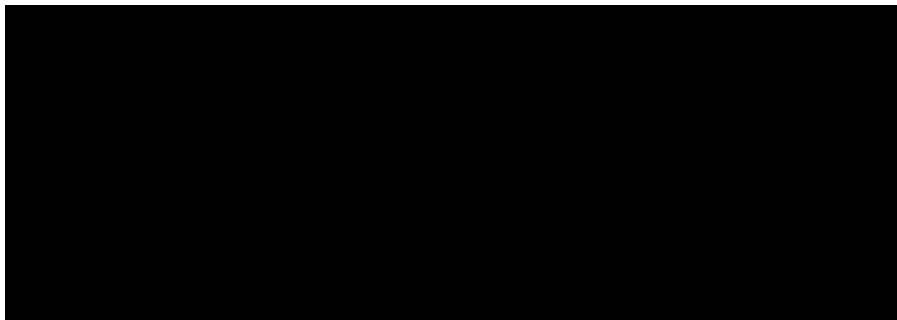

The trustees did not receive any remuneration or expenses during the year.

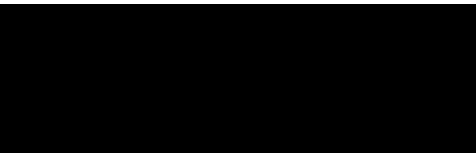
