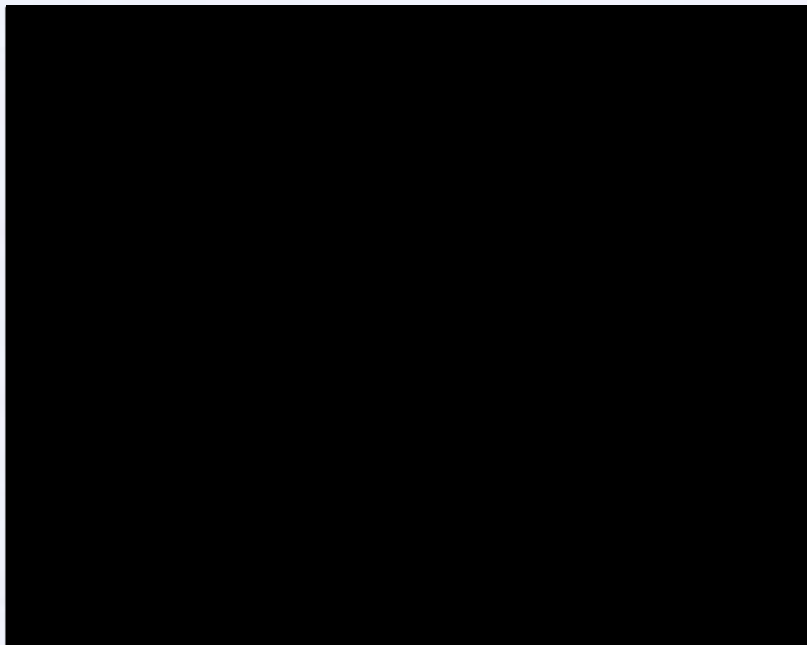

Our activities consist of weekly, two-hour band rehearsals that take place in Garnock Community Campus on Sunday afternoons. These rehearsals allow the band to prepare for a number of concerts and competitions which the band participates in during the course of the year.

Achievements and Performance

The band currently has a membership of 35 people. Throughout the year the band have taken part in several events and two competitions. Our Summer Concert took place at St Margaret's Church in Dalry. A donation was made to the church from the proceeds. We competed in the National Concert Band Festival in November 2023 and the Scottish Concert Band Festival Regional Competition in March 2024, achieving a platinum medal. We held a Christmas Carolling event at Dunlop Fayre and a fundraising event in association with Braehead shopping centre.

Financial Review

Our main source of funding is the fee charged to members. Adult membership is £80, Concession is £60 and school children are free.

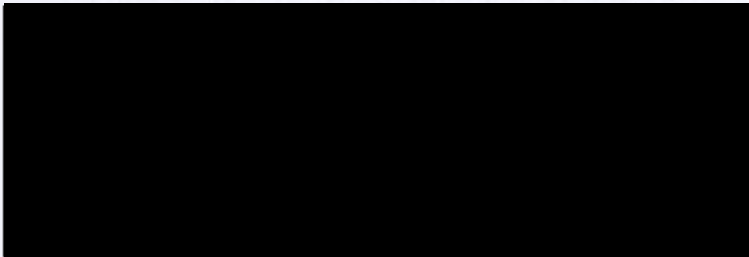
Receipts for the year were £4,493.52 (£12,260.30). Payments for the year were £9,809.35 (£2,923.26), resulting in a deficit of -£5,315.83 (surplus £9,337.04).

An unrestricted balance of £5,521.73 (£10,837.56) was available on the 31st July 2024.

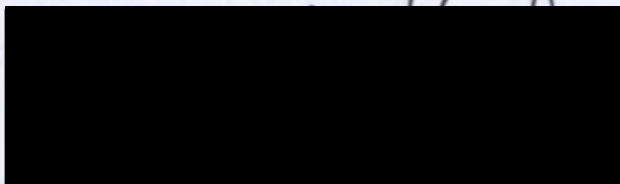
