## Structure, governance and management

### Type of governing document

The charity is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution.

### Trustee recruitment and appointment

The structure of the organisation consists of the charity trustees who are also the organisation's only members and comprise the organisation's Board. The charity must have a minimum of three trustees. An annual general meeting is held in each calendar year, reporting on the immediately preceding financial year of the organisation.

The trustees of the organisation have been recruited due to their experience and expertise in the areas of Christian outreach and working with young women in Scotland. The trustees come from a variety of church backgrounds and traditions.

## Objectives and activities

### Charitable purposes

The objectives of the charity are the advancement of religion by supporting teenage girls to grow in confidence and self-acceptance, developing positive self-esteem; by pastorally supporting young girls through discipleship and mentoring, linking young girls into youth groups and churches across Scotland; and by breaking down social barriers between young people across Scotland.

### Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

Creation and maintenance of an entirely digital platform including Instagram, podcasts, YouTube videos and blog as well as the filming and editing of a youth work video course called "Identity Sessions".

Charis has been reviewing and updating our policies and procedures to ensure that Diamonds is well-placed to flourish in the years ahead. 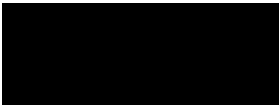

**Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**

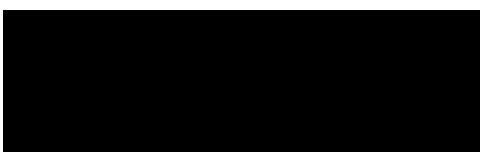
