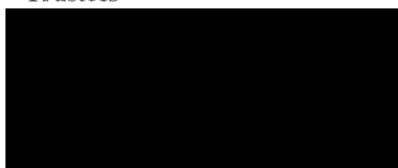

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its constitution and is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the terms of the Constitution. Application for trusteeship must be made in writing to the Board and each application will be considered at a subsequent Board meeting. The minimum number of Trustees is three and the maximum is seven. At each AGM all of the Trustees must retire but then may be re-elected.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objectives of the Trust are the advancement of religion; the prevention or relief from poverty; the relief of those in need by reason of age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage; and the provision or organisation of recreational facilities with the object of improving the conditions of life of the persons for whom the facilities or activities are intended.

Charitable activities

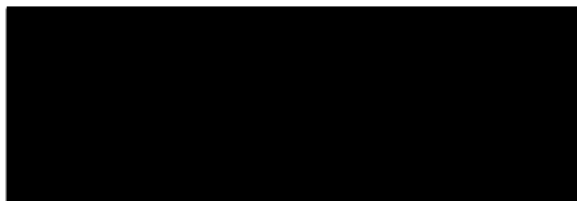

The church building also served as a centre for fellowship and outreach, hosting seasonal celebrations such as Easter and Christmas, as well as community events including summer barbecues. **Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 January 2025 set out on pages four to six.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements have been prepared on the Receipts & Payments basis in accordance with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006(as amended).

TAXATION

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

NATURE & PURPOSE OF FUNDS

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
