APPENDIX 1

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

The Charity carry out their main activities in normal at full scale. They managed to raise funds of £90419. No grants were available from the Council.

Work is being continued on the self-build of the New Temple which is based near the existing Temple. An additional £40,000 was spent in the internal works.

The main framework of the building is complete, with windows and doors installed. The basic electric wiring and plastering has been done. The internal paintwork is being carried out. The building has 3 floors, with 2 prayer halls, 1 dining hall, Kitchen toilets, offices and other additional rooms. All the work is done on a voluntary basis and will continue as and when the resources are available.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Charity will continue:

- its objectives of using the reserves to promote the Sikh religion and culture. It will be used to create new premises for worship and promoting its objectives.
- continue to receive donations and grants to build up the reserves and rebuild its functions of worship and promoting its objectives.

Details of any deficit

The result for the year shows a surplus of receipts over payments of £17989 (2023: deficit of £6397.00). Closing funds of £57378.00 are considered by the Trustees to be unrestricted. There is no formal reserves policy, but significant funds are invested in the new Temple project

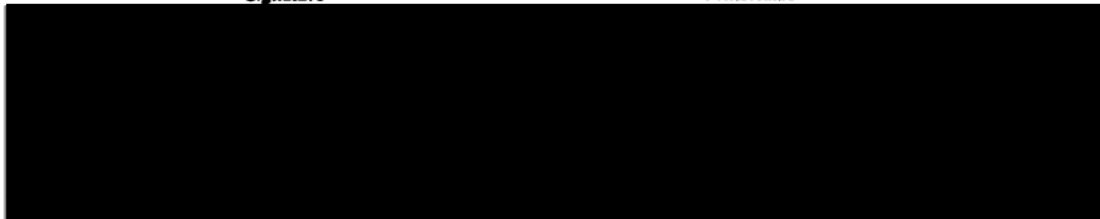
