c. acting in an advisory, consultative or representative capacity to members of the public at large through:  
1. the provision of lectures, demonstrations and workshops.  
2. The operation of helplines.  
3. The provision of information via a comprehensive web site.

## Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document

The Scottish Hypnotherapy Foundation (SHF) was set up by John D Lawrence, and was recognised as a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation with effect from 17<sup>th</sup> June 2013. The SHF is administered in accordance with the Constitution. It has a twin-tier structure.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

The minimum number of Trustees is four, and the maximum is ten. Trustees are appointed by the Board from Professional Members, who are registered with the Complementary and Natural Healthcare Council (CNHC). However, there may be a maximum of three Co-opted Trustees, who need not be members of the SHF. They are co-opted by the Board where they consider the person has the knowledge, skills or experience that would assist in the performance of their duties. Trustees are elected/re-elected each year at the AGM.

## Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

The purposes of the charity are: (a) the relief of those in need through the provision of free or assisted hypnotherapy sessions to those members of society who would benefit from Professional Hypnotherapy but would otherwise be prevented from receiving any services for financial reasons; (b) the advancement of physical, mental and emotional health in conjunction with other health care professionals through the provision of clinical hypnotherapy; (c) the advancement of education, training and research into the development and promotion of excellence in regulated practice in order to enhance public confidence and accessibility to hypnotherapy services; (d) the provision of information via a web site.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

During the year the charity received total income of £355 from membership subscriptions and other donations. The charity incurred total expenses of £1607, leaving a deficit for the year of £1252.

## Achievements and performance

### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

This year our Professional Members have been able to offer subsidised therapy and pro bono therapy although opportunities have been restricted by the COVID pandemic. Individuals for whom this has been open to include:

- Senior Citizens
- Unemployed/disabled
- Low income
- Asylum seekers/refugees
- Under 16s/Students
- NHS employees
- Long term sick/incapacity benefit
- Recovering addicts
- Carers
- Fraud victims

To increase this activity the Foundation had introduced a Therapist Reimbursement Scheme, to enable members to offer these services more widely. This has had to be temporarily suspended due to restricted income opportunities during the COVID pandemic.

Continuous Professional Development Opportunities were also limited due to suspension of the annual SHF Conference. A programme of short online workshops is proposed which includes:

- IBS
- Resilience
- Advanced Hypnotherapeutic Procedures and Methods
- PTSD
- Stress Management.

Two Board Members are now enrolled in training to allow the roll out of the PVG Registration Scheme with Disclosure Scotland.

## Financial review

### Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

At 30<sup>th</sup> June 2021 the sum of £2,909 was held in our bank account. These funds are distributed as follows:

1. Unrestricted funds total £2,808.
2. The restricted funds held in our account contains £101, to be used specifically for subsidising therapy to those in need in accordance with our objectives.

### Details of any deficit

The charity incurred a deficit of £1252 mainly because the COVID pandemic reduced the charity's ability to generate funds from training and an annual conference.


